contraction of progress toward integration. The third alternative would be to hasten the process of acceptance of integration in compliance with the main Supreme Court decision. This would require the maximum triumph for the American way of life, and the only eventual solution. The second alternative, of gradual integration, in principle, would at least establish the principle of integration and permit its practice to be speeded as the years pass. The one course which would free the whole situation into a permanent mold not likely to change would be the wide spread growth of the device of private white schools, which no court decision could touch or regulate and that would be long dead wherever it happens.

**Progress At Geneva**  
 In its own unguarded way, the Geneva conference at Geneva on banning nuclear tests is continuing to make spectacular progress. The conference is continuing to give hope that, where there is sincere agreement in principle on a subject, agreement is possible.

**LWV to Discuss Court Reform on Radio Program**  
 Court reform will be the topic for the monthly radio program, "The LWV Speaks," presented by the Manchester League of Women Voters in cooperation with WHPN, Tuesday at 11:45 a. m. and 6:30 p. m.

**These decisions will not of themselves, either in Virginia or in any other state where the same democratic principles of law may be maintained, produce the opening of integrated schools, or end the practice of segregation. But they do reduce the alternatives open, and actually would seem to leave only one legal alternative which would avoid integration entirely.**

**But again, this brought the negotiators up against the sticking point, to the question of how the international control posts to be set up in each country might be financed. It is to be noted that the Russians fear that foreign observers on their soil would be used as spies, and as a result, the West's proposal that these staffs be truly international, with non-nationals of a country in which the post is situated, responsible for its operation.**

**However, the talks thus far have been so successful that the view of the concessions made by each side, that there is considerable ground for optimism. The Supreme Court decision and agreement will be reached on this point.**

**If a test ban treaty should emerge from the talks, there may be some who will write it off as meaningless, since each side was ready to quit testing anyway. This is true, to an extent. But the fact remains that neither side, no matter how many nuclear weapons it possessed, would stop making and testing new ones if it believed the other side was continuing its production.**

**Furthermore, while a test ban treaty would not automatically guarantee similar agreements on other disarmament matters, it would improve immeasurably the climate for talks on means of preventing surprise attack or misadventure, disarmament matters. As a result, there seems to be a meaningful brightness in the sparks being given off by the debate now going on in Geneva.**
