Your Income Tax Primer

(By RICHARD A. HULLS, Writer for NKA Service) A somewhat complicated but very useful provision in the tax law permits a taxpayer, under certain conditions, to postpone paying tax on the gain from the sale of his residence.

The law was changed in 1954. Now, even though you sell your principal residence at a gain, the gain is not taxed if you buy a new residence within a period beginning one year before the date of sale and ending one year thereafter.

The one-year or 18-month period referred to above is suspended while taxpayer serves on extended active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States for more than four years after the date of his departure.

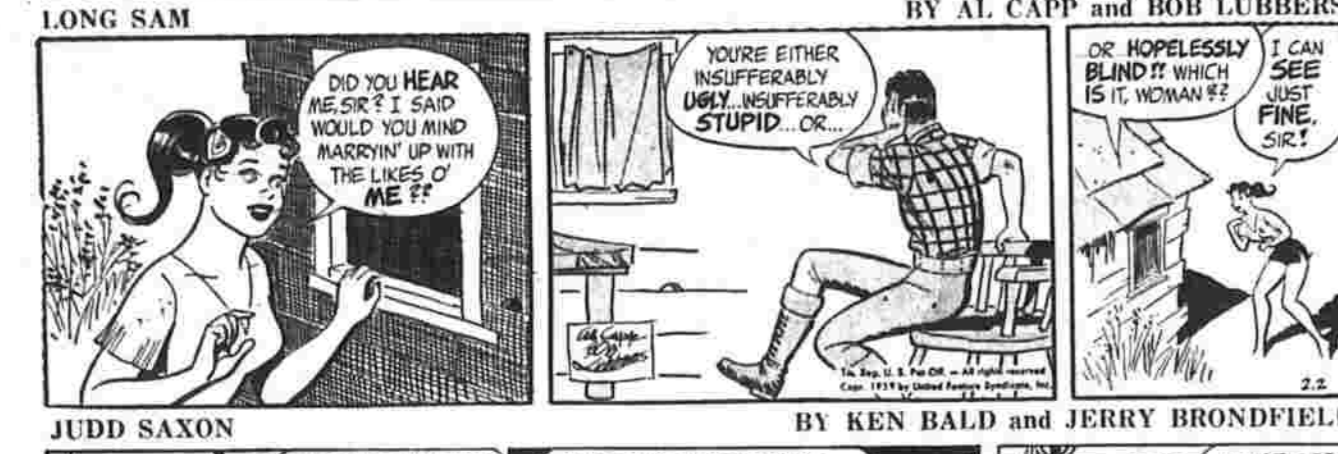

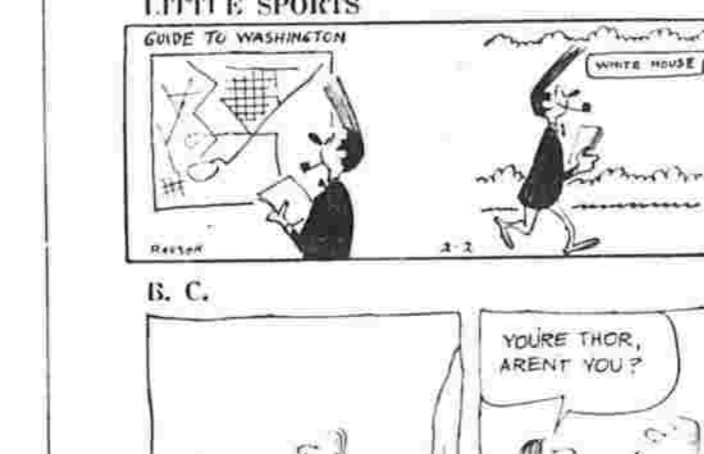

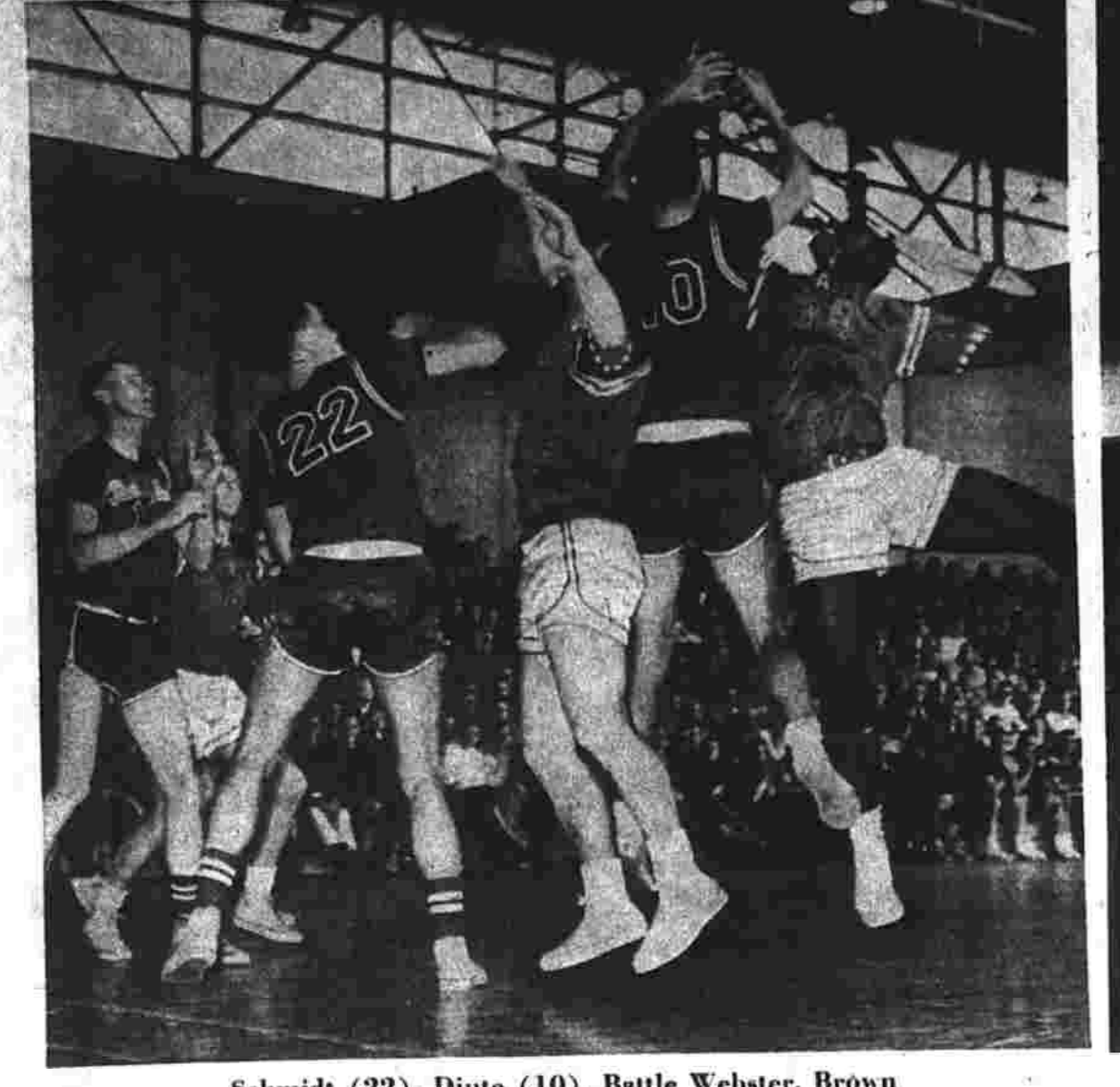
