Your Income Tax Primer

Try This Tax Quiz

1. I contributed \$5 to the political party of my choice last year. Is this contribution deductible?

2. I paid \$15 Federal excise tax on the fur coat which I gave my wife for Christmas. Is this tax deductible?

3. Can I deduct the social security tax I paid for my maid?

The answer to each of the above questions is "No."

Primer describe the deductible items.

Contributions. You can claim as a deduction contributions to recognized non-profit religious, charitable, educational and scientific organizations; to societies for the prevention of cruelty to children or animals; to governmental organizations for exclusively public purposes. You cannot deduct dues paid to a social organization even though they have charitable or welfare subsidiaries to which gifts are deductible. You cannot deduct gifts to individuals no matter how needy they may be. Contributions to political parties or to any organization which uses the money to influence legislation are not deductible. The value of the property, not its cost, is the measure of the contribution for purposes of the deduction. For example, if you donate stock worth \$200 but which cost you \$100, your charitable deduction is \$200. Furthermore, you are not taxed on its increase in value, which would be if you sold the stock.

The value of services rendered to charitable organizations is not deductible as a contribution. Out-of-pocket unreimbursed expenses such as transportation, travel, uniforms, telephone, equipment, etc. incurred in rendering services to such organizations are deductible as contributions.

During the past year, the Revenue Service ruled that unreimbursed expenses of a lay church member are deductible.

Many of the taxes you paid in 1958 can be deducted on Form 1040, if you choose to itemize your deductions. To be deductible, the tax must be imposed on you personally or on your spouse, child or other person's property.

Page 9 of the official instructions gives a list of federal taxes which you can deduct. The most important of which are state income taxes, property taxes, and local gasoline and retail sales taxes.

Most taxpayers do not have receipts or do not keep a record of small payments for deductions like gasoline tax and sales tax. The gasoline tax may be estimated by dividing the total number of miles driven in 1958 by the average number of miles your car goes on a gallon of gas. Then multiply this by the state and local tax per gallon. Do not include the federal gasoline tax. It is not deductible. The following plan will give you a reasonable estimate of your sales tax on rent, insurance or other charges. First, add up what you spent or set aside in 1958 for items on which there is no sales tax, and subtract such amount from your total income. To the remainder, add anything you bought, out of savings or by borrowing that would be subject to sales tax. Multiply the sum of these by your sales tax rate if you live in a locality where food is subject to sales tax, adding what you spent on food to the amount subject to sales before multiplying by the sales tax rate.

The City Council last night went over the auditor's recommendations in great detail at the instigation of Mayor Herman G. Olson.
