Rockville-Vernon C of C Issuing Cards To Identify Salesmen

Blue control cards to identify collectors and door-to-door salesmen as having right with the Rockville Area Chamber of Commerce are now being issued.

George R. Bennett, executive secretary, said today a number of salesmen of well-known organizations have already received blue cards at the Chamber after presenting their credentials.

The Chamber is not trying to restrict or regulate legitimate business, Bennett said, but is attempting to curb misrepresentation.

In the past few weeks the Chamber has received a "flood of complaints" from residents about door-to-door operations ranging "all the way from the over-enthusiastic salesman to the front door."

The Chamber executive issued a general warning to residents to ask to see the Chamber blue card when a salesman calls at the door.

1. Don't sign anything until you are sure you understand it.

2. Don't sign anything until you know what you are dealing with.

3. Don't let anyone force his way into your house.

No salesman has the right to enter a residence uninvited and can be prosecuted for trespassing if he does so, Bennett said. He pointed out, however, that a person who signs an appointment card has invited the salesman into his home, and would have difficulty prosecuting on a trespassing charge.

Rec Department Asking \$102,838

Justice Warren Resigns from American Bar

Chicago, Feb. 21 (AP)—The board of governors of the American Bar Association today accepted the resignation of Chief Justice Earl Warren from the group.

Warren, 57, the 14th Chief Justice of the United States, had been a member of the A.B.A. for 28 years.

In a brief statement, Ross L. Malone of Rowell, N.M. association president, said: "The resignation of Chief Justice Earl Warren as a member of the American Bar Assn. was accepted today by the board of governors of the association."

The termination of membership was in no way related to dues. The Chief Justice has assured me that he will cooperate with the association as far as some of the points."

Malone did not elaborate on the statement.

The reference to dues in the A.B.A. statement apparently was in answer to earlier reports that the A.B.A. had dropped Warren from its roster for non-payment of dues.

In Washington, an aide to Warren had no immediate comment from the Chief Justice on the group's action.

Resigned in 1957

Although Warren said he resigned from the bar group in 1957, an A.B.A. spokesman said a letter of resignation was not received from the Chief Justice.

In the summer of 1957 the American Bar meeting in London approved a report sharply criticizing the Supreme Court decision and called for new legislation to tighten loopholes in the law dealing with the Chief Justice.

The report was drafted by Special Committee on Communist Tactics, Strategy and Objectives and adopted by the House of Delegates, legislative arm of the bar association, without a dissent.

The Chief Justice attended the London convention and was reported by other delegates as being in favor of the report, which was endorsed without any outcries by the 10,000 delegates.

'Wilde' Night By Thespians

By JEAN DINSMORE The Manchester Center Thespians' production of Oscar Wilde's "The Importance of Being Earnest" opened a 2-night run last evening at the Bowers School. A near capacity audience turned out, despite the cold, and was well rewarded for the effort.

Although the play is billed as "a trivial comedy for serious people" the production was far from trivial. No less than three separate acts excelled in their own way. The sets were constructed by the ambitious Thespians, a major accomplishment in itself. Departing from the usual box set, Director-Set Designer Fred T. Blah 3rd made effective use of a combination of drapes and flats to achieve an uncluttered look, refreshing but not distracting. The costumes, arranged by Jean Borforth, Doris Belding and Mary Birch, were detailed and authentic, and the lighting, done by veteran Burt Moore, accentuated the use of color most effectively. The production crew, too often unnamed, well deserved the applause for the second act garden scene.

Director Blah guided the cast through a smooth and for the main, cohesive performance. A few uncertain moments marred the first act but veteran thespian Jim Pierce and Henry Guertin recovered their pronunciation to carry through for the remaining acts. Excellent portrayals of English "dandies" of the turn of the century. The charming "Cecily Cardew, played by newcomer Alden Savva, was sweet but not sticky, and Ruth Tucker as "Lady Bracknell" was delightfully haughty and overbearing in her portrayal of the managing aunt and mother.

Also seen were Betty Lundberg, Florence Scheldge, Henry Murphy, Burton Hicock and Bill Luetigens. Adequate performances were turned in by all to complete an enjoyable evening's entertainment and as proof of its appreciation the audience provided three rousing curtain calls, sweet music indeed to amateur theater workers.

Well worth seeing, "The Importance of Being Earnest" will be staged again tonight, with curtain time at 8:30. It is unfortunate that tonight's performance will be the last. Thespians, as well as other little theater groups in the area, deserve more support for their near-professional productions.
