You Should Know...

Ronald Joseph Daigle

You have already met Charles R. Grant and Donald Cowie, building directors at the East Side Recreation Center and Community Y, respectively.

Now meet Ronald Joseph Daigle, building director at the West Side Recreation Center on Cedar St., the last of the triumvirate which watches over the Recreation Department's indoor activities during the winter season.

Daigle's job, like those of Grant and Cowie, is that of an overseer. He supervises the various recreation programs in the building, records athletic equipment needs and lends a helping hand to regular or part time staff members when it is needed.

Recreation activities are spread out fairly evenly over the three Rec buildings, but there are activities peculiar to each one. In Daigle's province fall the men's volleyball leagues and the Little Theater group.

Mr. and Mrs. Barton Moore, members of the Country Players, instruct the latter group on Tuesday evenings. Men's volleyball leagues play the first three nights of each week, and Daigle, keeping score perched high atop a court side step ladder, has become something of a fixture during the games.

Daigle has been with the Recreation Department six years. He is coaching in the Saturday morning junior basketball leagues in 1959 when he first took a job at the West Side Center. A staff helper for three years, he was made building director in 1956.

Somewhat modestly, Daigle gives most of the credit for supervision at the West Side Rec to his Zenna staff of Gene Johnson and Harold Simmons.

"They're terrific," he says, adding, "I don't want to brag, but we've got the best janitor (Charles Varney) here, too. Building's neat as a pin."

Those who know him say Daigle is an easy-going man. "He's great with youngsters," said one, "and he'll do anything for you."

Daigle, whose short, stocky figure and jovial, gap-toothed smile are practically trade marks, comments, "Encouraging participation in our Rec programs and seeing that youngsters enjoy themselves is the main thing."

Daigle was born in Putnam, July 21, 1914, and came to Manchester, N.H., actually, with his family in 1928. He graduated from Manchester High School in 1931 and from the Manchester Trade School from Cheney, Tech., where he studied to become an electrician, in 1936. He worked up an electrician at the Cheney Mills until 1952, then left to join

Pratt & Whitney Aircraft where he is now a master electrician. In athletics, Daigle has an eye-opening history. Scourge of athletic hockey rinks in the 30s, he was also adept at football half-back and end, baseball (second base), basketball and track. He explained the trade school hockey team in 1935 and 1936 and even tried for a position with Springfield professional team the following year.

He continued participation in post-school years and played the same sports with various semi-professional teams in Manchester. I remember once playing with a basketball team called the YMCA Big Five," Daigle said.

"Looking back, I think I must have been crazy, but I walked from B. claimed to the North End and back every night we had a game, and on some other nights, too."

Team Was Torney Daigle eventually hung up his skates, glove, sneakers and cleats and turned to coaching. For five straight years, 1952 through 1956, he produced championship teams in the Little Alumni and Intermediate Leagues in town, and coached an all-star group to the State Little League quarter-finals in 1952. In 1953 his First National Bankers won the State Alumni Tournament championship in West Hartford.

"I got involved with coaching more or less by chance," Daigle recalled. "It started at the Y where I was playing basketball. A team of youngsters needed an older advisor and I was it. Later, a fellow asked me to coach an Intermediate League team... well, there I was a coach."

Daigle coached his last team, the American Legion Juniors, in 1957. The team won 12 games and lost 4. Although successful as a coach, Daigle likes his present job better. He sees general recreation gives more youngsters a chance to exercise their own particular abilities. He likes to see a program which allows the greatest number to participate, and if a sudden opportunity to organize an extra activity presents itself, Daigle often takes it.

Last winter he promoted flooding the field behind the West Side Rec, turned on the flood lights, put a record player and microphone in the window and gave boys and girls about a week of night skating.

Daigle, who is married to the former Margaret Sullivan, a Manchester girl, is the father of a 19-year-old son, Robert, and a 17-year-old daughter, Denise. Robert, who co-captained last year's MHS soccer team, is now a student at St. Anselm's College in Manchester. N. H. Denise is a senior in high school. The family lives at 41 Battista Rd.

A parishioner of the St. James Church and a member of the Knights of Columbus, Daigle says he has no hobbies outside of the Rec.

"Most of my free time I spend at the West Side," he grinned. "Sure, it's got its headaches and heartaches, but it's worth it."
