Rockville State to Give City \$250,000 If Renewal Plans Work Out

The state will contribute up to \$250,000 toward Rockville's urban renewal project if the project is approved by the federal government and the city.

The sum is part of more than \$1,000,000 allocated by the State Housing Finance Commission for municipal redevelopment through "conventional" financing.

State Commissioner George Conkling says individual towns have to take necessary legal action before final approval is given to the project.

The Rockville Redevelopment Agency has applied to the federal government for \$2 million for the redevelopment project centered in the Market-Brooklyn St. area. The study area covers 35 acres on the south side of the business district.

The state's share in the federal-state aid program for redevelopment amounts to one sixth of the total cost. The city is expected to pay another one sixth while the federal government contributes two thirds of the total cost.

Comments Sought On Boating Bill

Coventry Representative Charles N. Harlow, a member of the General Law Committee, has requested comments from Coventry residents on a bill calling for the licensing and regulation of motorboats.

The bill, due to be voted on by the committee Monday, is similar to that introduced in the state legislature last year.

The bill would require all motorboats to be licensed and licensed at a fee of \$2.50 for each boat. Thirty-five cents of this fee would be paid to the state and the remainder to the town in which the boat is licensed.

The bill defines a motorboat as "any vessel propelled by machinery or motor."

The bill, however, whether or not such machinery is the principal source of propulsion, shall not include a vessel which has a valid marine document issued by the Bureau of Customs of the Department of the Treasury of the United States or any federal agency.

The bill would also require all motorboats to be licensed in all waters from sunset to sunrise to carry lights, as specified by the bill.

The bill also specifies that "every motorboat except those carrying passengers for hire shall carry for each person on board at least one life preserver, life belt, ring buoy or other device prescribed by the regulations of the board."

The board refers to the State Board of Fisheries and Game, which would, should the bill pass, be called the State Board of Boats, Fisheries and Game. A fire extinguisher would also be required as standard equipment in each boat.

The bill lists other requirements pertaining to the equipping of boats, carrying passengers for hire, boats owned by out-of-state persons, and boats used for racing, and for water skiing.

It also sets up penalties for violations and provisions for policing.

"Any police officer of the state or any person designated by the board may enforce this act and in the exercise of such authority may stop and board any vessel which may be subject to this act."

The bill also sets up a board of Fisheries and Game.

Queries Keep Library Busy During Week

Details of the execution of Louis XVI and an explanation of rituals of the druids were among the requests made of the staff at Mary Cheney Library last week during one of the busiest weeks the library has since it opened in 1957, according to Miss Anna French, head librarian.

The average daily circulation of books from Feb. 24 to March 2 was 991. Usual daily average is between 600 and 700 books.

The day of the White Elephant sale 1,079 books were circulated possibly because of the crowds all over Manchester. March 2 there were 1,049 books circulated. In addition to the books circulated at Mary Cheney Library there were about 350 circulated each day at the Whittier Library.

The children's and reference rooms were filled to overflowing all during the week, said Miss French.

The children asked questions like "How did the Egyptians make bread?" and "Do you have a dinosaur?" and "Where can I get a picture of Old Ingridis?"

Adults asked questions like the ones on the druids and the execution of Louis XVI.

Among their other requests were for information on the most important U.S. and world events since 1900, the copyright status of newspapers, the skeleton of the cat, how New England high schools and colleges are accredited, how to find a picture of America's Indians playing Lacrosse, how to introduce a new employee into a large business, and what are the known characteristics of all U.S. rocks.

The most significant fact about the week's circulation, according to Miss French, is that the circulation exceeded fiction circulation every day.

"And there was hardly a disciplinary problem among the children," she concluded. "They were here to work."

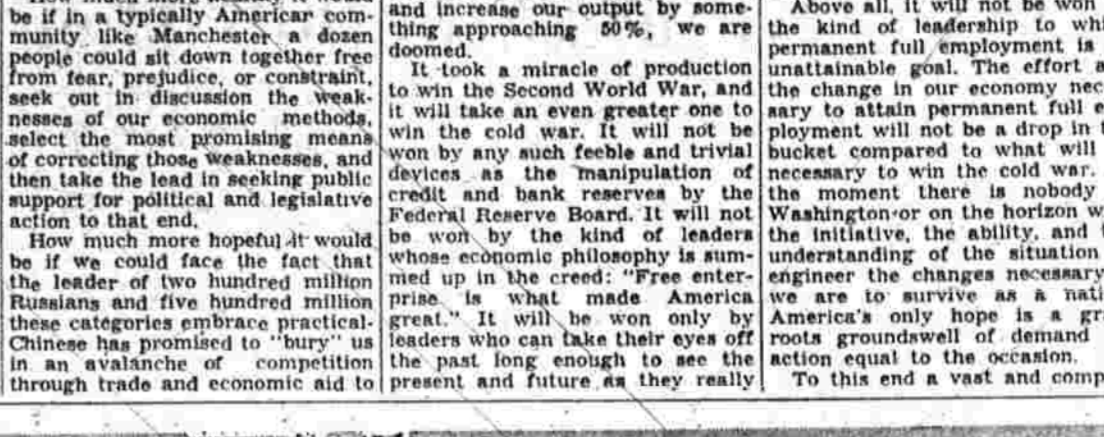

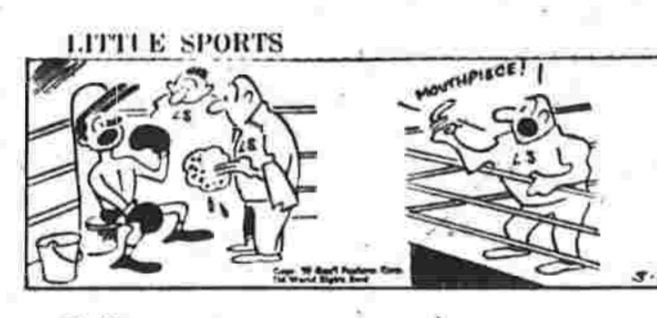

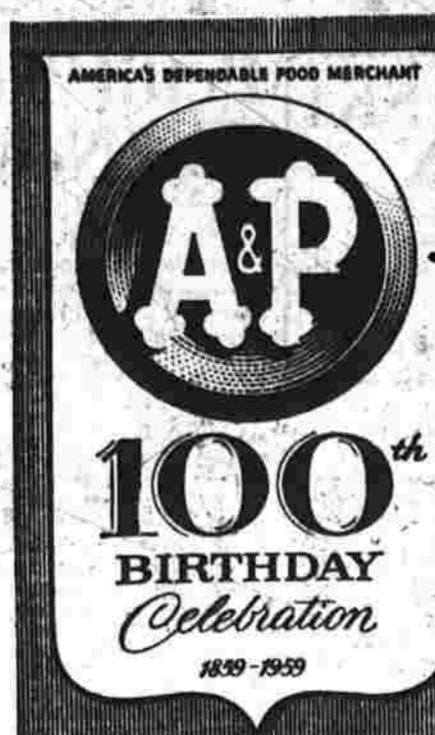
