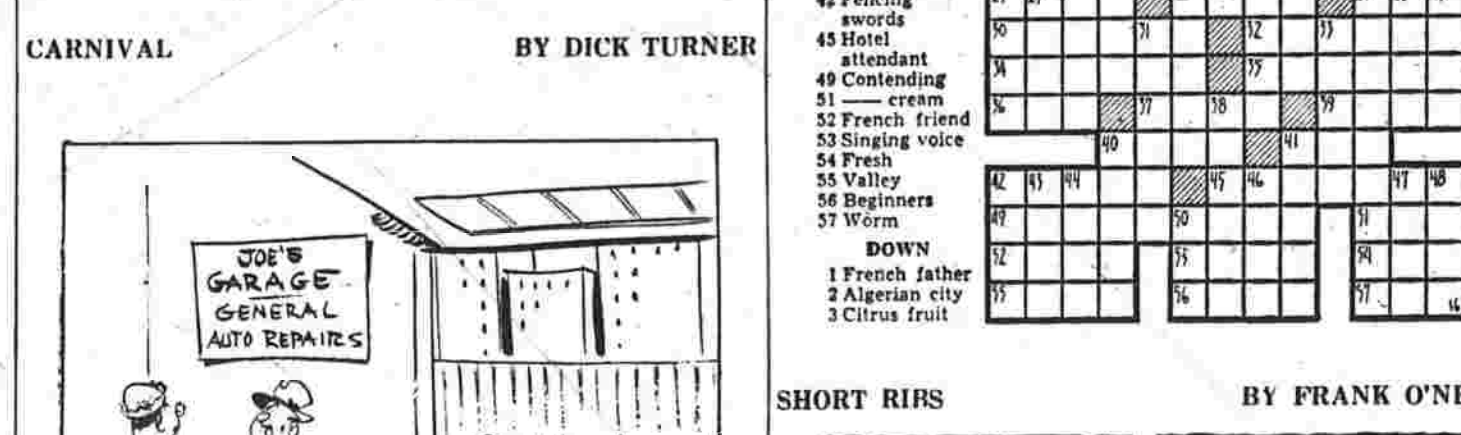

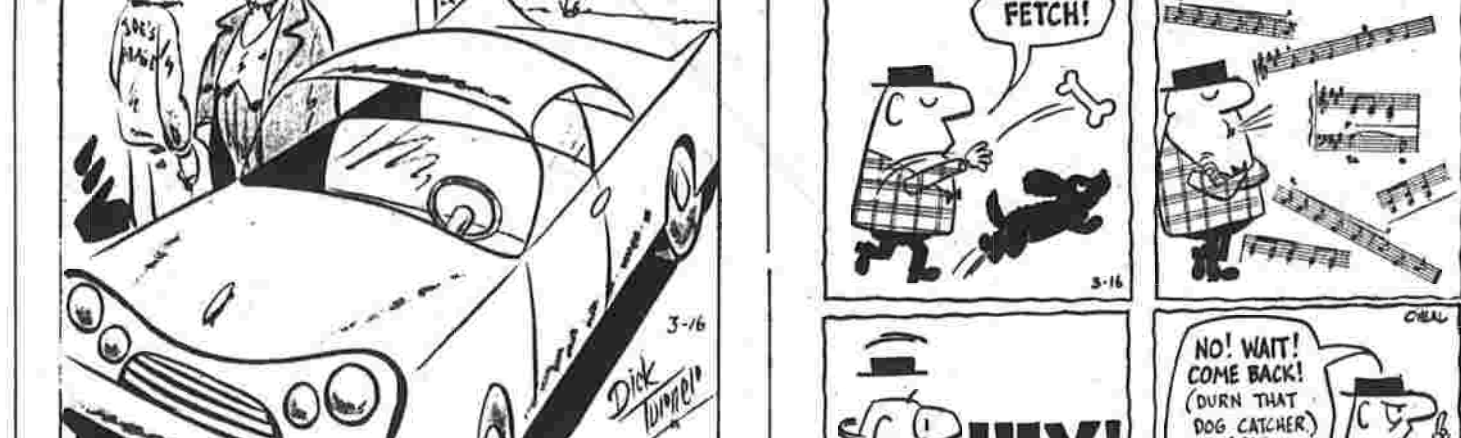

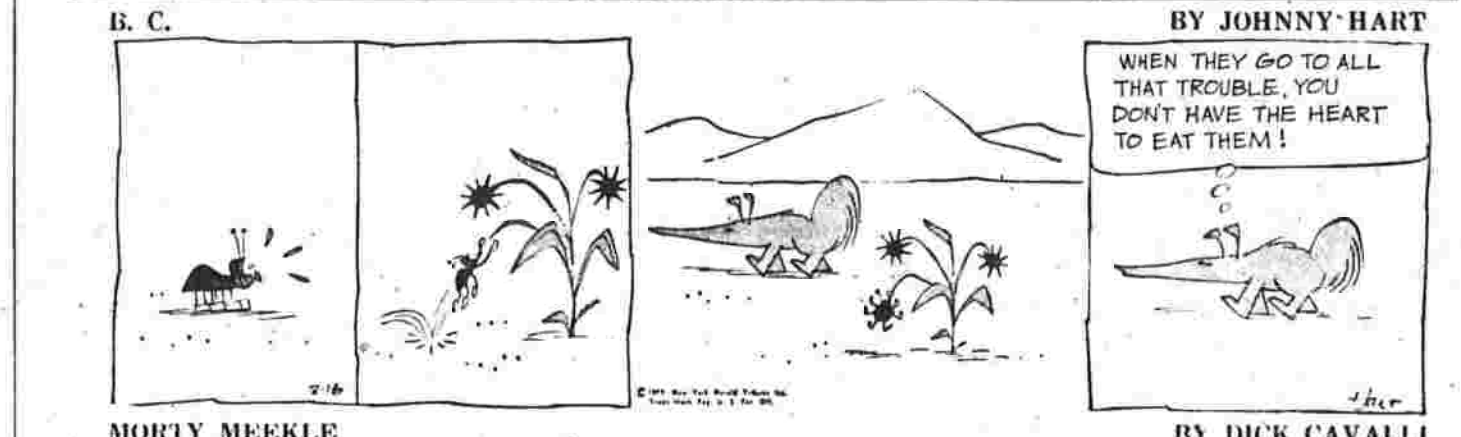

### North End Water Safe, All Samples Indicate

The State Health Department today reported that all ten samples taken from the water of the Manchester Water Company because of a heavy sediment content last week have proved safe for drinking purposes.

Warren L. Scott, chief of the sanitary engineering division, said three samples taken Monday, three Wednesday, and three Thursday turned out to be "satisfactory from the bacteriological standpoint" at laboratory tests.

He said this indicates the system is in "pretty good shape" and "thoroughly disinfected."

Telephone reports to his department, he said, indicate the water is losing the heavy turbidity and intense coloring it had after a rainstorm washed sediment into the firm's supply March 6. The Department took samples at normal precautionary measures, and now will let up in the intensity of its examination, Scott said.

The subject of the Water Company will come up at a Directors' meeting tomorrow night at 8 in the Municipal Building.

Several local organizations have urged the Director to begin immediate negotiations for possible purchase of the firm by the town.

"North-Enders have long complained about the quality of the firm's water, especially after rain storms. It has no filtration plant. On April 7, the commission, the State Health Department, and the Public Utilities Commission will confer on possible permanent improvements," Scott said. The company, which has been carrying out temporary improvements, will report to the PUC that they intend to do so permanently correct the situation.

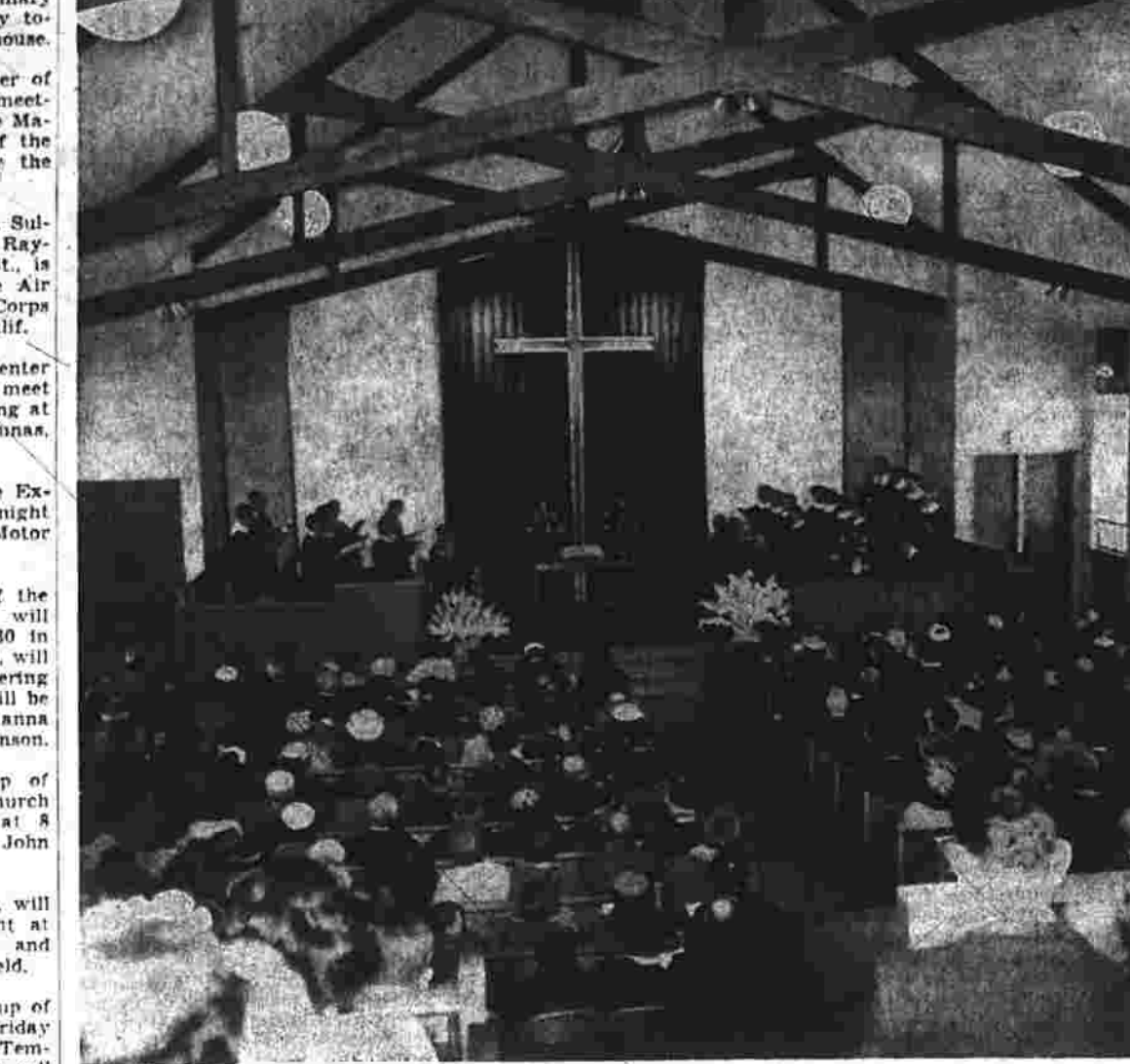
