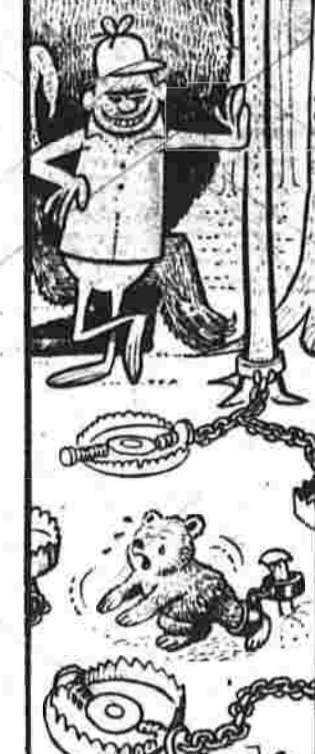

Throgs Pay Last Tribute To Salling

Colts City, Va., March 18 (AP)—Throgs continue to pour into this little town in final tribute to Civil War veteran John Salling.

Funeral services are not until tomorrow. But the body of the 115-year-old general—the title was honorary—has been on public view since yesterday morning at the National Guard Armory here.

Salling is dressed in the crisp, grey summer uniform of a Confederate general given him last year by the Women's Army Corps.

A handsome bronze medallion in a velvet-lined box, issued by act of Congress, is proposed for the Confederate flag draped over the lower half of the glistening copper casket.

The U.S. Army has been planning its final military honors to Salling for more than a year.

Protestant services are planned both at the armory and at graveside at the family cemetery near his home at Slant, Va., 12 miles north of here.

The second Army band is being flown here for the funeral, along with a crack color guard and firing squads, and a dozen military pall bearers.

Judge Tells Golf Club Move Tee

Trenton, N. J., March 18 (AP)—The New Jersey Supreme Court has ruled unanimously for the comfort of a family which found life next to a golf course scarcely up to par.

The August body ruled 4-0 yesterday that the drive over the pond at the third hole of the Ramsey Golf and Country Club is hazardous to the home life of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Sans and their two children.

The stroke must be eliminated, the court said, thereby coincidentally making matters for course designers.

The backyard of the Sans' home in Ramsey, is a few feet from the pond.

What that meant for the Sans was described by Justice John J. Francis.

"...The constant movement of the players to and from the tee in close proximity to their rear lawn and house was accompanied by a flow of conversation which became annoying and burdensome to them."

"It awakened them and their children as early as 7 in the morning and it pervaded their home all day long until twilight."

Occasionally, a low hook or slice or teased shot of a golfer carried upon them lawn. Then, by means of a trapdoor, the ball is retrieved. Sometimes it is played from that position.

"While allience is the conventional courtesy when a golfer is addressing his ball and swinging, the ball is released between shots, and presumably the nature of the comments depends in some measure upon the success or failure of the player in negotiating the hazardous water."

Town Will Study North End Water

The Board of Directors last night named a 4-man committee to study the water problem in the North End water plant, to meet with officials of the Manchester Water Company, and to keep tabs on Public Utilities Commission reports and recommendations regarding the condition of the firm's water.

Committee chairman John Hutchinson, acting fast on the problem that has troubled many North Enders, will meet at 4:30 p.m. today in the office of City Manager Richard Martin with firm vice-president Ernest Morse. Members of the committee are Directors Theodore Powell, Gilbert Barnes, and Ronald Isaac. The committee was appointed by Mayor Eugene T. Kelly following Board discussion of the water problem and a detailed explanation by general manager Ernest Morse on the town's position.

The problem, a long-standing one, has been to provide water used by some 12,500 North Enders from the old water plant drain system into the private company's system.

The firm was required by the PUC last September to hire a consulting engineer to recommend improvements. The engineer reported to be completed by this month. The firm will report what improvements it intends to make to the PUC.

Mr. Martin in a lengthy report to the Board said that the water problem amounts to a heavy expense, more than \$1 million, to improve the water supply and to increase water rates that might be needed to pay for the improvements. The firm has proposed that the improvements could be financed without an increase in rates.

He said communications between himself and the firm's president, William Foulds, have not been very appreciable. Mr. Foulds has offered to buy the town's water system, but Mr. Martin declined the offer, saying that it would be to sell to a private company where "arm's-length negotiations" would be required.

A bill currently pending in the General Assembly that would give the town authority to purchase the water system and other improvements, and to increase water rates to pay for the improvements, is being studied by the firm.

Mr. Martin said that on a decision to buy, the town should hire outside legal, engineering, and financial assistance to make a complete study. This would avoid the expense of the town's own study, which would be included in the purchase price.

He said, if the firm is bought, its users should continue to pay higher rates than those paid by town department users, for reasons of equity.

Speaking further on the water problem in general, Mr. Martin said he is keeping on friendly terms with the firm's officials, and that the water would have to be pumped "at some expense."

Future Government Men Are Classroom Goodness

Who was it that said that if you dream big enough, all your dreams will come true?

Last summer I derived the fact that despite the millions upon millions of dollars spent on education there is really no effort at training available for career government personnel, no opportunity for dedicated public servants to attain professional status, no training school to attract and groom for a career in domestic government service.

I labored the point that if government service were put on a par with other leading professions better brains would be attracted into public service and we would all benefit.

My dream is that beginning to come true. Next month the American Management Assn. will initiate a month-long course to be repeated at least three times this year—for top and middle-level government executives representing Federal, state, county and municipal agencies and the armed forces.

Under the chairmanship of Sumner G. Whitler, administrator of veterans' affairs, the course will be given at the AMA Academy at Saratoga Lake, N. Y. It will be patterned on AMA's management course that has groomed nearly 5,000 managers of business, industrial, government and service organizations since it was started in 1902.

Visiting case-study presentations and problem-solving sessions and instruction will be offered on the tools of organization and planning, the use of public relations and effective management programs and effective management programs.

The AMA has high hopes for the course. Already it reports some 200 government men have attended its regular management courses and gained by their association with men from industry and finance.

Some 24 of these participants took the course on government management agencies to spend up to 1 per cent of their budgets for training. AMA expects this policy will provide them with a steady stream of students.

Evidently the AMA is not alone in this area of training government men. New York University has received a \$250,000 grant from Ford Foundation to study the possibility of instituting executive programs for state and local employees and for training administrators varying officers in New York City.

At Harvard University, the Littauer School offers a year of graduate study to train for government service. The University of Chicago provides a one-month institute each year for government employees. In Washington, D. C., the Brookings Institute holds an annual two-week workshop for government training.

Additionally, the American Society for Public Administration in Chicago holds seminars for varied government men and the University of Southern California for local and state employees.

Perhaps the day is not too far off when we'll realize the wisdom of supporting a full-fledged university for training for government careers patterned after the Army, Navy and Air Force academies where our military and naval leadership has come. Let's pitch for it.

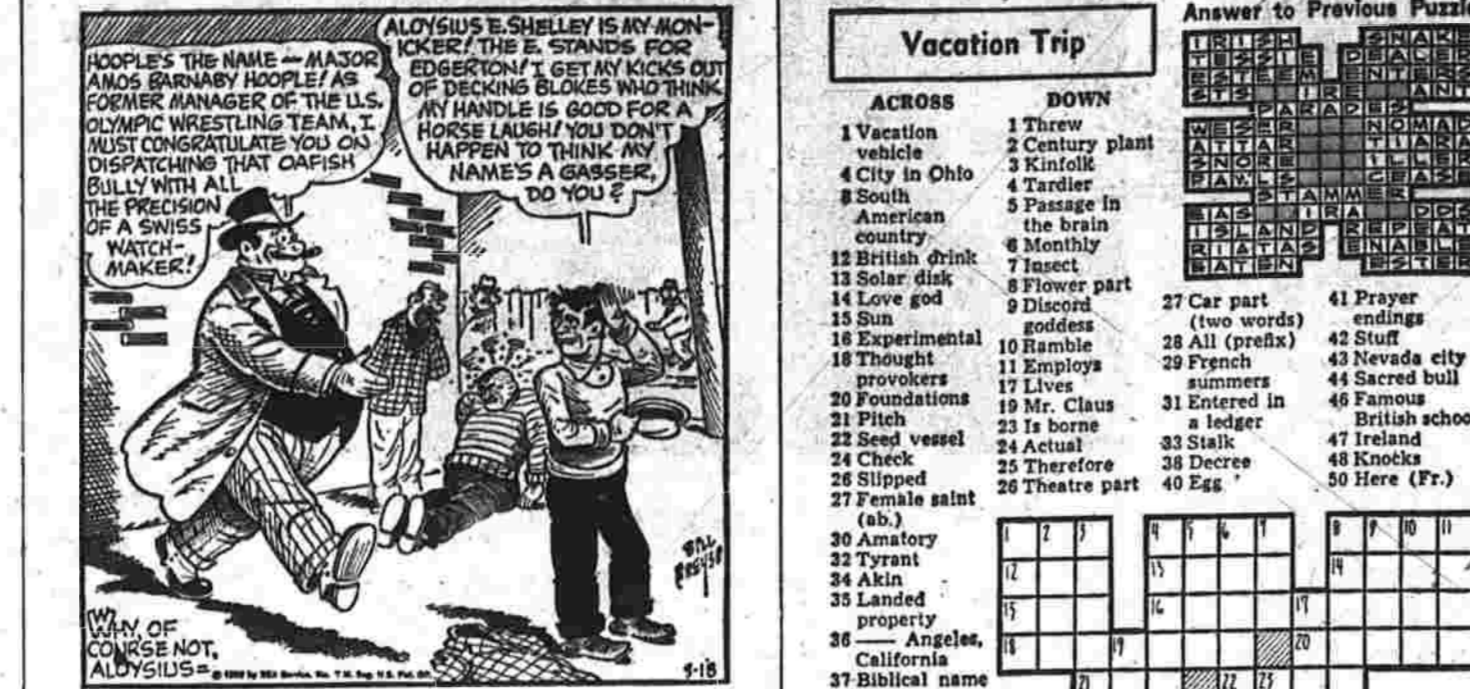
