 It's been going the rounds for more than a dozen years. Who knows what unsung cook first dreamed up this good idea? But others continue to bless him or her.

We're talking about the American way of slicing a loaf of crusty French-style bread, and then spreading a flavorful mixture over the slice. Now the unsung loaf goes into a moderate or hot oven for 10 to 15 minutes to come out browned and fresh, spreading a nostalgic aroma, tasting robust and savory.

We have a notion this loaf was first concocted to eat with hot, crusty barbecued foods. If so, it caught on so fast that now you are likely to find it wherever there's an indoor buffet spread.

The crusty loaf, the sort we've encountered were spread with garlic butter. But cooks got an inventive, tasteful, now often as the garlic mixture. Some of the best of these are made with blue cheese.

For this basic cheese spread, allow a quarter of a cup of butter and blue cheese to stand at room temperature before heat. Then mix together thoroughly. Store in a tightly covered container in the refrigerator and use as fancy and need dictate.

Colorful Easter Bonnet Sandwiches

 Whimsical cooks come into their own at holidays. Easter time is the season of offering colorful eggs, festive year breads and lamb dishes. Add other gay creations to this joyous occasion.

Pastry chefs into food. Lately we've been having bonnet sandwiches and bonnet cookies on Easter tables. Now here come Easter bonnet sandwiches and they're as cute as button.

One point on which you insist: Holiday food, although it may be whimsically shaped and decorated, must not be so fanciful that it doesn't taste good. These open sandwiches, bonnet style, measure up because they are a delightful flavor combination. The "bun" and "cream" of our edible sandwich has made of cream-cheese cottage cheese seasoned with lemon juice. Cucumber slices give height to the "crown" and the bonnet "trimmings" of water cress sprigs and radishes add small bits of color.

These bonnet sandwiches are fun to serve during the Easter holiday, perhaps for a one o'clock luncheon and small fry. Grow-ups will enjoy them as much as teenagers and small fry.

They also are amusing to serve as an hors d'oeuvre. They are easy to make and you can easily out the recipe in half an hour.

Or make them part of an Easter day supper buffet that features ham because the cottage cheese and cucumber flavors are in line with that meat. What else would go on the buffet table? Weigh in with a hot potato puff and a salad of broccoli or green asparagus. Dessert could be a pound cake with an orange filling and a topping of whipped cream; or a meringue filled with a tangy lemon cream.

Easter bonnet sandwiches: Ingredients: 1 carton (8 ounces) cream style cottage cheese (small curd), 2 teaspoons lemon juice, salt, 20 slices bread, 2 drops red food color, 2 drops green food color, 2 drops red food color, 20 slices unpeeled cucumber (about 1/2-inch thick and 1 1/2 inches wide), 15 small sprigs watercress, 24 raspberries or blueberries.

Method: Beat cottage cheese to make as creamy as possible, add lemon juice and a dash of salt. Cut circles from 16 bread slices, using a 3-inch cookie cutter. Cut 4 circles from each remaining 4 bread slices, using a 1 1/2-inch cookie cutter. Divide cottage cheese mixture into 4 equal parts and add one color to each of 3 parts, leaving fourth part white. Spread a large and a small circle of bread with each color of cottage cheese mixture. Place a cucumber slice in center of each large bread circle. Top with watercress. Decorate "bonnets" by arranging a watercress sprig and 3 or 4 raspberries or blueberries on one side of each hat. Makes 16 sandwiches.

Doctor Says

Paulo, Lack of Mass Could Be Worst Effect of H-Bomb

 The possibility of being attacked with a thermonuclear bomb is something I would rather not think about at all. But it is surely a hazard which all of us should contemplate in a cold-blooded sort of way and then try to forget.

On this subject, Lt. Col. Ingalls H. Simmons made some important points in an address to the Ninth Annual County Medical Societies Civil Defense Conference.

7-Stage Rocket For Moon Trip

Pasadena, Calif., March 20 (AP)—A space scientist says a 7-stage rocket to take man to the moon within the next four years is in the planning stages.

The rocket, called Nova, was described at a conference here yesterday by Dr. Abe Silverstein, director of Space Flight Development for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

Silverstein said the first three stages will be 260 feet tall—about equal to a 26-story building. He gave no details of the final four stages.

The first three stages will power the rocket to the moon. It may carry two or three men. A fourth stage will slow the rocket down for landing on the moon, and the other three will return it to Earth.

Seaweed Powder Boon to Cooks

Copenhagen—A tasteless powder made from a seaweed that grows only in the Kattegat, an arm of the North Sea between Sweden and Denmark, is giving cooks a big lift.

Called threosellan, the powder allows an overcooked or undercooked pudding to turn out well. World production of the jelling agent is 1,000,000 pounds during 1958 compared with only 50,000 pounds in 1948.

The United States used 140,000 pounds of the powder in 1958.

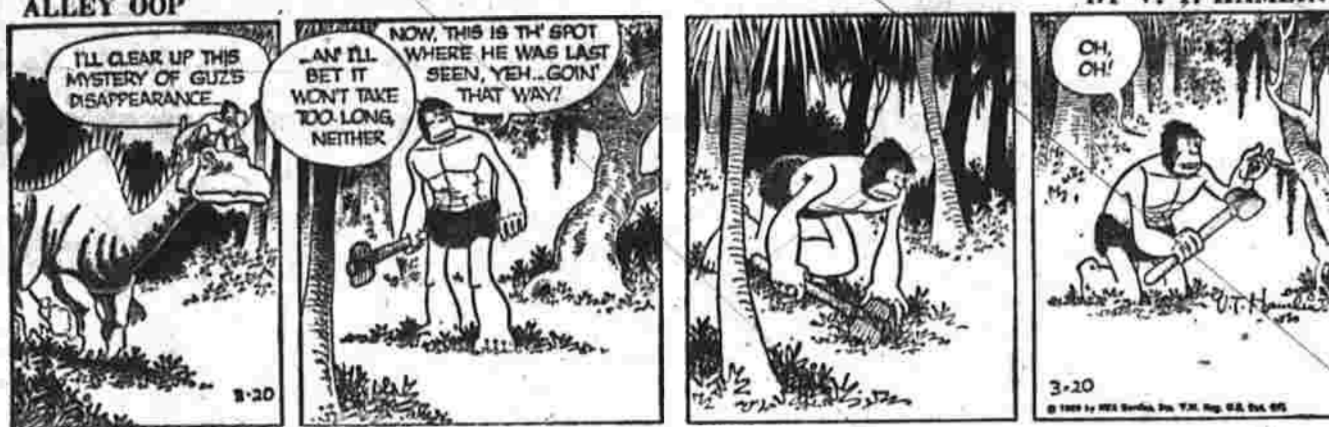

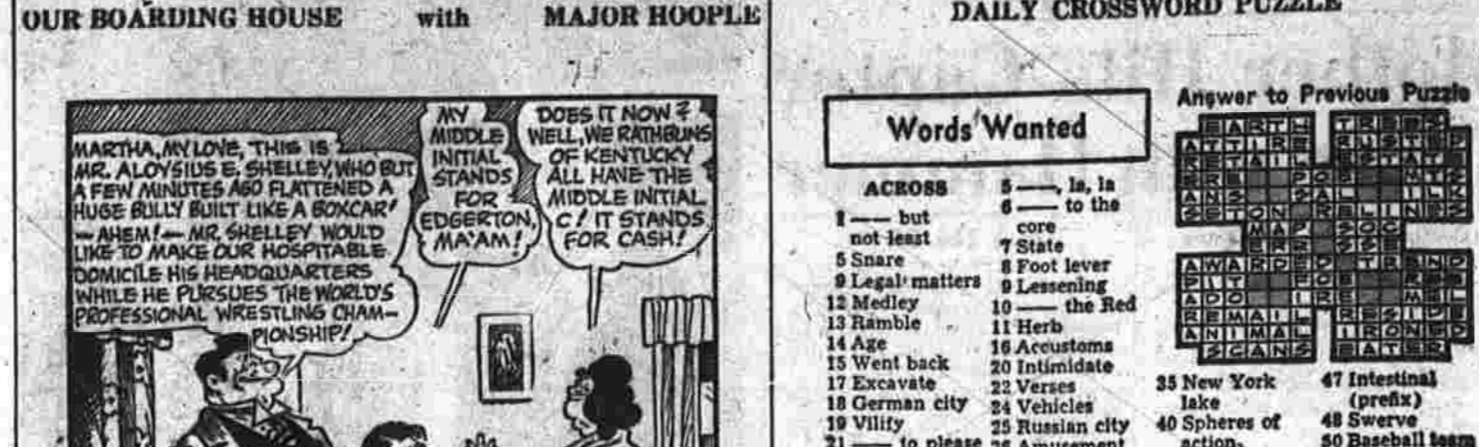

Moriarty Will Fight Zone Change Request

The town of Coventry may be faced with a court battle should a proposed zone change on Rt. 31 be approved.

Matthew Moriarty, Manchester businessman who owns over 700 acres of land in Coventry, told the Coventry Zoning and Planning Commission last night at a public hearing he will fight a change in zone from residential to commercial, sought by L. James Loyalism of Rt. 31.

Loyalism wants the zone change so he can relocate his TV and radio sales and repair business from its present location near the Cove Restaurant to a lot adjacent to his home on Rt. 31, about a half mile east of Daisy Hill.

Moriarty owns property across Rt. 31 from Loyalism's home. All zoned as residential. He also owns land on Coventry lake in the vicinity of Moriarty told the Commission last night at a public hearing that should the request be granted, it would be spot zoning.

House-Type Building Loyalism proposes to build a structure similar to a house in appearance, which could be converted into a residence should he ever cease to do business at that location. He said the building, while being used as a business, would have the outward appearance of a dwelling.

It was pointed out last night, however, that the town would have no control over the property should Loyalism decide to sell it. Once a property is zoned as commercial, there will be no way of restricting it to structures such as Loyalism proposes.

Both Moriarty and his attorney said they considered such a change as spot zoning and, they contended, was illegal.

P. Raymond Dings, town assessor and owner of property in the immediate vicinity of Loyalism's property, said he was neither for nor against the change but he felt that a business at this location, on a hill, might constitute a safety hazard.

Some arguments for it were that the town needed more business and that properties bordering Rt. 31, a main highway, were the logical place to locate them.

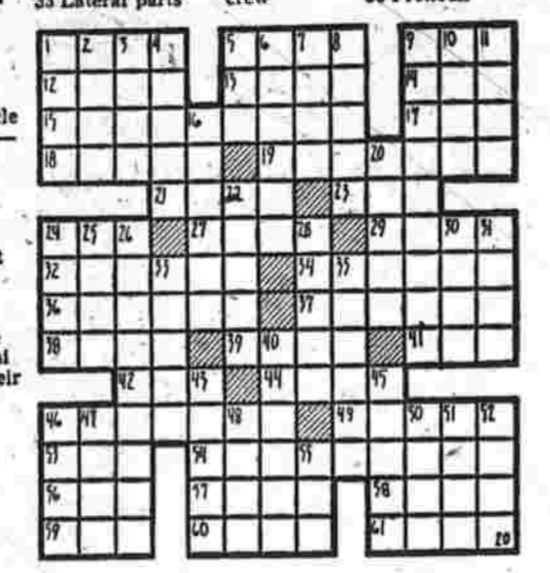

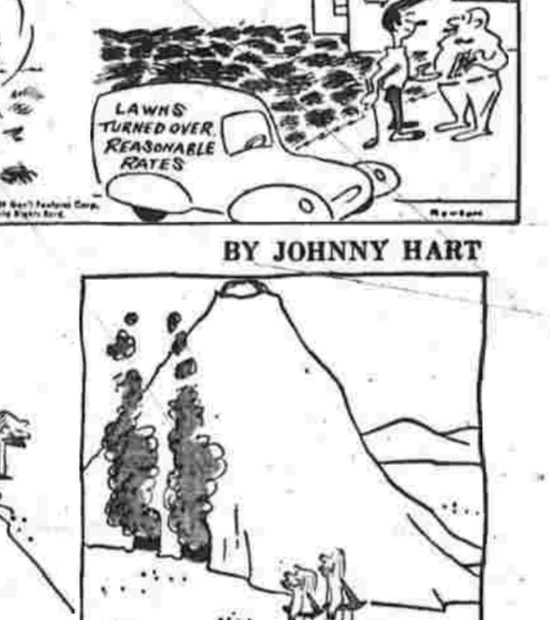
