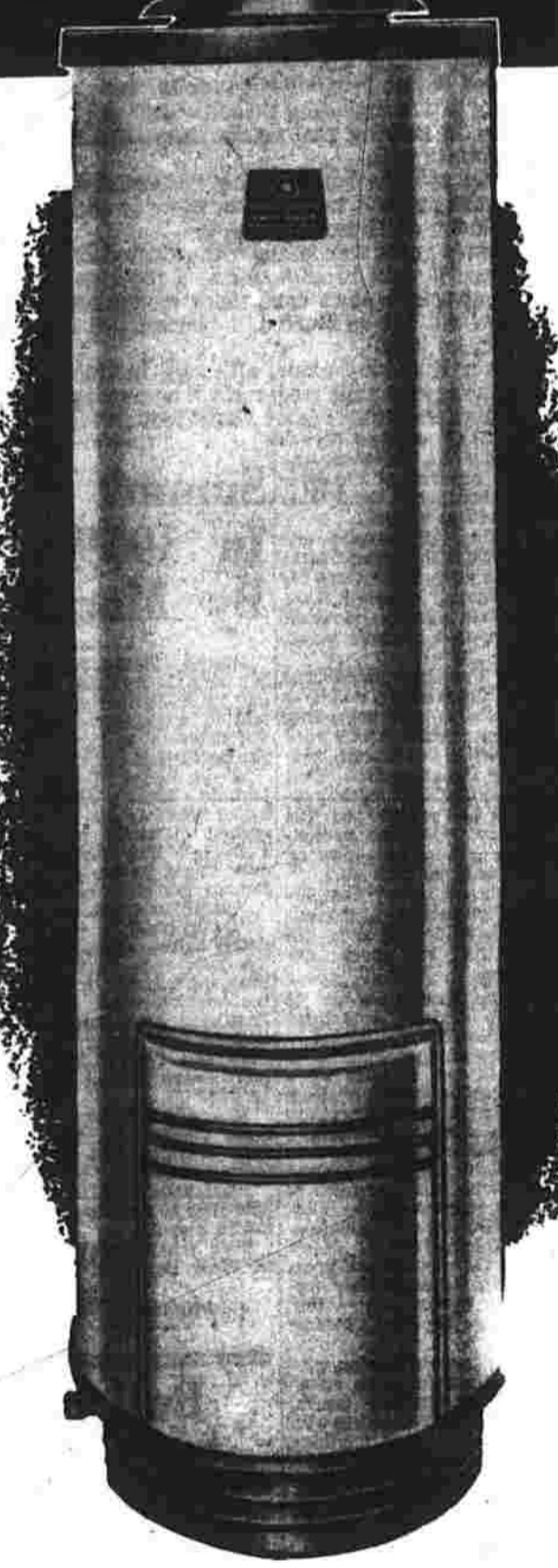

Some custards for Creme Brulle? Whether it is a culinary utopia or a rather than our. These recipes call for egg yolks instead of whole eggs we use. The egg and heavy cream version is sometimes cooked on top of the range in a double boiler. Our recipe uses the baked custard technique; you can mix it up in a very few minutes, without scalding the cream and milk, and put it in the oven in a hot-water bath. Then you can forget it until it is set enough to be taken out and chilled.

The trick in making this dessert is "burning" the sugar. Once upon a time it was melted with a salerone combination to which it is easy to become addicted.

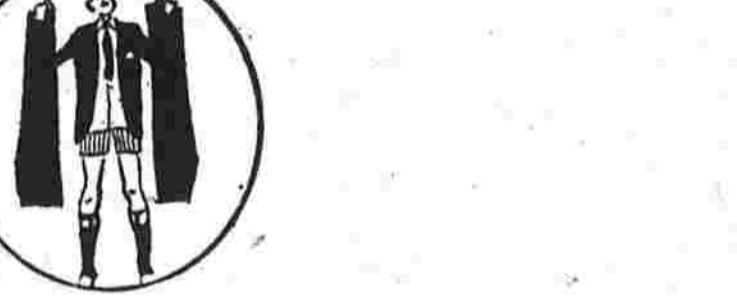

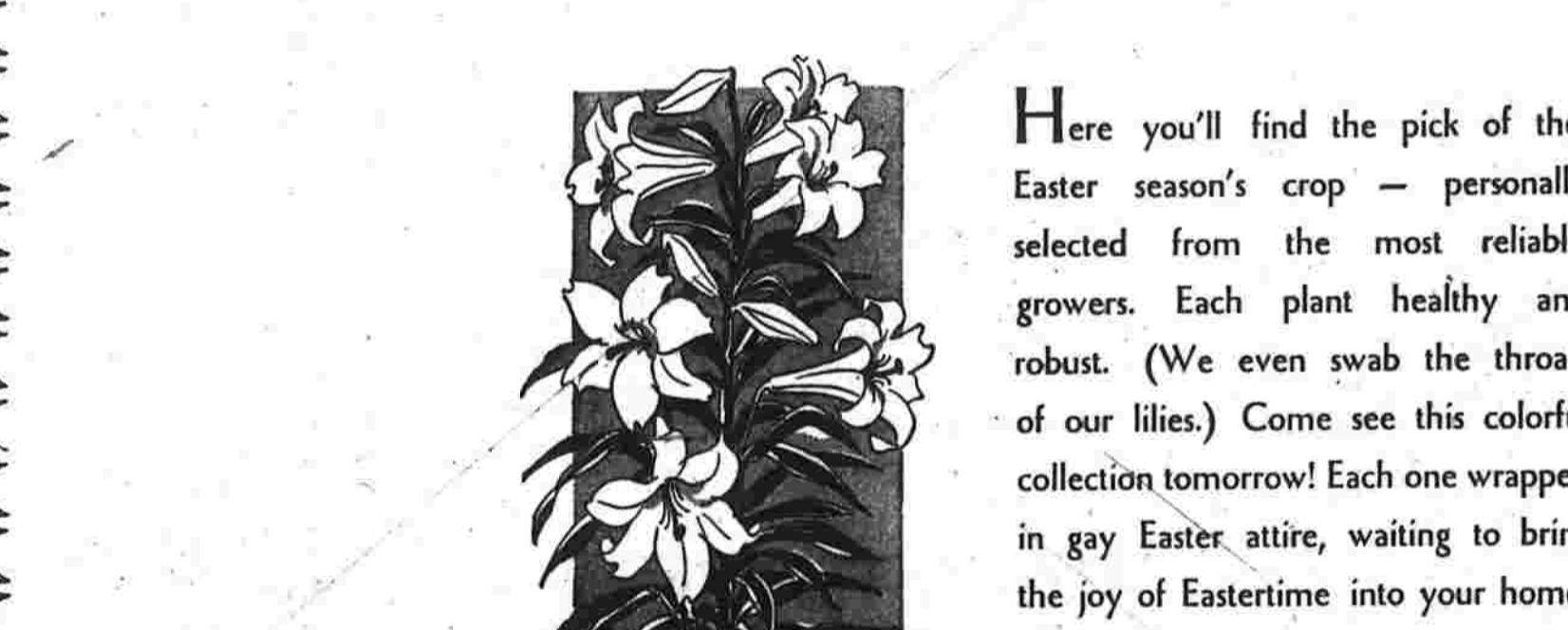

city is often short-changed in the matter of state aid.

In a heated vote, Republican Senators winnily added their support to those of their Democratic colleagues in a thunderous "aye." One lone voice was faintly heard with a "no."

There was a "no" while the body waited for Lt. Gov. Malcolm Wilson, presiding officer and a Republican, to deal with the situation. He smiled and blandly ruled "the amendment is defeated."

But there was no whimsy in the resolution offered in the city council. It came from Joseph N. Sharkey, Democratic majority leader, and 10 other Democratic councilmen.

The resolution calls for a committee to be set up to study "the possibility and legality of New York City seceding from the state of New York for the purpose of becoming a sovereign state."

The measure was introduced with much fan-shaking in the direction of Albany. Sharkey, who comes from Brooklyn, denounced what he called the "vicious attitude" of Republican Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller and the Legislature in imposing "economic slavery" on the city.

The statehood proposal would need pretty widespread support to get anywhere. It would have to pass two successive sessions of the state legislature as an amendment to the constitution, then be approved by voters in a referendum.

National Product To Hit New Peak

Washington, March 25 (AP)—A new record in production of goods and services is in prospect for the first quarter of 1959, the Commerce Department reports.

In a glowing report yesterday, the department predicted the new high will be well above the previous peak reached in a rate of some \$44 billion a year.

The extent of the new high won't be known officially, however, until next month, when the government announces first quarter estimates of the GNP, which is the value of all goods and services produced.

The department attributed the expansion of economic activity to three main factors—high consumer buying, an inventory buildup by business and heavier investment in housing and industrial plants.

New Haven, March 25 (AP)—New Haven's Yale University is likely to conduct a hidden persuaders and active job poster with a famed university, a Superior Court judge ruled today.

Both the motel and the university are named Yale, and the latter is using Yale's name in its advertising.

Judge Philip R. Pastore yesterday denied an injunction sought by Yale University to prevent the Yale Motel Inn, located in nearby Wallingford, from using the word "Yale" in its name.

The university brought the suit last August 1957, claiming that the motel was using Yale's reputation for private gain.
