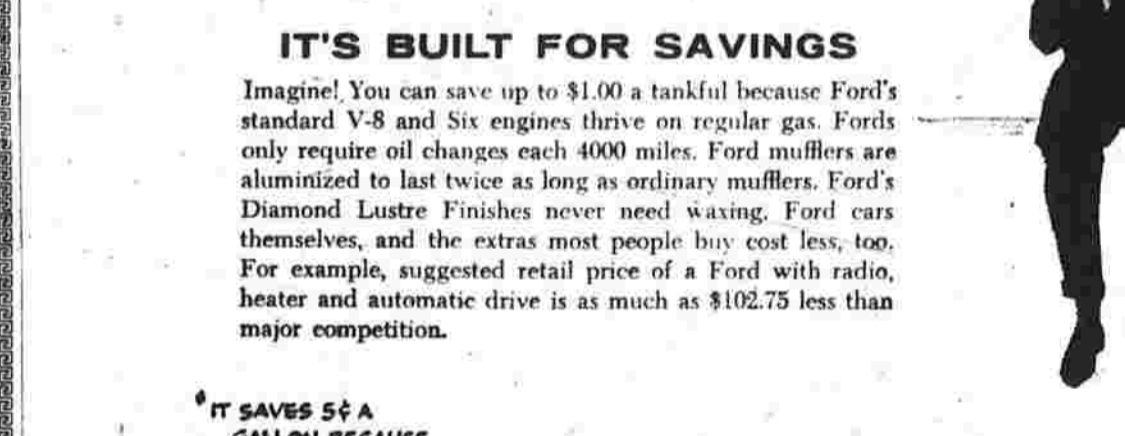

Bayer Summarizes Sewer Cost Views

A legal opinion from Town Council Paul Bayer has been submitted to General Manager Richard Martin on a proposed \$100,000 sewer installation in the West End town.

It summarizes Bayer's remarks on the subject in past months. Also, the lengthy opinion permits a clear picture of the subject, explains what has been said about it, answers some questions and eliminates some confusion.

The problem, as stated by Bayer, is this: Woodridge property owners would get sewer service from the project but since October they have opposed assessment rates the Board of Directors has proposed to levy for it.

The plan was that the 300 property-owners would pay \$100,000.

The project is a force main and pump station to be located on W. Middle Tpk., west of Center St. It would connect to the sewage treatment plant at Otis St., relieve a minor overflow condition at a Parkside pump station, and step toward extension of sewer service to the west and north end.

During the controversy, a possible change in town assessment policy was considered.

It was the town's policy to be able to assess property-owners on an extended or additional basis that had already been assessed.

The policy was to assess in such cases, the town has paid the full cost of some sewer work.

Applied to the West End problem, the consideration was that the Woodridge Heights people might be assessed for the project in a manner consistent with this opinion.

Can Assess Cost

The opinion then leaves the subject of assessing people already served, and discusses the legality of assessing Woodridge people.

Bayer said: "There is authority for allowing the Sewer Department to absorb a portion of the cost that cannot be properly assessed. This is true under the general case law and is logical under the theory that no more can be assessed than the actual benefits received, and that there is a possibility that the benefits received might not equal the total cost. Furthermore, we operate under our charter, which we operate under a municipality may apportion and assess the whole or any portion of the cost of the construction of such a system. We conclude that we definitely have the authority to absorb so much of the cost of an installation as we may desire."

Originally, it was proposed the town would pay 25 per cent of the project's cost. Fifty per cent would be assessed.

Iraq Reds Pushing Kassem to Break With West, Nasser

Beirut, Lebanon, March 26 (AP)—Iraqi Communists are putting new pressure on Premier Abdel Karim Kassem to break with the Western powers by suggesting Gamal Abdel Nasser is the West's "only hope."

There were growing indications today that Gen. Kassem is being overruled in his "forget Nasser" campaign to check both sides of his revolutionary regime.
