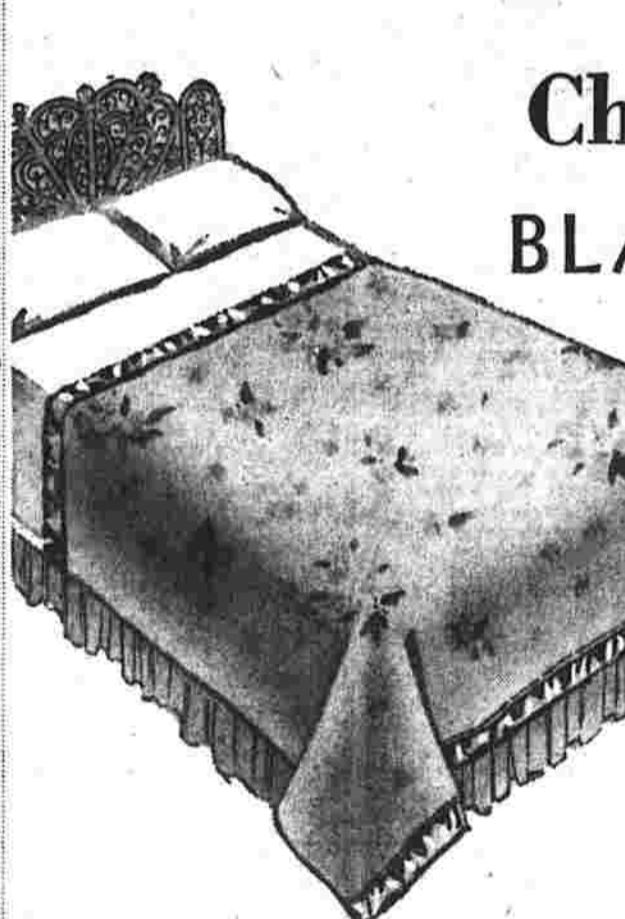

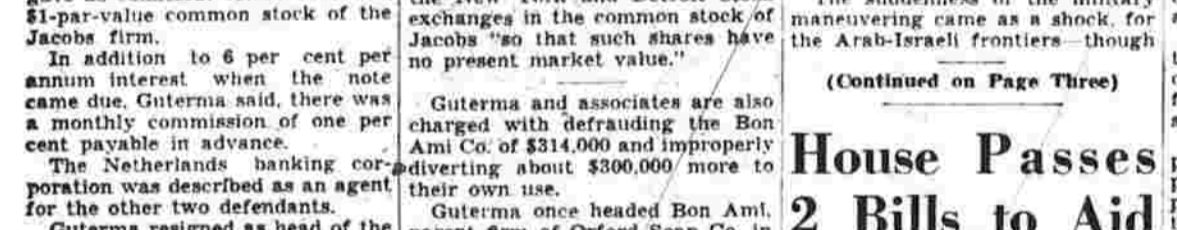

Carini Tells ZPC of Hopes For Large 'Space' Plant

Business Carini of Bolton, who claims he and two others will fly to the moon in December, told the Andover Zoning and Planning Commission last night he hopes to build a 10,000 square foot plant in Andover.

Carini, head of OTC of New England, seeks a change in some town agricultural and residential zoning to allow a space craft industrial park for 150 acres off Highway 101 in the southeast section of the town. The land is owned by Leonard Gligio of Bolton.

As the proposed Andover plant Carini said last night he would engage in manufacturing "free energy" machines powered by "ultra electrical accumulator and gravity motors."

It is this type of motor which would power the space craft Carini claims he and OTC T. Carr and Dr. Wayne D. Aho will fly from Oklahoma City to the moon and back.

No Noise, Waste

Pressed for details at the ZPC meeting last night, Carini assured commission members there would be no noise, explosions, dust or glare involved in the industry.

He also assured the ZPC there would be no dangerous waste products since the process does not involve melting the atom.

At a ZPC public hearing last Thursday night, Carini's wife, Olive, appeared in the absence of her husband. He was in Oklahoma City at the OTC Enterprises laboratory. She was unable to give commission members and residents detailed information on the company's plans and the hearing was adjourned. He was later invited for last night's meeting to give the ZPC more information.

Last night, Carini expressed surprise that so many questions were asked last week about the firm and its plans.

He was told by the commission that the nature of an industry planned for an industrial park must be designated and qualified by a "performance standard." The performance standard determines whether there will be noise, explosions or other factors involved in the industry.

Those who supported retaining the education requirement included Robert I. Collin, chairman of the Connecticut Safety Commission, Wilbur L. Cross Jr., of the State Motor Vehicles Department, and John J. Casey of the Connecticut Motor Club.

The Senate passed a bill which would be a civil rights bill that would ban discrimination in apartment houses accommodating a minimum of five families and private housing developments has been approved by the legislative judiciary committee. The ban covering private housing developments refers to those of five or more units built on the same piece of land or on adjoining lots.

The bill now awaits action by the Legislature. Sen. John M. Scanlon (D-New Britain), committee chairman, told newsmen yesterday that the purpose of the bill is to bring private housing under the provisions of the public accommodations act — an act which forbids turning down people seeking apartments in public housing for reasons of race, creed or color.

A stir came at a legislative hearing on the question of whether the law should continue to require that teenagers take driver education courses as a provision of their operators' licenses.

The hearing was in regard to bills that would eliminate the driver education provision as it now stands. Teenagers, teachers and parents urged the legislative transportation committee to retain the requirement.

Driver education courses for auto license applicants between the ages of 16 and 18 have been required since January 1958. Those favoring abolition of the requirement said there were many youths unable to take courses in public schools who had to go to private driving schools and incur financial hardship. Driving education at public schools was cut back recently by the state, leaving some schools without such courses because of lack of funds.

Many of those who supported the driving education course requirement asked that the state increase financial aid to the schools to expand the program.

Rep. John M. Lupton (R-Westport), sponsor of one of the bills, called the requirement unfair and said it forced the "subsidization of private enterprise."

Those who supported retaining the education requirement included Robert I. Collin, chairman of the Connecticut Safety Commission, Wilbur L. Cross Jr., of the State Motor Vehicles Department, and John J. Casey of the Connecticut Motor Club.

West End Sewer On Agenda Again

The West End sanitary sewer problem once again comes before the Board of Directors at a meeting held Tuesday at 8 p.m. in the Municipal Building.

The agenda for the meeting asked the Directors to consider setting a date for a public hearing on assessing for "any or all portions of the proposed West End sanitary sewerage system."

Since October, the Board has not acted upon a method of assessing for a proposed \$100,000 pump station and force main to be located on W. Middle Tpke., west of Center St.

Also, General Manager Richard Martin's completion of existing sewer assessment rules is on the agenda for Board action. Action on assessing for the project was delayed pending Board approval of these rules.

Martin said the public hearing should be held five weeks after approval of the rules, which could come Tuesday.

Make Bid for Court

A request that a court for this area in the State's new system be established in Manchester is expected to be made by the Directors.

Martin said new courts will be located in towns and cities at the request of legislative bodies and where suitable facilities and quarters exist. He said the quarters and facilities of the town court here should be suitable.

The Board is expected to take routine action in authorizing Martin to enter into an agreement with the State to get State aid highway funds.

The Board's fiscal policy and swimming pool subcommittees are slated for reports.

Another matter is construction of steps from Buckingham St. to the Bowers School grounds for which Town Engineer James Sheehan has given a cost estimate of \$225,000, a gain larger than in the 50 years preceding the war.

'Maverick' Democrats Said Hiking GOP Role

Town Director Ronald Jacobs last night said it appears a "problem of mavericks" will make the Board of Directors dependent on the votes of its Republican minority members throughout its term of office.

Atty. Jacobus, speaking to the Republican Town Committee, said the "democratically controlled Board has had to depend on minority votes in every controversial issue since it took office in November."

"And this is typical," he said, "of the pattern you're going to see in the future."

Jacobs, whose talk was in line with a plan of Town Chairman John F. Shea Jr. to have Board business discussed at committee meetings, claimed that inability of Board Democrats to align five votes on tough matters has passed some leadership responsibility to himself and fellow Republican Directors Gilbert Barnes and Robert Gordon, by default.

The Republican minority is the first in town history. Democratic votes in town offices in the last election.

Jacobs, who is in his second term as a director, said it appears that Democrats have so long held the minority role of critics that they, though in power, "they can't face the responsibility they never had before."

Can't Master Votes

He said the 6-member Democratic majority needed Republican votes in connection with the Manchester Country Club lease and fluoridation, and can't master five votes to assess for a proposed sanitary sewer project in the West End of town.

This pattern, he said, was not the case with the former, Republican-controlled Board. The majority needed one or two Democratic votes on some issues, Jacobs said, but this was the exception rather than the rule.

The present Board is facing a Democratic "problem," he said. Jacobs also said the Democrats "had better concentrate" on cutting down the town budget for 1959-60 rather than spend their energy, he said, in criticizing the Board's record.

Plans Announced For Catholic High

Plans and specifications for the proposed \$2 million Catholic high school and convent on Hilliard St. in Hartford, archdiocese were also completed. The other two schools have been completed.
