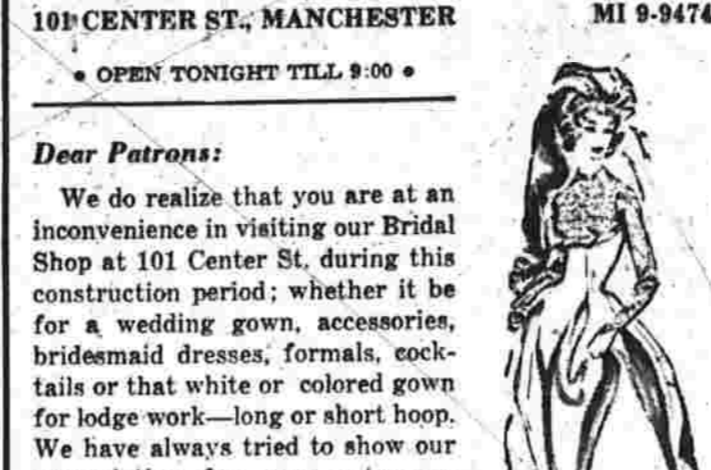

# Rockville-Vernon Industrial Zone Plan Slated For Hearing by Town Group

A hearing on four proposed changes in zoning regulations, has been set for April 29 at 8 p.m. in Vernon Elementary School.

The zoning commission of the Vernon Fire District is proposing that 14 acres of land between Rt. 25 and a feeder road under construction between Tunnel and Rockville Rds., be rezoned from rural residential to commercial.

The Commission also proposes that 25 acres of 1 of south of the feeder road be changed from rural residential to light industrial. This land is adjacent to an industrial site of 36 acres between Bolton and Hamforth Rds.

The Commission is proposing that a portion of the land should be zoned for commercial and light industrial use while it is still vacant, Charles Brown, chairman of the Commission, said there are only a few houses near the sites and none in 1/2 mile.

Two other changes proposed by the commission were requested by property owners, Irving Sticht, West Hart Rd. developer wants rezoning of land between Sticht at Tunnel Rd. changed from rural residential to commercial. He wants a motel and restaurant at the location. The variance has expired.

A fourth zone change is for 18 acres of land on Rt. 83 near Thrall Rd. Edwin J. Aberte, turkey farmer, wants the land rezoned from residential to commercial. The land fronts on Rt. 83, and runs to a depth of 200 feet.

The zoning commission also proposed a number of changes in the zoning regulations, mainly intended to clarify present regulations which are presently subject to "interpretation," according to Brown.

However, the following changes were noted in the proposed regulations: Commercial for farms are excluded from residential and commercial zones.

Part-time farming is permitted in a rural residential zone.

Package Stores are permitted in a commercial zone only at a hearing by the Zoning Board of Appeals and subject to restrictions of that board.

A Zoning Board of Appeals hearing is required for any rezoning of a parcel of land.

A ZBA hearing is required for any operation in an industrial AA (light industrial) zone which may be detrimental to the neighborhood.

Disposal of radioactive material in any zone is prohibited under any circumstances.

The minimum floor area of a house in a residential A zone is increased from 850 to 900 square feet of living area.

Off-Street Parking

Detailed regulations for off-street parking require that parking area be provided for one vehicle or 1. Each building occupying a house or lot: 2. Each six seats in a theater or the like; 3. Every 100 square feet of ground floor area in stores or offices, and for each 500 square feet on additional floors; 4. For each two employees of a wholesale house, industrial plant or passenger transportation terminal and 5. Adequate parking spaces, subject to approval of the zoning or building inspection.

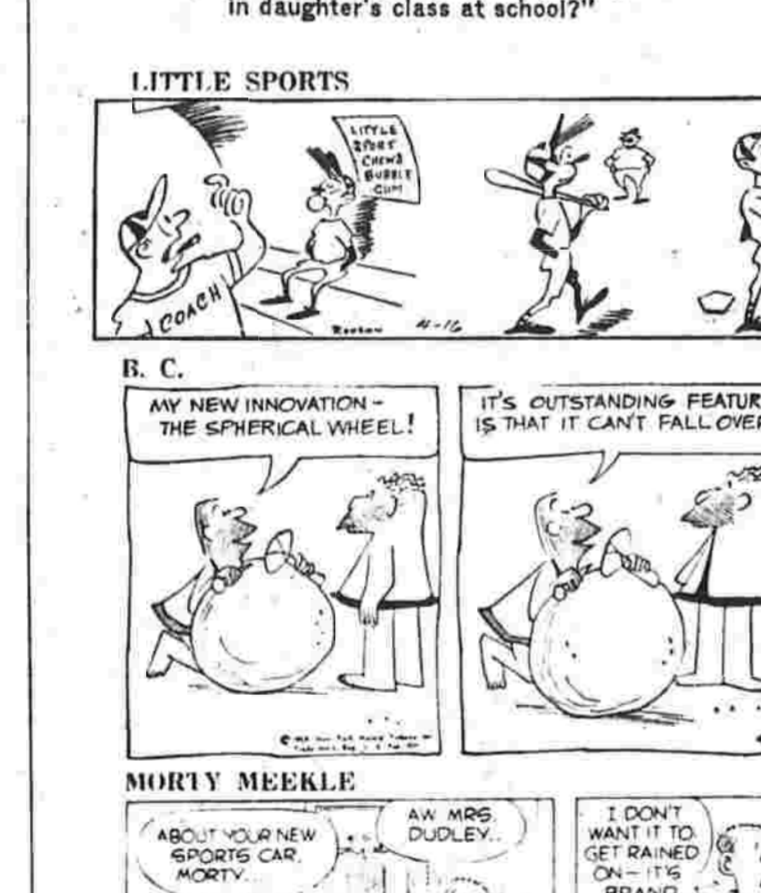
