### For West or for China? Observers Agree Liu's Election Means Trouble

(Continued from Page One)

American thinking divided on the subject, with some holding to the line Mao would have a free hand to concentrate on important party and national problems.

Chou's position as premier remained unchanged in the reshuffle. This, according to some observers, could clear the way for Chou to succeed Mao eventually as party chairman, thus maintaining the semblance of a division of power between party and government.

However, the possibility was recognized that Liu, with the prestige and influence of the presidency, eventually could seize the party leadership and emerge as the powerful head of party and government as Nikita Khrushchev did in Russia.

**EX WARRIOR DROPPED**

Tokyo, April 28 (AP)—Red China today dropped Ling Yun, former warlord of Yunnan Province, from its important National Defense Council.

Ling had been one of the vice chairmen of the group. He was accused of rightist deviation in 1957 for criticizing the Soviet Union and declaring that the United States had been more generous in its aid to China than the Communists even though he never joined the party. He became a vice chairman of the revolutionary committee of the Kuomintang, one of the eight non-Communist minor parties operating under the Reds.

The Communists have not announced what has become of him since his demotion.

The action against Ling was disclosed in a lengthy list of appointments to state ministries and the defense council by Premier Chou En-lai and newly elected President Liu Shao-chi. The appointments were approved by the People's Congress in Peking which elected Liu yesterday.

Chou made almost no changes in his cabinet team, leaving Chen Yi as his minister of foreign affairs. Supervisor Minister Liu was appointed minister of the interior. He succeeded Hsueh Chu-tai, who moved up to the presidency of the Supreme Court yesterday.

The ministry of justice and Chou's ministry of supervision were abolished.

Police Radio explained that the justice ministry's work is being taken over by the supreme court. It was assumed here that the interior ministry would take over the functions of the supervision ministry.

**You Should Know ... Ernest H. McNeill**

Ernest H. McNeill, town electrical inspector for the last two and-a-half years, is a man with more than 20 years experience in his chosen field.

During the past year McNeill has wired thousands of homes, buildings and industrial plants, torn down, assembled, and even designed electrical equipment, and has also operated his own contracting business.

Since he became electrical inspector for Manchester, McNeill has, in addition to his regular duties, been working toward a public education program aimed at the prevention of electrical hazards in the home. Part of this program, instituted in the planning stage, would set up classes to instruct interested homeowners in how to do small maintenance jobs which do not warrant calling an electrician.

McNeill explained that part of the reason he has been able to do not know the correct way to repair a defective plug or end of a lamp cord, change a fuse, or do other comparatively simple jobs.

Although such jobs are usually only a "couple of minutes work," he said, it is very important that they be done right as otherwise a potential fire hazard might be created. Besides, he added with a maintenance man as he has done women with procrastinating husbands who are "too busy" to tackle the handyman projects.

McNeill's "patience" is against the use of heavy-type fuses in the home than called for, and he has a fund of stories gathered over the years which illustrate his point.

He tells of the time in one home where a 30-amp fuse was used temporarily to replace the correct 15-amp one and shortly afterward a couch in the living room began smoldering. Investigation showed a two-pronged plug in a 15-amp outlet had been forced into a wall outlet when the piece of furniture was moved. A 15-amp fuse would have blown immediately, cutting the flow of electricity, he said. But with the other type, this didn't happen, the fire raged and started the fire.

It is the prevention of freak accidents like this which McNeill is much concerned.

In his capacity as inspector, McNeill checks on an average of 100 electrical permits a month. Many of these necessitate several visits as the work progresses. He also acts in an advisory capacity to contractors making the Manchester examining board before which applicants for electrical licenses must appear. In addition, he aids the Rockville examining board.

McNeill was born in 1909 in Vernon. Four years later his family moved to Rockville where his father, Christopher, managed an A&P store for many years. He graduated from Rockville High School in 1928. McNeill first worked in Middleton testing automotive parts, then, when the depression began, he started working as an electrician's assistant. Later he struck out for himself as an electrician, and in 1933 he returned to Rockville where he did contract work. The following year

Which one of the two may be guilty of furling the inspection system into an obstacle we do not pretend to judge, just as we would hesitate to judge whether it is proposing an exemption for underground and so-called testing. Washington more interested in dealing an agreement at Geneva or in reserving to itself the right to keep on testing forever.

**A Break in Japan**  
The local elections in Japan have resulted in a strong victory for the conservative, pro-American party of Premier Kishi, in spite of the fact that public opinion polls in Japan show that socialism seems to appeal to the Japanese more than capitalism, and in spite of the fact that anti-American sentiment in Japan is inevitably on the gradual increase, as it would increase in any occupied nation.

The election result apparently reflects two circumstances, both cutting down any possible doubt as to the Japanese voters to express their sentiments at the polls. The leadership of the Socialist party, which might have benefited from these sentiments, is an extremist leadership, not content with moderate proposals. It seemingly would like to kick America in the teeth and crawl into bed with Communist China, and neither of these comes close to the real Japanese mood.

The Kishi government itself comes closer to that mood by negotiations in which, although it remains pro-American, it is steadily pressing for more equality in the relationship between Japan and America, and for clearer understandings by which the role of American military power and positions in Japan would be subject to approval by Japan, and also open to termination by Japan if it should so desire.

In other words, the Kishi government is better at parrying and further negotiation to this end, and the angle of an international test has become a possibility.

**Add Signs Of The Times**  
To each his own sign of the times, and to Wall Street reporters down in New York, the sign is the entrance of the "little man" into the present bull market. When the ordinary guy who generally minds his own business begins looking for a \$2 stock guaranteed to go to \$50, and soon hears and acts on some rumor which tells him what stock is going to strike uranium, he is actually trying to wriggle out of one.

The surface record on this issue, however, reads somewhat in favor of Russia.

Russia, a year ago, announced its own unilateral ban on nuclear tests, to which it said it would hold so long as the West did not permit in testing of its own. This announcement came by the United States and Britain had already scheduled spring and summer tests. If Russia had taken the execution of these tests as a release from its own pledge, the pledge would have been exposed as a grandstand play, and nothing more. But Russia, in fact, did concede the United States and Britain the tests they had already scheduled, and still held to her own unilateral renunciation of all tests.

This amounted to a powerful moral and propaganda compulsion upon Washington, with the result that, in mid-summer, the Eisenhower administration, after what much have been fierce internal battles, decided that it must also renounce nuclear testing, and so announced on the condition, however, that Russia would enter formal negotiations at Geneva for an international test ban, accompanied by proper inspection and control machinery.

All the differences in the situation as between minor court reform and abolition of county government should, in the end, add up to the same kind of result, although the drama involved is like that of a mere open, sitting party being, will be much more savage on the county issue than they were on court reform.

But, although the argument to preserve the county system will be better than was the argument to preserve the town and justice courts, this difference will be balanced by the fact that the justice courts also has to be weaker. So, in a showdown, we should say that county reform should pass. The key strategy of the die-hard opposition will be to prevent this showdown, by proposing a two year moratorium on the issue, with the usual plea that then the General Assembly will be in a better position to judge the issue, with an option of reforming it after that time.

There is, in any case, a Republican factor on the balance scale, and in any showdown, there are likely to be about the same number of Republican votes for abolition of county government as there would have been for court reform in any occupied nation.

Another difference between the two issues involves the fact that court reform created an appealing new job system to replace an old job system, while county reform would create a somewhat helplessly anachronism in court reform.
