Inglis was called back for questioning after accusing Strauss of narrow-minded, vindictive and sometimes unethical tactics while chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC).

Dispute Stalls Welcome of Seaway Ship

Chicago, May 1.—The Flagship Santa Rosa, first American vessel to use the rebuilt St. Lawrence Seaway, expected a warm reception in Chicago yesterday, but ran into a serious dispute over its pilot.

The 460-foot Grace Line ship was forced to lay off shore for two hours while negotiators for a new American pilots' union bid with representatives of the vessel's owners.

The ship finally was allowed to proceed to dock and an official welcome was given by Mayor Richard Daley and other city officials only after the union agreed to take the pilotage problem into the hands of federal mediators.

The Licensed Tugmen and Pilots' Protective Assn. announced that one of its pilots, 50 days and C. F. Wooding, 50 days, was employed to pilot the Santa Rosa down the Calumet River into Lake Calumet Harbor on the far south side.

Tugboat men backed the new union. The line maintained, however, that it already had a pilot—the one which had guided the ship through the Great Lakes.

They were trying to make use of the gulfstream pilot, said Ted R. West, chief of the union's Chicago office. The line's pilot was the 1,200-mile voyage down the nearby from Montreal.

After the union group, headed by President Patrick Collins, decided to turn the issue over to mediators, the flag proceeded to the seven miles to the harbor.

Daley greeted the ship's skipper, Capt. Hawley MacDonell, and gave him a flag of the city of Chicago. He also hailed the flagmen, who were to enter Lake Calumet.

After the decision, Plant Manager W. T. Bittle told all management and office personnel "until further notice, you are not to report to the plant."

Two days of mediation meetings were held this week when union members objected to the strike-bound pilot's plans to ship out goods. On Wednesday, the workers kept a loaded truck from leaving the plant. Yesterday they kept most superstores and office employees out.

"After yesterday's mediation session," it was announced that both sides had agreed that the union would provide workers necessary for maintenance of the plant.

About 4,500 union workers are employed by the Rubber Company here. Members of the rubber workers' union have been on strike at 18 of the firm's plants since April 10.

Struck Firm Says Shipments to Stop
Nauauguck, May 1.—The management at U.S. Rubber Company's footwear plant here will stop trying to get finished goods through a picket line.

Take along a currency guide to help you figure how much of a foreign currency is equal to your dollar and to help guide you when you plan to see Europe by car. Figure it will cost around \$50 to rent a car. This for trips of longer than four weeks. Buying and reselling the car can be a cheaper. Either deal can be arranged in the U.S.

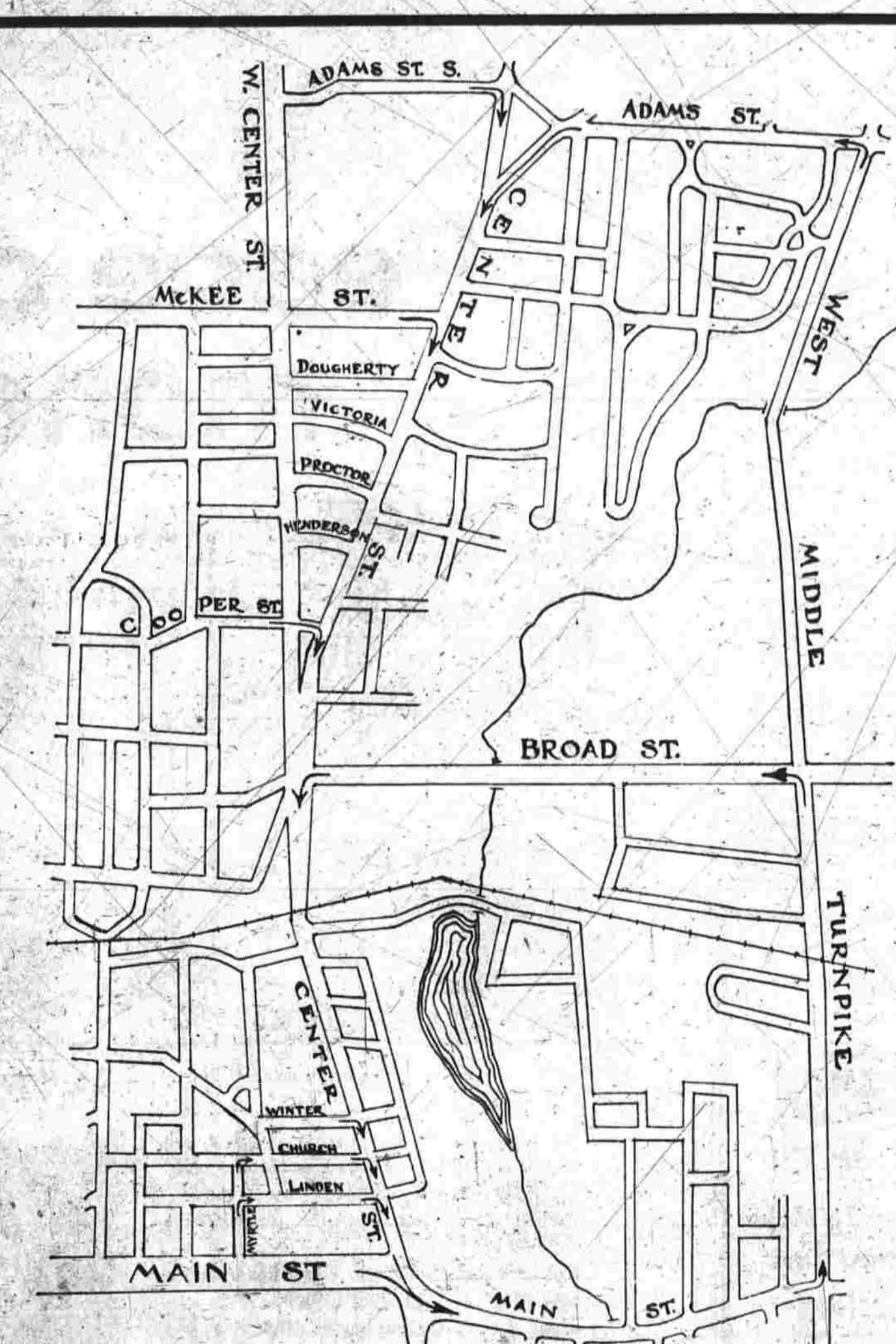

On Thursday, bills will be reported on the one-year certificate issue to be offered in exchange for \$1.5 billion of 2 1/2 per cent tax anticipation bills. These will be dated May 11 and will mature June 22.

In terms of the one-year certificate issue, the offer is expected to be made on Thursday. Subscriptions for the bills will be open May 11 and 12. The securities will be dated May 13.
