Pardons Board Bars Appeal by Mrs. Annis

The commission petition of Mrs. Annis, 33, of Manchester, serving 12 years for manslaughter in the fatal shooting of her husband, Policeman Roy Annis, Dec. 19, 1933, was rejected yesterday by the State Pardons Board.

John Durk, Hartford, even had the support of Bill Westcott, state attorney general, in his petition for a sentence reduction that would make him eligible for parole.

Terence Moon, an outstanding prisoner, Bill told the parole board "if anybody in this prison should be given consideration, it's John Durk."

Moon was sentenced to death for the first degree murder of his wife on a Hartford street July 3, 1942. He claimed she was unfaithful to him. The commission recommended that sentence to life imprisonment.

Yesterday's action commuted Moon's minimum sentence to the already served and unpaid term which is expected to release him on parole shortly.

Another prisoner whose work as a sex pest was described as "outstanding" by his prison superiors also was recommended to the parole board.

He was Donald H. Baker, 38, Hartford, who was serving a 10-13 year manslaughter term for beating a Hartford woman to death in her apartment July 22, 1933. Both intoxicated, they got into a violent argument over a table lamp.

Baker was described as a former school teacher who had been himself completely through Alcoholics Anonymous at the prison. He did not oppose Baker's petition. "He's a pretty nice guy when he's not drinking," said Bill Westcott at the brutal, sadistic thing he did when he was. That's what you're you."

Judson Sentence. The board also reduced the maximum sentence of Altono Fazio, 40, of New London from four to two years. Fazio was released on parole about two months ago and sought the restoration of his citizenship in the U.S. Navy. Fazio was a chief petty officer at the U.S. Submarine Base in Groton when he was given a 1-4 year term for molesting his stepdaughter. A Navy career man for 20 years, he had the best of his Navy would take him back once he is off parole.

(Continued from Page One) The threat there lies in genetic effects of radiation, mainly that of the international unit for measurement of the position, which is the rad, is a very technical term.

But the distribution of effects is an average estimate only about five or six hundredths of a roentgen in such fields up to date.

There is disagreement as to the accuracy of present standards for "safe" dosages.

The National Academy of Sciences has just undertaken another broad study to bring into the 1950s findings in such fields up to date.

AEC Commissioner Willard P. Libby, writing to approval of the advisory project expressed AEC belief that "the general concern over the effects of radiation is a matter of serious import."

Another issue before the congressional group lies in complaints from the public on the extent of the fallout from atomic tests.

Of particular concern also will be findings that tests in the past year have set off a sharp rise in fallout and that the northern tier of the United States has received the heaviest fallout.

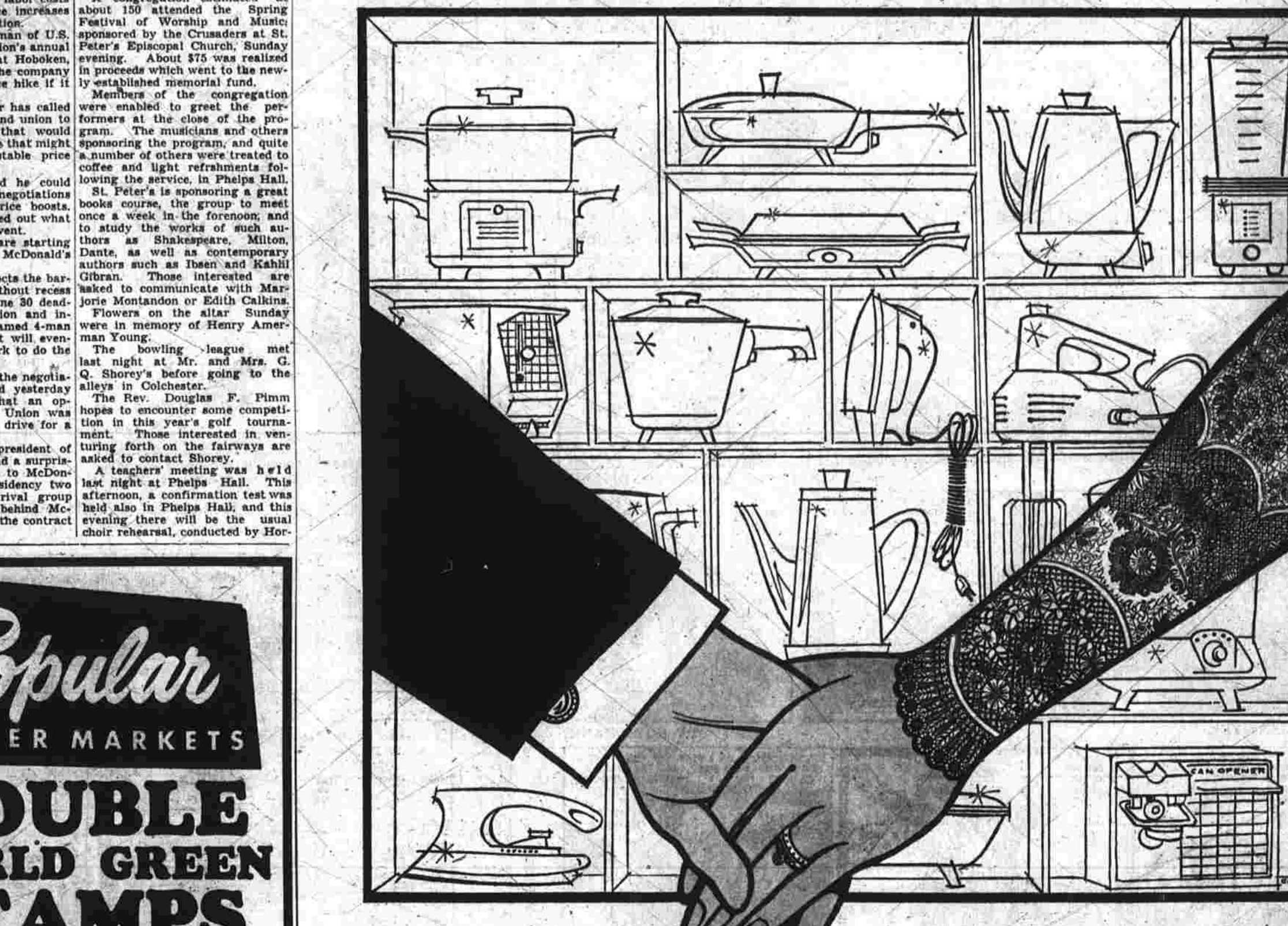

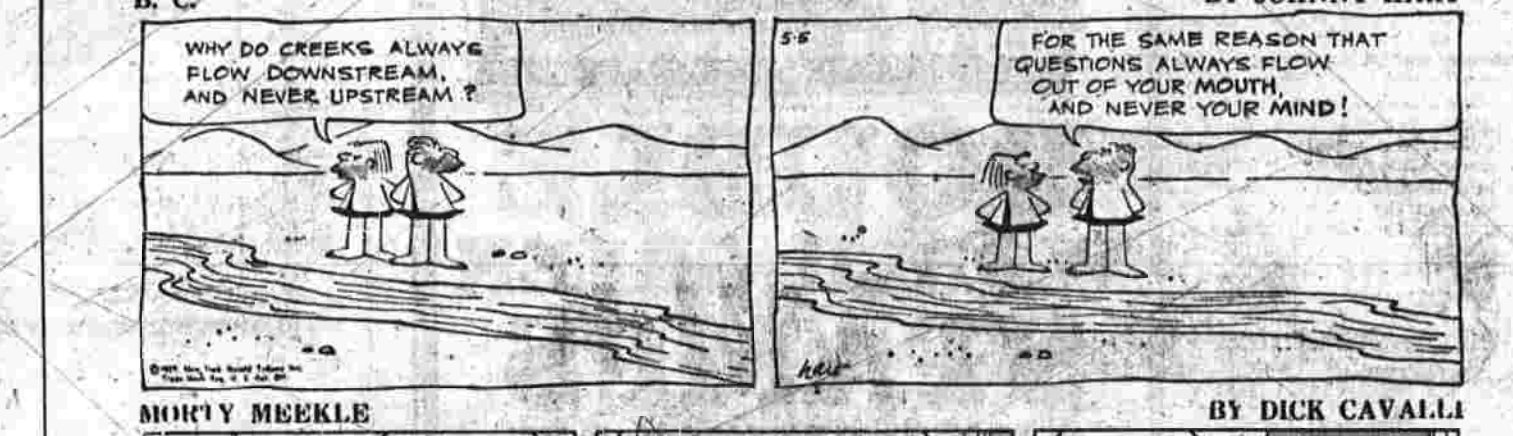
