(Continued from Page One) court since last October, when Justice Harold Burton, also of Ohio, retired. President Eisenhower gave him a recess appointment and formally submitted his nomination on Jan. 17.

For four years before being elevated to the Supreme Court, he had been a judge on the U.S. Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals.

Sens. James O. Eastland (D-Miss.) and Strom Thurmond (D-S.C.) told the Senate that even though they were voting against Stewart's nomination, they expected him to be an improvement over others now on the court.

Eastland, chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee, said he regards Stewart as an able lawyer and a man of integrity. He said, however, it was evident from the committee's hearings that Stewart endorses the court's school decision.

Sen. Sam J. Ervin Jr. (D-N.C.) voted as a member of the Judiciary Committee to recommend confirmation.

He told newsmen afterward that the more he had meditated on Stewart's testimony that he was in basic agreement with the school decision, the more he had become convinced that "I should register my disapproval of that statement."

Sen. Richard B. Russell (D-Ga.) protested to the debate on Stewart's nomination that the Justice Department, for political purposes, has set up a screening system to prevent anyone not in full agreement with the school decision from being appointed to the court.

British Divided Over Ethics of Mercy Killings

(Continued from Page One) The law does not enter into the case of Dr. Mitchell, the spokesman said. His patient died of cancer, and that is what the death certificate said.

The chairman of the Euthanasia Society, Dr. Charles McDonald, said most doctors perform mercy killings but don't say so.

"I have done it myself," he said. "It happens when a dying patient's pain is so great that it can only be stopped by a dose of drugs which will shorten life. If a patient who can expect to live in pain for a week is given drugs which will lead to painless death in two days, then that is mercy killing—though I don't like the phrase."

The Roman Catholic Church is firmly opposed to mercy killing. But Canon Michael Gilman, senior Orthodox priest in Leicester, Dr. Mitchell's home town, said there

is no question of advising Catholic patients to have Dr. Mitchell.

"If I were sick and in agony, I would not ask for drugs to relieve the pain," he declared. "And if death occurred, I'm sure no one would criticize the doctor."

The Catholic Medical Guild is going to discuss Mitchell's action. It may lodge a protest to the B.M.A. Dr. L. E. Henderson, master of the guild, said last night: "It is a doctor's duty to relieve suffering, not to end it."

A Methodist leader, Dr. Leslie Weatherhead, was equally blunt: "I think that those who vote against properly safeguarded euthanasia can never be visited regularly, over a long period, a patient suffering from a painful and incurable illness," he wrote in the News Chronicle.

"When mental faculties go, and there is complete loss of control, when the patient is an unresponsive mass of decay in a straining bed, then it seems fatuous to me to talk of the sacredness of human life."

The Daily Express took the opposite view. Its editorial said: "It would be arrogant for anyone, however among the provocateurs, to cut short an innocent human life in the supposed interest of humanity."

Boatwright Subtle, Lyric As Recitalist

By PHILIP TREGGOS

As the final event in the current season of Civic Music Concerts, Melvyn Boatwright, baritone, was presented last night in the high school auditorium.

Mr. Boatwright brought an erudite audience a program which showed for the most part, impeccable taste. It was extremely well balanced and offered an exciting variety ranging from early Italian, through German lied to contemporary song. Many styles were apparent in the choice of operatic comic love and sacred music.

Endowed with a handsome, full voice Mr. Boatwright does not share the fact by running under a full head of steam all evening. He knows how, when and where to let down to lyrics.

First and last he is a recitalist. This means he sings with clarity, color, nuance and imagination. Unlike many others, he is not content to simply display his rich baritone in one long, continuous outpouring. His approach is thoroughly musically, except that he is prone to take the greatest liberties with the rhythmic structure of a song.

Sometimes Overdone

His rendition of Verdi's famous aria "Eri tu" was, in fact, so subtle that if he were to sing it the same way in an opera house, he wouldn't last the week. While his program did not have that dreadful awareness of speed and volume that so many more famous singers offer, there is a danger he must avoid, it is of trying too hard to be subtle. The result is sometimes overdone. His approach to singing is strictly in the borderline between that which is true art and that which is sham. Tuesday, fortunately, his presentations were most a fully done in the first half of his program. However, right after intermission things began to get a little heavy-handed and culminated in the corniest version of Old Man River that I have ever observed. Ironically this was his own arrangement in which he played his own accompaniment on a single bass and he had. He is still young as artists go, and I will be interesting to see what direction his work will take as he matures.

Reginald Boardman provided the piano accompaniment for the program, most capably. The ensemble between pianist and singer was good in spite of Mr. Boatwright's rhythmic eccentricities.

Regional District 8 Next Year's High School Program Set

A new program of studies has been presented to the Regional District 8 Board of Education by principal Charles R. Seybolt. In line with the new budget cuts, the program includes all the courses presently offered as well as new courses in bookkeeping, business law and economics, ancient history, mechanical drawing, music appreciation, and world backgrounds.

The new program, as well as the changes made in the regional budget to conform with the \$15,200,000 plan voted at the April 13 budget meeting, will be discussed by the administration at the monthly meeting Monday night in R.H.A.M. High School auditorium.

Program chairman Mr. and Mrs. George C. Gasser said yesterday that a short business meeting at 8 p.m. will precede the presentation.

The curriculum choices for students entering sixth grade next fall will be presented to parents at two group meetings at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday of next week in the high school. The sixth grade curriculum will be reviewed by Seybolt and guidance director Grover Howard. They will be available to answer questions for conferences with individual parents.

Basic requirements for ninth grade are five periods each of English, world history, general mathematics or algebra I, and general science or biology I. Enrollment in the biology course will be determined by the student's desire, test results and future placement.

In addition, the ninth grader will take two periods of physical education and either one additional course of five periods or a combination of courses equaling five periods a week. He may choose from five period classes of French, Latin, Art, Industrial Arts, Home Economics or chorus. Three periods, and, two periods, are available for students who choose to enter the tenth grade.

Fourth grade students will take two periods of physical education or athletic activities and one additional course totaling 19 periods a week. Electives in tenth grade are: French, Latin,
