Hawaiian Tenor Sings Praises of Teenagers

Young people are most interested in hearing operatic and musical comedy music these days, says Charles K. Davis, tenor of the Hawaiian tenor. The "K" is for Kalamazoo, the "L" for Llewellyn. The Hawaiian, an American-born tenor, emphasizes that these changes indicate they have a greater appreciation for good music.

Charles, a 29-year-old mixture of English, Welsh and Hawaiian, is enjoying his new-found popularity with the younger set. "They usually write for my picture, and those who have seen me on TV and along the coastlines. Many teenagers know my records, but not much about me. They expect to see a young boy, if they haven't seen me in the past."

Charles was born in Honolulu. He is a bachelor. (But he has a girl, he's taken. Plans are in the making for a wedding. He's engaged to a girl who works at the Italian consul's office in New York.)

His hobbies include stamp collecting and old cars. (An old Rolls Royce was sold off long ago by selling it out.) He is a skidder. He mother brought him up in the old-fashioned Hawaiian tradition that the sea is the place to fish for your food. Charles fishes without anguishes, 50 or more to appear fish, and attributes his power, strong voice to health control learned in diving. Most native Hawaiians go spear fishing, and enjoy sports, one reason why there are very little Negroes in Hawaii.

Charles attended the University of Hawaii, and the Juilliard School of Music and was member of the Metropolitan Auditions of the Air last year. He has made a national concert tour with the Bel Canto Trio. He is disappointed that his physician father who is hoping Charles would follow in his footsteps.

"I never could get music out of my mind," he says. "So there was no point in studying medicine." He is an accomplished pianist and organist and sang and played the organ in his neighborhood church. His favorite album is "Easy for Peas." Another is his album of romantic arias, very popular with young and old.

Charles carries this romantic theme out in real life. "I would like to be able to cook," he says, "but I'm not able to give my wife plenty of affection."

step-by-step approach toward eventual reunification, allowing for some possible arms and troop limitations under inspection as part of the plan.

Under this package plan the Berlin problem would be solved within the overall settlement for a unified Germany, not as a separate issue in itself.

Herter arranged to go to a network television studio to make his address.

The Secretary leaves tomorrow afternoon for the Geneva meeting with the foreign ministers of Britain, France and the Soviet Union. The conference may last a month.

sympathy, the NLRB could move fast.

"In such a situation," he said, the NLRB can make a strong injunction to stop an illegal lockout.

Goldberg said it is legal in some situations under the 701 Act for employers jointly to close down when one or more of them are struck.

But he said this applies only where there is a formal bargaining unit certified as such by the NLRB.

He said in steel the union always has sought a multi-employer unit but the industry has refused, so that the formal bargaining unit was only for individual plants.

Goldberg said the present set-up in which the 2000 leading steel companies are bargaining for the industry is an informal one that is legally constituted multi-employer bargaining unit.

As to the industry, he said, he is possible sharer of profits among other struck and unstruck companies in the industry.

Such a mutual aid strike plan was put into effect last fall by six major steel companies. Goldberg saw it as different regarding air lines and other industries.

Goldberg said that even if steel firms are merely discussing such a mutual aid plan and have not even agreed on it, this would amount to conspiracy to violate the anti-trust laws.

John F. Murray, a Pittsburgh official of the union, said the union is eventually going to win the demands even if we have to strike to get them.

Peeling Potatoes Is Becoming Lost Art in American Kitchens

By ELLIE L. JESTER
Boys up—More and more of Idaho's potatoes are going to market in a brightly colored package and cans instead of the brown burlap bags in which they were first marketed.

But more important, for the producer, it means a stabilized market for the product that has had a history of economic ups and downs since the russet potato brought Idaho its fame as a potato-producing state.

One of the leaders in the potato marketing change has been J. R. Simplot of Boise. He has been a public proponent of the change, and he is planning for a good price.

Others have entered the field and plants are producing frozen and dehydrated potato products in Idaho Falls, Burley, Shelley, Blackfoot and Ontario, in Oregon just across the border from Idaho.

The whole program is aimed at stabilizing the potato business. Simplot says, "Now we go into the farming areas ahead of the planting season and make firm contracts with the growers. The farmer knows before he plants the crop that he will be able to sell it."

Department of Agriculture statisticians recognized processing as a factor in disposing of Idaho's potatoes for the first time in 1946. The percentage of the total crop processed has increased steadily since then. The Department of Agriculture statistics show that 26 percent of the 1956 crop, 29 percent of the 1957 crop and 33 percent of the 1958 crop was processed.

Types of potato products turned out continue to increase. The potato chip, of course, was the first. Among the first offered in frozen form were the french fries and hash browns.

Simplot says a prepared quick-frozen mashed potato in bread form now is ready. The mashed potato is put in a baked jacket made of potato flour, sprinkled with cheese or parsley or other dressing and frozen.

"You can't tell it from the fresh product," Simplot says. Idaho and Maine are the leaders in the processing industry, just as they lead in production of fresh potatoes.

Simplot says the change is being made to meet the needs of the housewife. It means the elimination of much of the preparation in serving, for example, an inviting dish of mashed potatoes.
