DELAZED DISCARD IS USEFUL

1.50 Masters Ten Champion

The time to take a discard is when you know what you want to throw. If you don't know, it's better to discard a dummy's ace of spades and you have the chance to discard on dummy's ace of spades.

The trouble is that you have no useful discard at that moment. If you discard a diamond, you will still lose a diamond and a club. If you discard a club, you get nothing at all.

Your best bet is to play a low spade from dummy and ruff in your own hand. Dummy's ace will still be there later, when you know what you want to discard.

The plot is to lead a diamond through the ace and steal a trick. The problem is to determine which opponent has the ace of diamonds. Some opponents never have a side ace when they make a shut-out bid; some do. This is partly a matter of guesswork and partly one of knowing the habits of your opponents.

Suppose you guess correctly, that West has the ace of diamonds. You draw one round of trumps and then lead your low diamond toward dummy.

West cannot defeat you. If he plays a low diamond, you win with dummy's queen. Now you cash the ace of spades in order to discard a club. If he plays a high diamond, you give up a club trick and ruff the last club in dummy.

Teacher Held

New York (AP)—The problem of letting go is very hard.

It is hardest, of course, on the individual who reaches a corporate retirement age and still wants to keep on working—usually for the same corporation.

The main loyalty of his life outside his family has been tied to his job. He often feels he has been better able to adjust to the changing demands of his job than to those at home. Sometimes he is needed less at home when the children are on their own, he feels the need to be bigger at his office. Then, usually at 60, the office doesn't need him any more.

What is done to cushion a faithful employee against the stunning news—stunning to him—that he is no longer a corporate necessity? How do corporations today do more than give him a corporate farewell. The trend, however, is in the other way.

One example is a pre-retirement program established five years ago by Mutual of New York, one of America's largest insurance companies.

They set up a course among their employees on how to stop work—how to let go.

The idea was put into effect by vice president George Wiggins, personnel executive. He felt that although a survey showed two-thirds of major U.S. firms did something to help employees on the edge of retirement, only 10 percent of those didn't cushion the blow enough.

His solution? This:

Lost Boatman Sought in River

Moab, Utah, May 20 (AP)—Veteran river-runners guided a rubber boat through some of the Colorado river's most perilous rapids today, looking for a missing boatman last seen clinging to an overturned cabin cruiser.

But members of Frank A. Rich's family who survived the boat capsized Sunday refused to believe the 85-year-old Californian wasn't safe. His hopes were buoyed yesterday when a helicopter rescued his 65-year-old wife.

Rich of Lakewood Village, Calif., and his family were tossed into the churning rapids of Cataract Canyon, a deep gorge that sometimes cuts hundreds of feet into the granite rock country 40 air miles southwest of here.

His son and daughter-in-law were found Monday.

The elder Mrs. Rich was unburied except for some ashurn and a brush on her right leg.

"I had just about given up... but I never lost faith," she told newspaper Shadwell about 8 or 10 miles upstream after she was washed ashore by a strong wave. She spent a total of 48 hours along the rocky banks of the Colorado before her rescue.

"I just saw my husband hanging onto the back of the boat as it was going down river. He told me not to panic," she said.

Her son, Dr. DuBret Rich of Cedar City, Utah, and his wife, Pamela, 33, expressed confidence their father would be found safe.

"He and my mother are quite the outdoor people," Dr. Rich said. "They haven't had much experience with the river, though. After this, I doubt that they'll ever want to take a bath again."

Airplane spotted wreckage of the boat in the canyon yesterday, but there was no sign of her husband. He has catarracts on both eyes and can barely see without thick glasses. He was wearing a life preserver.

The elder Mrs. Rich, still somewhat exhausted by the experience, didn't even discuss the possibility that her husband might have drowned. And no one had the heart to suggest it to her.

"There isn't any disrespect—it's just injecting the original vitality," Foster has been mundanely

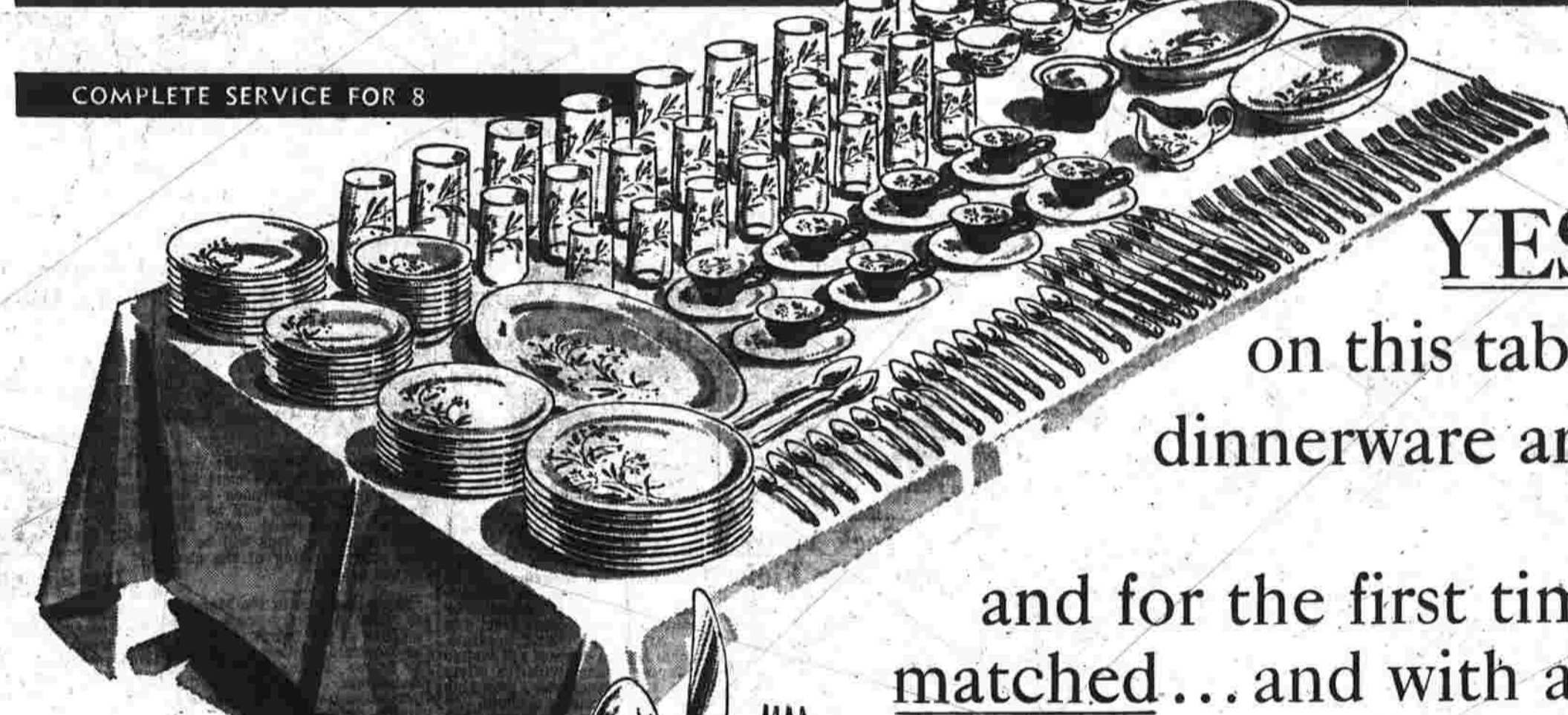
treated, with a lack of flair. But when you read about Jim singing his own songs you discover he has a whole of a hair. People who know Foster, said no one could sing his music as well as he could.

Guernsey, Channel Islands (AP)—Five years ago a little girl picked a wild primrose—a single primrose that has blossomed into an amazing organization called the Love Apple League.

The plan was membership fee. It has no membership card. It has no dues. No executive committee. It's run by children.

And it lives on an unselfish thought: Children shut away in hospitals far from sunny fields should have flowers.

The girl who had the first picking was named Gail. She was playing with another girl named Gillian.

Gail stood holding the primrose, looking about her at Gillian and thousands and thousands of primroses on this flowery island.

"What a wonderful idea," said Gillian.

"A million flowers," said Gillian.

"Wouldn't it children love to see them? I wish we could send just hundreds of them to children lying in hospitals."

"I know it would make them feel better," said Gillian.

"Let's pick them," said Gail. "Hundreds of them."

"There's no going to get them to the children?"

"I don't know," smiled Gail. "Let's start picking."

Laden with armloads of primroses the children staggered home with their fragrant load and showed them to their father.

He listened to their story.

The keynote will be "World-wide Goodwill."

The famed jockey's troubles started when his horse, Vogue, headed at the start. He was suspended and reportedly said: "What do I have to do to get an honest shake around here?"

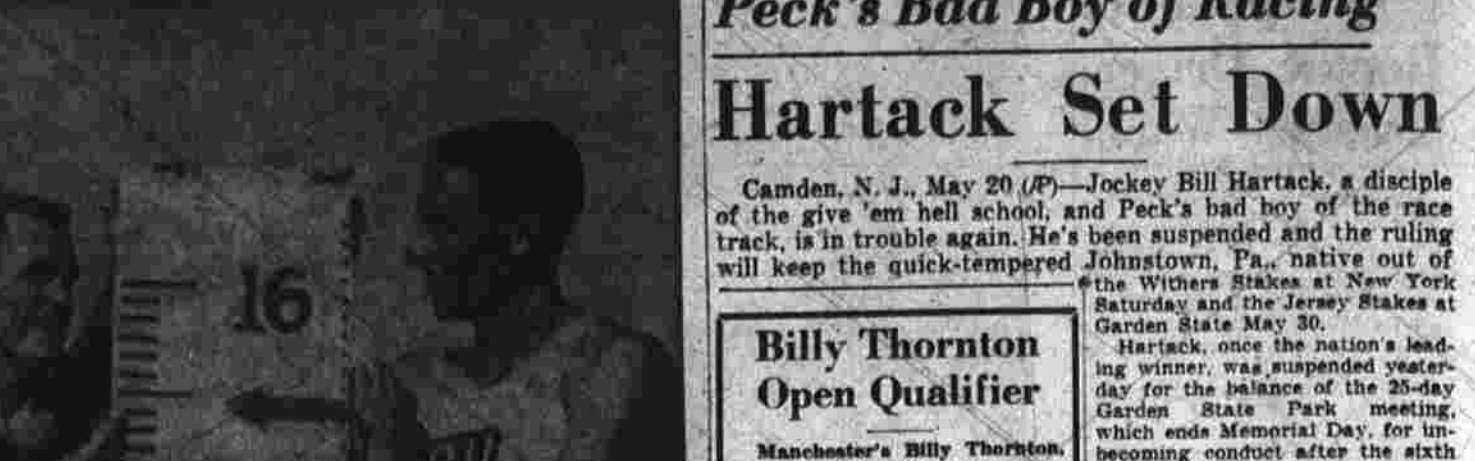

I prefer a short, hitting action in putting.
The backstroke should be straight on the inside of the intended line of the putt with the blade leading toward a somewhat clockwise position.
As the time the putter reaches the end of the backstroke, the action of the hands and arms should be intended to open the face of the putter through impact with the ball. The practice of opening the blade coming in to contact with the ball imparts the desired action to the ball.
If it keeps the right hand from turning over and the putter is not aimed to the left, this helps to minimize misses to the right.
The stroke is all arms, wrists and hands. There is absolutely no body motion.
