**A Thought for Today**

This is a time when graduates in the news and we are reminded to make a special study of this problem too. On this one, Russia says sign the test ban first and study such details later.

There is one essential volunteered information which would apparently help resolve doubt about ability to detect nuclear explosions at great distances. There were two scientists about our conduct. One was that we were bringing up these new problems in order to stop the conference and evade the negotiation of any ban on testing. The other seemed more plausible, since it was openly backed by many figures in Washington. This was that we were trying to bring about the negotiation of a test ban from which nuclear explosions in space and nuclear explosions underground would be exempted. These two varieties of explosion, it was argued, were difficult to detect, and moreover, could be conducted as to be free of fallout.

This prospect, that an international ban would be only partial, and while claiming to free mankind from the poisoning test, would result in a real interruption in the race of the atomic powers to be able to match super-destroyer powers in war, was not very heartening. If the latest American conduct, of seeming to object to the information which helps detect the use of the atomic explosion, represents a change of direction, toward a full test ban again, that is good.

Even when it is severe, our contributing over the nuclear test ban seems unnecessary and futile. We are trying to make rules which would be proof against the absence of good faith, when the truth is that, if we ever have a ban, it will have to depend primarily on good faith after all. But there is nothing wrong with that. Either we have a ban, or we don't. If we have one, only good faith will keep it in effect, no matter how many rules are written. If rules or no rules, somebody who has signed the ban then conducts a nuclear explosion in violation of the ban, that is the end of the ban, and such would be the deterrent intent behind such a violation, probably the end of the world too.

There is only one rule which can be relied upon to obtain complete compliance with a nuclear test ban. That would be the rule of life itself. If the nuclear powers do not become ready to obey that rule, no other rule will have power over them. If they are ready to obey that rule, they will need no other. In the end, the simplest test ban treaty may be as good as the most complicated one, if it is based on the rule of life itself. Our civilization is already full of negative results to fear, which is appreciated as the weapon which will accomplish everything from the defeat of the Russians to the conquest of cancer. The value of fear as the technique for such objectives can be debated. But at least, in such instances, fear does have an objective.

There was, however, no possible objective, no possible imagination gain for anything, in the Weather Bureau's technique for sending us into every summer day with an idea of the discomfort we were to encounter. This was almost the end example of the cult of scare and fear. For it seemed to prize fear for fear's own sake, and for nothing else.

There has obviously been some sensitive popular reaction against the use of fear for no purpose, in this instance of weather statistics. Perhaps, from this, we may go to some powerful resolution against the commercial-purpose employment of fear as a persuader in television advertising, or against the practice of waging cold war from fear with fear. Perhaps, who has taken an experiment with the weather, the one thing everybody does notice and talk about, in make us realize that our life, as humanly lived, has for some years been drifting lower and lower.

But we are not too sure, to tell the truth, that pressing for such weighty conclusions in any sense will be to elaborate this public victory. The D.I. has become the T.H.I., and we thank the Weather Bureau for setting one small thing right in our living. Other days for other eras.

**The Conditional Bill of Sale**

A conditional bill of sale is a contract for the purchase and sale of personal property wherein the seller retains the legal title to the property. The buyer obtains the right to possession and use.

Under our common law, which descended from the old Common Law of England, a buyer of property could not mortgage the property until the property is paid for in full. An individual can possess and use mortgaged property. Because of this, a conditional bill of sale is used. It is a contract by which the seller retains the legal title to the property until the purchase price is paid in full.

The terms of the agreement provide that the buyer cannot sell, lease, or destroy the merchandise while the contract is in existence. Generally he must keep the property insured to its full value until the property is paid for in full. Legal title remains with the seller. Once a conditional bill of sale is signed, there is generally no recourse if anything goes wrong with the property.

One purchasing property should know exactly what he is obtaining before he signs any contract for the purchase of property.

**Thor Destroyed**

Vandenberg Air Force Base, Calif., June 17 (AP)—A Thor missile went astray and had to be exploded in flight yesterday.

The single-stage, intermediate-range, ballistic missile was launched by a British Royal Air Force crew learning to operate Thor bases in England.

An Air Force spokesman said only five of 48 Thor shots have failed since the program began. The British crew recently launched the Thor successfully.

Cause of the malfunction has not been determined.

**In The Pattern**

By all surface logic, the attack on the American plane off North Korea yesterday falls into the perennial Communist pattern of war of nerves against the West.

It is part of the same tactic which sent Gromyko to Geneva as a smiling diplomat who knew how to speak English in friendly fashion, and then abruptly transformed him into the Gromyko of the more familiar form, who suddenly couldn't speak a word of English.

It is part of the same tactic which, at Geneva yesterday, when this same Gromyko paid a surprise visit to Secretary of State Herter, spread rumors that he was carrying a friendly conversation, when, afterwards, the disappointing reality proved to be that his visit was completely meaningless, except that it served as a device for first raising and then dashing Western hopes.

Similarly, into an international atmosphere supposed to have entered an era of relaxation of tensions we had the introduction, yesterday, of another of the long series of air incidents in which American planes approaching Communist boundaries have either been shot at or shot down.

The case against the Communists may not ever become more complete than that. Our plane was 48 miles off the coast of Communist North Korea, 700 miles from its own base in Japan. Whether this was routine, or a kind of "test flight" the Communists have not previously molested, or whether it was another of those instances in which we, for our part, occasionally test Communist reactions, we are not likely to know.

But, whatever the doubts or reservations may be a legitimate appraisal of this particular incident, it still fits rather perfectly into the Communist pattern of operation, which is one of whipping us from hope to fear, of keeping us guessing, or trying to fray our nerves, in an annual denial of all the values and principles and modes of conduct it still remains our own duty to demonstrate and defend. The high mandate to us in all of this is that we must, sooner or later, stop living in perpetual reaction to Communist strategies, and mount our own more decent, honorable and consistent initiative in the world. If we really know our own goals, and were visibly, persistently heading toward them, we would not be sitting ducks for the Communist technique of thaw and freeze, smile and threat, hope and shock.

**Test Ban Progress**

It happened, by "sheer coincidence," that the same day the Russians agreed at Geneva, to have Russian, British and American scientists join in a special study of the possible techniques for monitoring nuclear explosions in the outer atmosphere or in space, also brought, in Washington, the release of a study by the Atomic Energy Commission and the Defense Department showing that two hydrogen bombs exploded high over the Pacific last summer created widespread communications havoc, fogged radar, and blinded rabbits more than 300 miles away.

At Geneva, where the three atomic powers are negotiating a treaty for cessation of nuclear testing, the United States has been interposing arguments that important things have happened since the three power scientific experts first pronounced the monitoring and detection of atomic tests feasible. One of the things the United States inferred would make monitoring more difficult was its own feat of conducting nuclear explosions in space. Now the Russians have agreed to have a special scientific study made of this problem.

On the same day, we ourselves release information which would indicate that no very special problem is involved, after all.

We have also been conducting, at Washington and at Geneva, that underground tests presented a problem more difficult than the international scientists first esti-
