Geneva, June 20 (A)-The Big Four foreign ministers today recessed their conference until July 13 without breaking the East-West deadlock on Berlin. Western officials forecast a new Soviet drive for the

summit following the failure of the talks. They said Soviet Premier Khrushchev is trying to frighten the western powers into a summit conference instead of offering concessions on Berlin as a lure to the West.

U.S. Secretary of State Christian A. Herter and other western diplomats are reported to have decided two weeks ago that this was Khrushchev's strategy. Western interest n breaking off the negotiations here dates from that time. The West came to Geneva believing it held one trump card -Khrushchev's desire for a summit meeting.

In Herter's view, the foreigne-ministers' conference took a bad turn about two weeks ago when Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei A. Ribicoff Urgeo Gromyko proposed a one-vear time limit on western occupation of West Berlin. The West denounced To Return, Aid this as a Boviet ultimatum.
