Leading-Toward 'Midnight'

The process of knitting reality into the prospect of nuclear war upon mankind, and the attendant acceptance of that prospect, has gone forward measurably with the official recommendation of the Governor Rockefeller himself, of his Task Force on Protection from Radioactive Fallout.
This group of experts has decided, in its survey, that millions of lives could be saved, in nuclear war by certain advance manufacturing techniques that it is our sacred duty to guarantee ourselves as much chance of survival as we can. And its crucial recommendation, which Governor Rockefeller intends to ask the legislature to follow, is for the passage of a new law which would require the provision of shelter compartments in all new construction in the state, and also the provision of shelters of such shelter within all existing homes.
It calculates that some people might make do-it-yourself shelters for a cost of only \$150. For a new home, however, the built-in-shelter would cost from \$500 to \$1,000.
The Governor's fall-out Task Force would also see to it that each shelter had its survival kit including water, food, radio, and other supplies sufficient for survival for a period of two weeks after a nuclear attack.
Governor Rockefeller's commission holds that all this "will provide abundant notice of our purpose to achieve peace by assuring survival for our people and for the free democratic institutions we cherish."
Apart from such a high purpose, however, the commission also puts its case this way: "We believe the need for fall-out protection is so clear that no father, no property owner, no landlord, no employer, no state administration should any longer permit their children, their families, their tenants, their employees or the people for whom they are responsible to live and work without the assurance of adequate fall-out protection."
There, we think, is the strong case, formulated by intelligent, practical men for dealing with the real possibilities of our time. Perhaps, by sponsoring this study and by launching the program it recommends, Governor Rockefeller may win immortality by becoming the father of survival in the atomic age. Perhaps he should be cheered, for being willing to devote his budding political prestige to the perhaps presently unpopular task of trying to raise us from our lethargy.
Yet, although we cannot fault this, although we dare not criticize that which may mean the difference between life and death for millions, there is something else we cannot escape. It is the feeling that, by such a dignifying of the possibility of atomic war, we bring that war itself that much closer.
Do we think that the way to deal with the threat of atomic war is to ignore it? Perhaps so, although not in the style of the ostrich. Rather, we should say, it should be ignored by a choice of better things to build than shelters, by a choice of finer things to plan. If we are to go down, say we, let us be caught doing something human and decent and dignified, for our part, not burrowing.

We can challenge all the opponents of the "coffee-break" who are.

In the event the buyer does not meet his payments on a conditional bill of sale, he should attempt to sell the car, after advance the finance company since it is still legally their car. If he does not sell the car, he does not release the buyer from financial responsibility. If the buyer cannot sell his car and returns it to the finance company, the company should give him credit for unrepaid finance charges, or interest and insurance charges.

As you can see, buying a car, whether new or used, is a complicated procedure. You should employ a qualified agent who can give you the assurance that you know exactly what is involved.

In substance, Eisenhower thus has said to himself, in the words of the President, that he would not have any other nations involved in a war which would require the expenditure of billions of dollars in aid to them. Eisenhower also stated broadly today he might call a special session of Congress if he is denied the security of the nation and its interests.

Eisenhower was asked for comment on the Senate's action yesterday in voting to cut his mutual assistance request 25.5% in the amount of \$2.8 billion.

The president said he is going to use all his persuasive power to attempt to convince members of Congress that he will be ignoring the vital interests of the free world if they reduce foreign aid too sharply.

In many instances, Eisenhower said it is possible to get sufficient appropriations later if Congress fails to act in time. He said he would like to see appropriations made in the form of a bill which can be passed in one of the last sessions of the year.

Eisenhower said he is confident that the Senate will act in a way which will be in the best interest of the people of the United States and the people of the world.
