Herter Tells Reds U.S. Hopes to Pave Summit Talk Way

Geneva, July 13 (AP)—U.S. Secretary of State Christian A. Herter told the Soviet Union today the United States hopes for sufficient progress in working out an East-West agreement in the Big Four summit conference here to warrant a summit conference. At the same time, Herter challenged Russia's Andrei A. Gromyko to provide specific assurances for the protection of Western rights in West Berlin during a Soviet-proposed moratorium in the Berlin crisis.

Reds Send Two Dogs Into Space

London, July 13 (AP)—The Soviet Union rocketed two dogs into Space July 10 and brought them back to earth, Moscow Radio said today. The broadcast said the dogs were carried aloft in a ballistic rocket weighing 2,200 kilograms (4,845 pounds). Quoting an official Tass dispatch, the radio said a quantity of equipment was also parachuted back to earth. The first announcement gave no details of the height attained by the rocket.

The union promised to make "an all-American try" at negotiating a strike-saving settlement. R. Conrad Cooper, chief industry negotiator, said he would water off settlement prospects and showed irritation in posing with union President David J. McDonald for photographers. Cooper said there was only one possible way a strike could be avoided for the union to again extend its contract.

Butler Sees Catholic Hurt as Candidate

Washington, July 13 (AP)—Paul M. Butler, the Democratic national chairman, said today he regretted fully that being a Catholic would hamper the chances of a presidential candidate. Sen. Thurston B. Morton (R-Ky.), GOP chairman, agreed that might be so but added he is "hopeful it wouldn't be." Both Butler and Morton, answering questions on a television show (NBC—today), shied away from predicting their parties' 1960 presidential nominees.

Revolt Fails To Oust Head Of Honduras

Tegucigalpa, Honduras, July 13 (AP)—President Ramon Villeda Morales put down a revolt of right wing forces in this Honduran capital Sunday after a 15-hour fight in which 100 were killed. A government statement today said "many" were wounded and 600 rebels captured. The rebels, made up of members of the National Police led by Col. Armando Velasquez Cerrato, former chief of the army general staff, who led an unsuccessful revolt in May, gave up at 11 p.m. last night after attacks on them by army troops aided by armed students and civilians.

Plane Crash Kills 5, Sets Forest Ablaze

Ignacio, Colo., July 13 (AP)—A plane crashing high in the mountains of southwestern Colorado carried five persons to their deaths yesterday and ignited a forest fire. The victims included the head of a Chicago radio firm, an Iowa woman and her three children. The fire burned across about 100 acres of timber before it was reported controlled today. Between 70 and 80 firefighters were on the lines last night. Fresh crews relieved them this morning. The fire is contained unless new winds spring up.

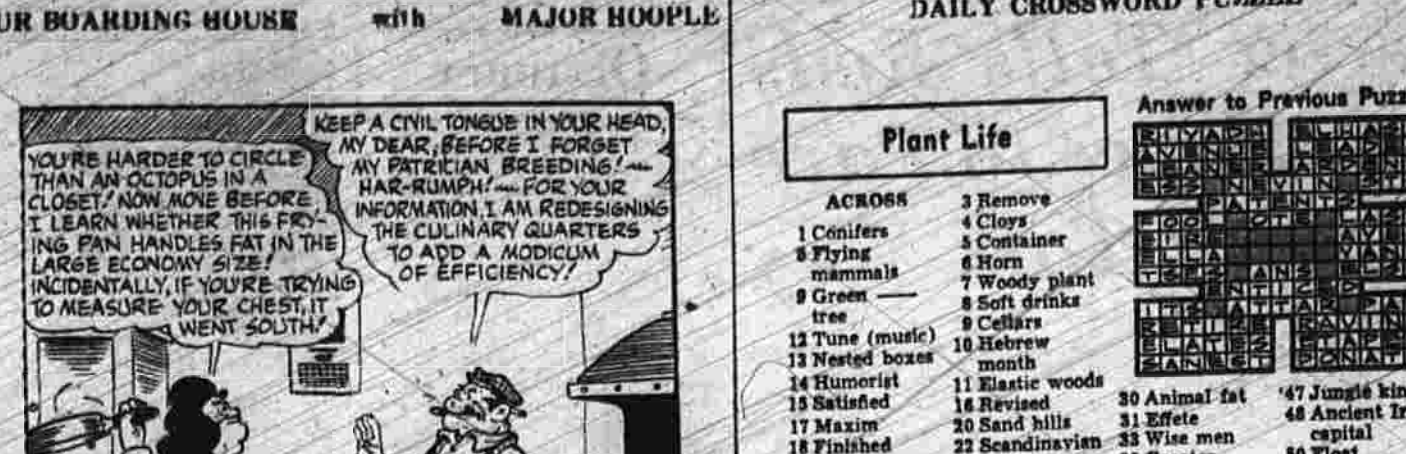

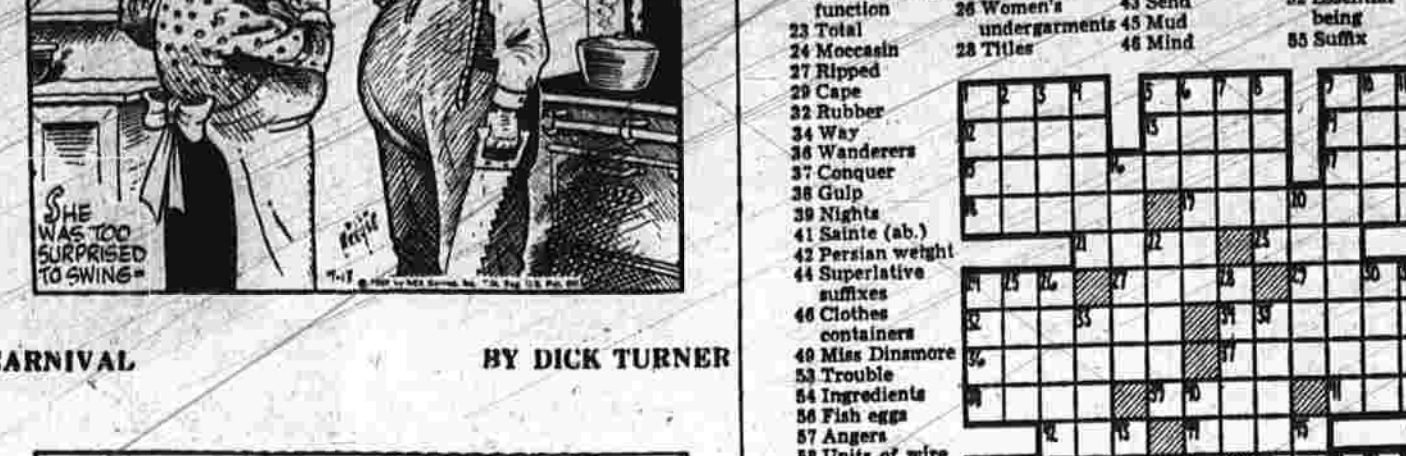

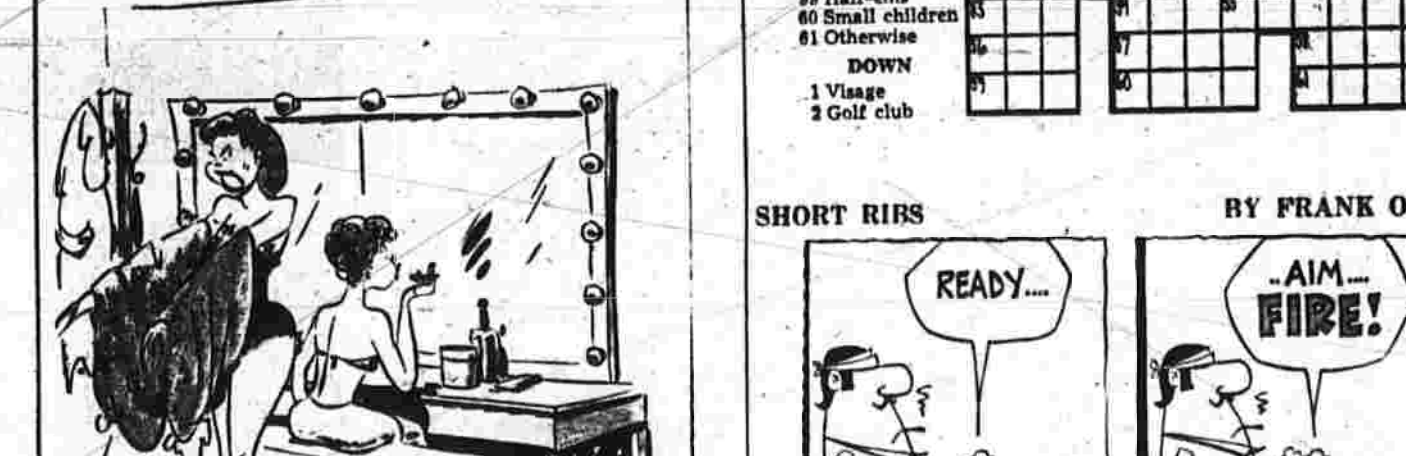
