# You Should Know . . .

Francis J. Conti

Francis J. Conti, Manchester's plumbing and heating inspector, has been with the best of them, but there was at least one time in his life when he was feeling a most discreet silence.

It happened one night during World War II when the German artillerists began shelling that particular section of the Lorraine which Conti—staff sergeant Conti then—happened to be occupying. As he ran for the nearest hole, he collided with another figure also heading for the same shelter.

Go find your own blankety-blank hole. Conti was told to be uncertain terms.

Thinking black thoughts but must too busy to take time out for a proper report, Conti should have been with the other and ducked down. Then, as the ditch subsided, he happened to catch a glimpse of a pearl-handled revolver on the hip of the soldier with him.

Suddenly Conti decided it was time to start an argument and over a hole in the ground and that a strategic withdrawal seemed in order.

Conti now has the distinction of being the only one who has ever disregarded a "request" from a superior. He was told to get away with it.

Conti was in a battle during his more than three years' service with the Third Army.

During that time he helped build bridges and engaged other combat engineering chores many of them under fire. One of the ways across Europe was the English, France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Germany, Austria, Czechoslovakia. He is particularly proud of the 150-foot unsupported bridge which his unit built over the Moselle. It was a task which other engineers said "couldn't be done."

When the war ended in Europe, the 150th was immediately transferred to Luzon in the Philippines to aid in the all-out effort to crush Japan.

Although most Japanese resistance had been mopped up, Conti said occasionally the remaining enemy soldiers showed some tenacious and emphasized this fighting spirit and other ways. One later Conti served with the occupation troops in Japan.

After being involved in the business of "construction and destruction" for so long during the war, Conti turned his hands to a humanitarian job and for 11 months was an orientation attendant at the convalescent hospital for blinded servicemen which the War Department operated in Aven.

His experiences at the hospital in aiding the blinded veterans and their families led to the calamity which had befallen them Conti describes as "heart rending."

Conti took over his duties here as plumbing and heating inspector in December 1956. For the four previous years he had been employed in similar work at Pratt and Whitney Aircraft.

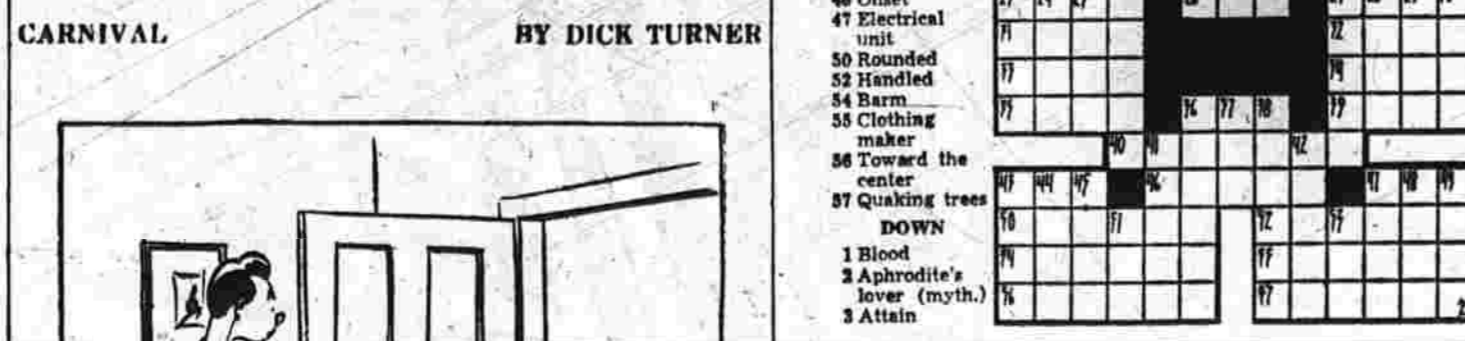

**Rockville-Vernon Voters to Act Tonight On Consolidation Unit**

This community will take its first major step toward consolidation tonight when a Consolidation and Charter Commission is expected to hold a town meeting.

The meeting is scheduled for 8 p.m. in the Rockville-Vernon High School auditorium, where a large crowd is expected to attend.

There are several other items of lesser importance on the agenda, but the appointment of the Charter Commission is expected to draw the greatest number of persons. If the persons proposed by the Citizens Committee for Better Government are contacted by anyone, the voting may get complicated.

The 12-member commission must conform to residential and political requirements, and only one-third may be public office holders. Half must live in the Vernon District and half in the City of Rockville. No more than a bare majority may be from any one political party.

The CCBG, sponsors of the legislative act under which the Commission is being named, has prepared a slate of nominees who fit these requirements, and whom they believe to be qualified.

The selections had planned to prepare a slate to facilitate the appointment at the town meeting, but decided it wasn't necessary when the CCBG prepared a slate.

The Commission is to draw up a charter combining the governments of Rockville, Vernon and the Vernon Fire District into one. The form of government is to be to the discretion of the Commission. The charter which will be prepared will be voted upon in a machine vote in Rockville and in the Fire District. A majority of the two voting areas must approve the charter to affect consolidation.

The Commission will have to find suitable ways of taxation, of eventually extending services to rural Vernon without charging city residents, and of assessment, and of numerous other matters of great concern to the voters.

Also at tonight's town meeting voters will be asked to request the court reform system to be held in Vernon.

Voters will be asked to adopt the provisions of a state statute which requires 50 signatures on a petition for a special election regarding the state aid for town roads.

Four roads in the Echo Mountain development will be up for acceptance, and the Selections seek the usual authority to enter into an agreement with the State regarding state aid for town roads.

system rules in respect to employees... who have abandoned their jobs... without leave."

Walt Letts, the strikers' spokesman, said that the strikers would be deemed to have resigned under the new rules back at work at 8 a.m. Thursday. Negotiations from last Saturday after the city offered \$145.50 to those employees who had not received a raise this year. But the 78 members of Local 14184, United Mine Workers, turned down that offer as they did earlier ones.

The employees walked off their jobs on July 15 per a 10 a.m. across-the-board pay increase over the previous wages, which range between \$14.41 and \$23.25 an hour.

At the start of the strike Norwich had just begun a week long celebration of the 100th birthday. The employees, who did not interfere with most of the festivities, complained the city had enough money for 7-days of celebrating but not enough for their pay request.

The full brunt of the strike was not felt until the celebration ended. The streets were left with dirt and the city dump was beginning to overflow with refuse brought there by residents, who were using their own cars for transportation.

The walkout has left the streets to be cleaned by residents and store owners. When the city dump was called a health menace Friday by the city health officer, the council rejected the striking employees offer to clean it up and hired supervisory workers.

Last night the council voted first to give Walter power to use the merit system, then they voted again on a request by Walter Pochrowski, union field representative, to cause negotiations with a state mediator. They turned that down 8 to 1.

Four clergymen, representing Jewish, Catholic, Methodist and Congregational churches, asked the council last week to meet the employees request for arbitration. The clergymen wrote strongly worded letters backing the workers.
