Senate Votes Change In Equal Time Rule

Washington, July 28 (AP)—The Senate today voted to change the equal time rule governing broadcast candidates. The measure now goes to the House, where it will be held until the House passes its own version.

Before passing the bill, the Senate accepted an amendment that requires a candidate to appear on a broadcast station only if that station is required to give equal time to all candidates for public office.

Until this year the requirement had been applied only to campaign advertising and political speeches, whether paid for or free. A ruling by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) extended it to other types of programs, although not

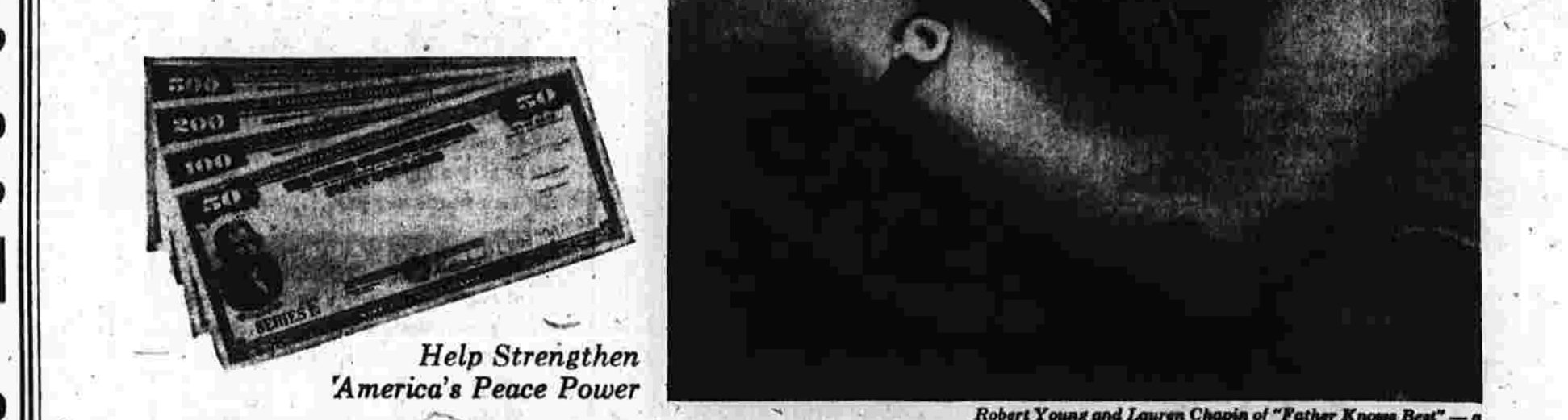

Embarrassing News
 We have a bit of fact-finding in the steel situation today. It is joyous news the industry would just as soon not celebrate in the middle of a strike. It is the news that United States Steel made a net profit of \$254,948,496 in the first half of this year, and profits amounting to a little over 10 cents on each dollar of sales.

This is an all-time high, and the union is going to pounce on it as proof that the industry can afford to negotiate a wage increase contract. As for the industry, it is plunged on the defensive, arguing forcefully, but not too conclusively, against the implications involved. The industry cites one consideration which does shade the significance of this record profit. It is that sales did not improve normal in these six months because people were storing up steel against the possibility of a strike which is now in progress.

But the industry itself knows this is not the whole answer, and reaches for additional arguments in the effort to escape this embarrassment of riches.

This strike, says Roger M. Blough, chairman of the board of United States Steel, is not merely one over wages. It is a test of whether the steel industry, as an industry in present-day America, can successfully resist the enormous power that has enabled our modern labor unions to exact frequency with the aid of government—inflationary wage increases from one industry after another round after round—throughout these 14 years.

Furthermore, says Blough, in this crusade against the power of the unions and inflation, it is not important whether or not the steel industry itself happens to be capable of granting a wage increase which would not be inflationary with specific regard to the cost of steel itself.

"The fact is, of course," says Blough, "that whether steel prices rise or not, inflationary wage increases in construction, motors, steel, oil, or other major industries ripple out over the entire economy as other unions strive to 'catch up' to the new high level, and as these rising employment costs spread, they force higher costs and higher prices everywhere, for employment costs—direct and indirect—represent more than three-fourths of all production costs in American industry."

That is a point, but a retreat from and substitute for a point the industry itself was still trying to make before this report came out—the point that the steel industry itself could not afford a wage increase which would not be inflationary with respect to the cost of steel itself. It is close to an admission that, so far as steel itself is concerned, a wage increase could be granted without an increase in the cost of steel. This will not weaken the union's case, or keep the Eisenhower administration from strengthening its own belief that a wage increase is possible, and it is another evidence that the industry feels itself fighting a rearguard action, in the wake of its own good profit news, that Board Chairman Blough now openly warns government to stay out of the picture, and threatens a really inflationary rise in steel prices if government does enter it.

The previous tentative verdict, in the government and public mind, is that the industry can afford some wage increases without an increase in prices, and that the sooner settlement comes the more reasonable it will be, has now been reinforced, by the fact-finding conducted in the industry's own first half reports.

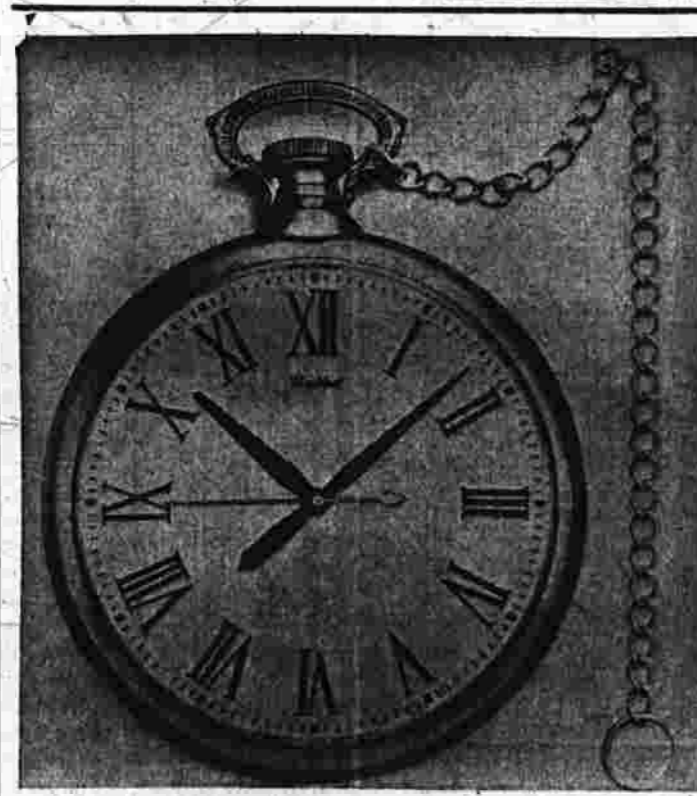

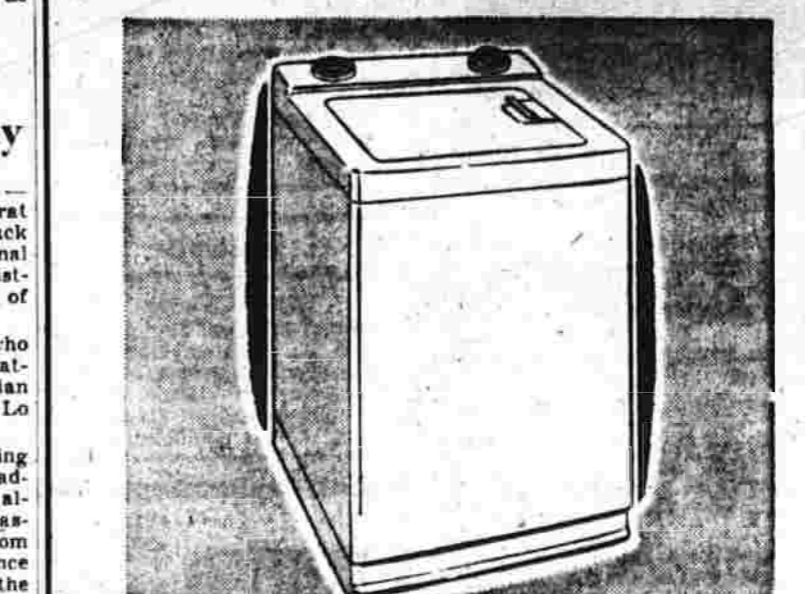

Nixon Trip May Affect His Chances in 1960

(AP News Analyst)

Washington, July 28 (AP)—Two obvious questions have hovered over Vice President Richard Nixon's journey ever since he decided to go to Russia: How will he do? And what will this mean for him politically?

The answers to both will probably be less than sensational unless something unusual happens, for good or bad. It hasn't happened yet—so far as he is concerned—and there is no reason to believe it will for the rest of his Russian stay.

He has shaken hands with the Russians, conferred with Premier Nikita Khrushchev, kept himself in the headlines by the very nature of his trip, and expressed American goodwill.

That's the most he was supposed to do, since his mission was billed as a goodwill trip. If he had made any gains with Khrushchev—and not even with him indicate he has—this would have been extra.

He could upset the applecart internationally and personally—when after leaving Russia, he stops off a couple of days in Poland. The people there have tried to tear themselves loose a bit from the Russian communist grip.

Since there are many people of Polish descent in the United States, it is possible that Nixon, carried away with a desire to please Poles and others, may say something anti-Russian that will hurt his good achievement on his Soviet trip.

That's unlikely for a couple of reasons. He's representing President Eisenhower and the American government and therefore is conscious of his responsibility for causing no damage. Besides, he's not the emotional type.

Nixon, a prime candidate for the Republican presidential nomination in 1960, is a shrewd politician who has had his eye on the main chance from the start.

Otherwise, he wouldn't be where he is at.

But he's under a handicap on this trip. As vice president, he's limited in what he can do. For instance, he isn't in a position to make deals by himself. This in itself limits the amount of prestige he can get from his trip.

From the beginning his job has been to handle himself well, avoid incidents or statements which might injure him or the United States, try if possible to make some headway with Khrushchev, and make it possible for this country as best he can.

That doesn't call for sensational success.

So, unless the unusual occurs, the memory of his Russian visit will probably grow dimmer in voters' minds as time passes. And the Republican presidential nominating convention and the 1960 elections are a year or more away.

It can hardly be expected that the disastrous tour of Latin America will be much of a factor in his getting, or not getting, the nomination. Yet, he returned from that journey to an America highly sympathetic for what he had endured.

The anti-American ordeal inflicted on him was not because he was Nixon but because he was American.

No one is suggesting now, a year later, that his Latin American experience will have any weight in 1960.

By the same token—the distance between now and 1960—there's no reason to think his Russian trip

Socialistic Party Sweeps Jamaica

Kingston, Jamaica, July 28 (AP)—Premier Norman Manley swept back into power today with a big majority in parliament to carry on Jamaica's Socialistic government for another five years.

With only a few votes to be counted, unofficial returns indicated Manley's People's National Party would have 28 of the 43 seats in the new House of Representatives. He thanked his supporters in a radio broadcast for a "glorious victory."

The Conservative labor party led by his cousin Sir Alexander Bustamante, appeared to have clinched 16 seats. One Independent was elected.

Voting was brisk and comparatively orderly after sporadic campaign violence in which one man was killed.

Only isolated clashes flared yesterday with riotous police patrolling around polling places in the capital. One labor candidate in King's College was beaten and pulled with manacles on his way to vote. Several men were arrested for throwing stones.

Manley, 65, an Oxford-educated lawyer, led the people's National party to power in 1955 after 11 years of rule by the Conservatives. Bustamante, a former soldier, politician, journalist and trade union leader, was knighted by Queen Elizabeth II the year his party lost.

Yesterday's election was the first since Jamaica gained internal self-government two years ago from the British, who have ruled the island for 303 years and still retain control over foreign affairs.

Bay State Man Guilty in Deaths

Eastford, July 27 (AP)—A 21-year-old Fairhaven, Mass. man has been convicted of negligent homicide in an automobile accident that took the lives of four of his companions.

James A. Gibbons was sentenced yesterday by Trial Justice Alexander Fabian to 15 days in jail. He was fined \$200.

Connecticut state trooper Merrill Johnson told the court Gibbons appeared to have been drinking the night of the accident, Aug. 21, 1958. Johnson said Gibbons died at the wheel before his car crashed on Route 44.

When the car burst into flames the four young passengers in the back seat were trapped. They were Elaine Perchbette, 15, John Scott, 21, both of New Bedford, and John Andrade Jr., 28, and Daniel Gomes, 18, both of East Fairhaven, Mass.

The three others were injured.

Tests Underway On Sending Logs To Mills by Pipe

Montréal—Experiments are going on in a laboratory in a Montreal suburb to see whether it is feasible and economical to supply a sawmill with wood directly from the forest by sending it 50 to 100 miles through a pipeline instead of cutting logs to piles and rivers and floating them to saw mills.

In the tests an 8-inch-diameter aluminum pipe is being used. Thousands of gallons of water containing tons of pulpwood chips travel through the pipe at 4 to 10 feet a second while scientists watch, measure, and analyze.

Women Fire Spotters Called 'Very Reliable'

Albany, N. Y. (AP) — "When there is a bad fire, it seems to still be the middle-aged women who stop sugar fill in Schuylmer County northwest of Elmira, N. Y., Mrs. Emma Dewitt watches the forest fires as do three other women in other parts of New York State.

The four, among New York's 200 fire spotters, have been keeping vigil for a total of 35 years.

The veteran is Mrs. Helen Elliott, 45, who has watched near Troy for 12 years.

Mrs. Lewis Bost, 53, has watched west of Syracuse for 10 years; Mrs. Lewis Bost, 53, has watched west of Albany for nine years, and Mrs. Dewitt for four years.

"They are real experts at scanning the horizons for fire," says Bobbin J. Hyde, head of the New York State Conservation Department's Bureau of Forest Fire Control. "They are very reliable."

When the trees are green, the grass high and the danger low, the women occupy themselves with planting trees, reading, dusting screens, cutting brush, mending the family clothing, painting, watching creatures of the forest or tending the recreation area at the state's best built at many locations.

Mrs. Anderson has spent up to 18 consecutive days on the job in or beside her 30 foot, low and telephone calls.

"No one relieves me," she says.

Preservers of Food Destroyers of Life

"One death a year in a discarded food, or refrigerator, is too many."

With that thought in mind, the National Safety Council warns against discarding cabinets — preservers of food when in the kitchen, but so often destroyers of young lives when put on the back porch, in the back yard or on junk heaps.

The suffocation of children in discarded refrigerators and ice boxes, though declining because of the public's increased awareness of the problem, is an especially needless form of accidental death, the council said.

Deaths in discarded cabinets came 18 times in 1955, 21 the following year and 14 in 1957, latest year for which figures are available.

Nearly 80 million refrigerators, iceboxes, freezers and chest-type cabinets are in use today, according to the council. And they're being carried to junk piles — or worse yet, kept in the basement as an extra cabinet, or left in the back yard — at a rate of about a million a year.

Critical period is May through September. That's when most victims lose their lives in discarded cabinets.

"Typical of the tragedies was the recent suffocation of two Indiana brothers 5 and 3 years of age. They crawled into a refrigerator and pulled the door shut, locking themselves inside. The cabinet's insulation probably muffled the boys' cries for help, authorities said.

"How can such mishaps be avoided?"

1. Teach children to stay away from discarded cabinets.
2. Remove the door if you discard a cabinet.
3. Remove latch stops so the doors can't lock. This can be done, usually, by removing a few screws.
4. Drill holes in the cabinet and remove the rubber gasket around the door.

"Better yet," the council said, "destroy the cabinet."

Most states have legislation prohibiting them from discarding or storing the death-dealing devices where they can become confined for children, the council pointed out.
