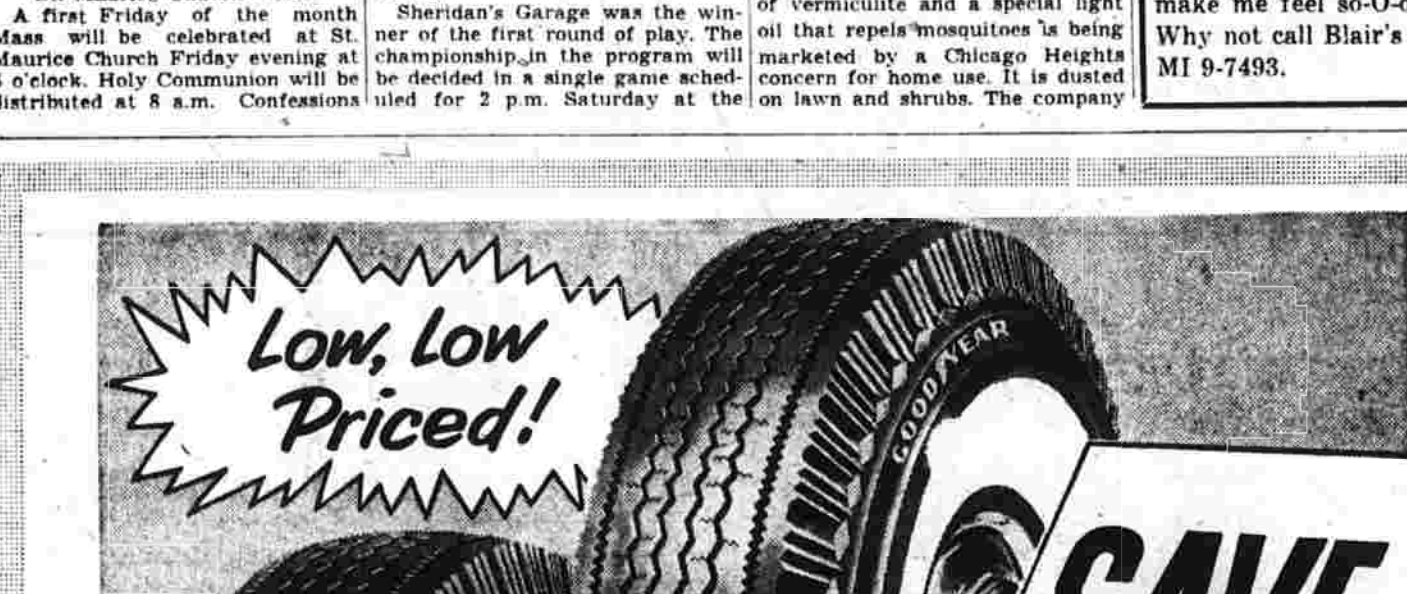
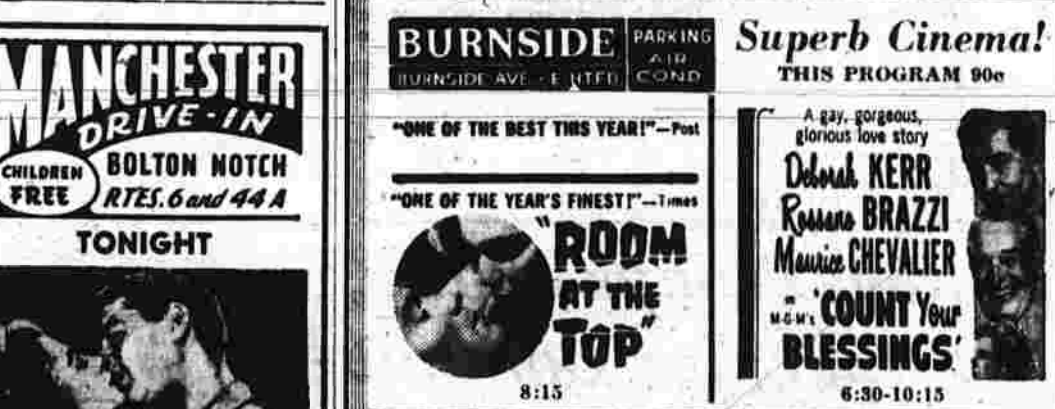
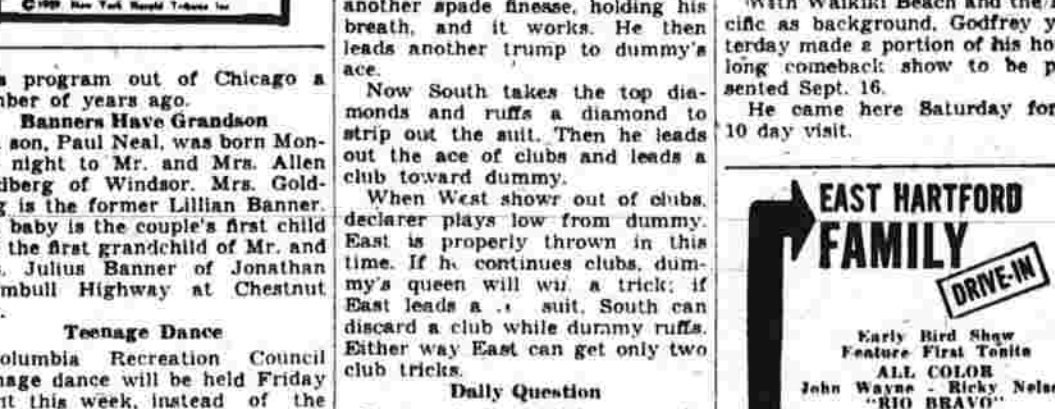

Rockville Flaherty Files Petition Forcing Primary Vote

Claiming its candidates if none are elected in the Democratic primary, a disident faction in the Vermont Democratic party went forward today with plans to force a primary election Aug. 24.

In a statement released this morning by Atty. Gen. B. Flaherty, the minority group says its three candidates will speak out on issues pertinent to their respective positions, such as welfare services to the town, consolidation of the town, consolidation of the need to build on good roads and good drainage facilities in new developments, educational needs and education costs.

"The Democratic Party can win and provide real service to the community if we nominate the best candidates," the statement concluded. Town elections will be held Oct. 5.

Petitions were filed today with Democratic Registrar Albert H. Bennett for including in the primary ballot the names of Mrs. Mary Pfaus for second selectman, Vernon Hill and Harvey V. Vance, for the Board of Education.

They will oppose John McKewen, the Democratic Town Committee's choice for second selectman, and Judge Francis T. Loughlin and Atty. Francis C. Shea, the committee's choices for the full terms on the School Board.

Foreign Ministers Benched

It is part of the sudden agreement on Eisenhower-Khrushchev talks that the Geneva conference of foreign ministers concludes and adjourns without having reached an agreement of any kind and that nobody is disturbed by that fact.

Nobody, that is, unless it is the faithful respective foreign ministers who went through their respective duties faithfully for 10 weeks only to find the rug pulled from under them. At last, by their own high-ups. But perhaps they are glad to suffer the indignity involved in order to be rescued from their own dead ends.

It was a silly conference, for big powers to be conducting, even before it suffered the final indignity of having the jurisdiction snatched away from it.

Discussion at Geneva was limited to superficial externalities and never got down to substance. It spent most of its time trying to determine whether Russia's position on Berlin was a ultimatum or not, and if it was, what its purpose might be.

The West pretended to think that Russia was trying to take Berlin for itself. Russia could never quite admit that all it wanted from its ultimatum was the opening of basic diplomatic discussions between East and West, for fear that, if the West knew that, it would walk away anyway.

The nature of the Russian ultimatum has now, however, been determined. Khrushchev has what he has long wanted—the opening of direct East-West diplomacy at the highest level, where substance can be discussed. The threat to Berlin has simultaneously vanished, and not merely for the moment.

It is obviously something that cannot be renewed in the course of the mutual Russian-American activities now being scheduled, or renewed when these activities are completed. If either side is going to pretend to have reaped any benefit from a course of action in which so much is being risked.

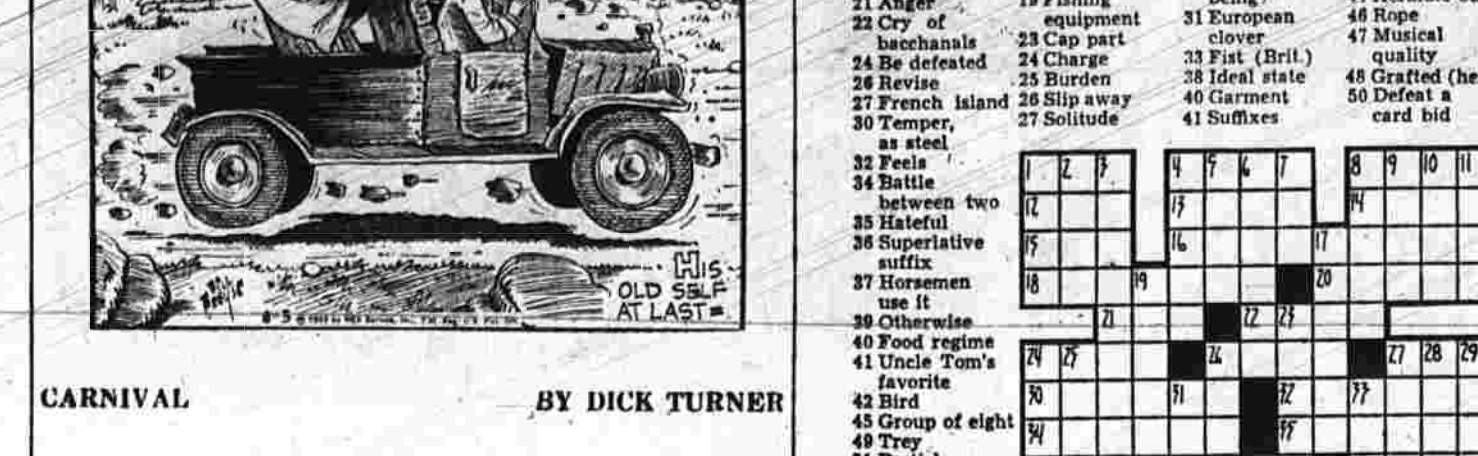
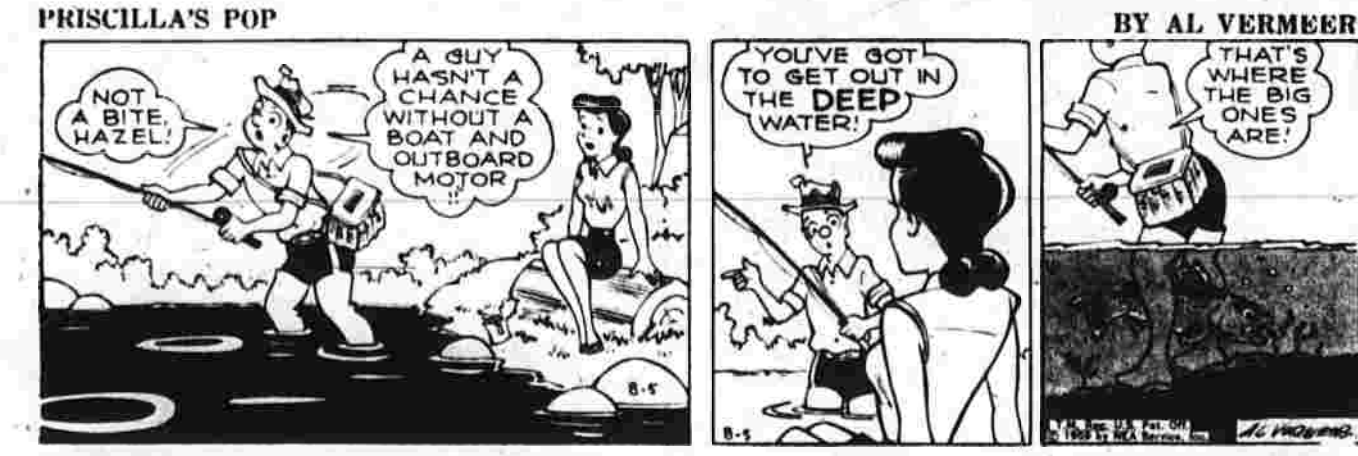
