Hartford, Aug. 15 (AP) — William L. Schatzman, a former State Police captain, is the new state civil defense director.

Gov. Abraham Ribicoff announced Schatzman's appointment yesterday. He will assume office immediately.

Schatzman, of North Haven, retired from the State Police in 1956 after serving for 32 years. He presently works for a Bridgeport construction firm.

He will succeed Leo J. Mulcahy, who became State Police Commissioner on July 1. The civil defense job pays \$10,360 a year.

Schatzman joined the state police in 1924 as a patrolman. In 1951 he was assigned to the Civil Defense office as chief of security and plant protection.

Board Will Consider Fund for School Work

The Board of Directors will consider an appropriation of \$65,000 for architectural and engineering fees for the \$240,000 elementary school renovation plan Tuesday at 8 p.m. in the hearing room of the Municipal Building.

The School Building Committee Monday recommended the Board of Directors make the appropriation for the program.

Although the amount of work which can be accomplished in relation to an architect's fee is usually set as the fee, the Building Committee estimated that more than \$65,000 worth of work could be done.

The committee decided that some of the architectural plans for new equipment installations could be made by the companies which win the contracts, particularly plumbing, acoustical tile and asphalt tile.

The Board of Education had requested a \$10,000 appropriation, but this was to include some architectural fees for Barnard Junior High School plans.

The Building Committee postponed action on the remaining \$55,000 recommendation, until the Board of Education produces a more detailed plan of where it will spend the money.

Another appropriation to the Board of Education which the Board of Directors will consider Tuesday will be \$500 for custodial and other services at the Manchester High School swimming pool. The Board of Education permitted the Town Recreation Department to run the pool for the public this summer.

A public hearing on the appropriation will precede action taken by the Board of Directors.

Other items on the agenda are a consideration of authorizing the general manager to advertise for bids on construction of an outdoor swimming pool at Verplanck School, and a consideration of abating the taxes on the South Methodist Church.

Tobacco Workers in Brawl; Two Sliced, Seven Arrested

An argument between two Michigan tobacco workers in South Windsor last night over a missing watch erupted into a free-for-all that sent two to Hartford Hospital and resulted in the arrest of seven.

Admitted to Hartford Hospital for stab wounds and cuts were Bryan Morris, 29, of Jamaica, and Secundino Vidot, 33, of Puerto Rico. Morris was stabbed and cut about the face, head, neck and hands and required 60 stitches to close all the wounds. He suffered three 4-inch cuts in the back of his neck.

It required 40 stitches to close wounds on Vidot's neck and head. Vidot was arrested and charged with assault with a dangerous weapon, a knife. He is being held under a \$1,000 bond.

Charged with breach of peace were Morris, and two other Jamaicans, Solomon Williamson, 21, and Melton Wynn, 25; and three Puerto Ricans, Aquedro Sanchez, 28, Juan Ortega, 23, and Angel Perez Paez, 18. The latter three are being held under bonds of \$100 each, and Morris under a \$25 bond. Williamson and Wynn posted \$15 bonds each and were released.

South Windsor Constable Charles Jurgelas described the battle this way: He and another constable, Stanley Blenkowski received a call from Hartford barracks at 10 last night to go to the aid of State Police Sgt. Paul Seaman at the cafeteria of the Shepherd Boarding House in East Windsor Hill, occupied by migrant workers hired by the Cullman Tobacco Co.

When the two constables arrived, a raging free-for-all was in progress. "The place looked like a slaughter house," Jurgelas said. "Pop bottles, cataup bottles and fire extinguishers were flying all over the place. Blood and catsup were all over the floor and on the walls. When we arrived and entered the cafeteria with Seaman, the brawl broke off the fight.

Vidot and Morris were bleeding heavily and most of the others retreated cuts from broken glass on the floor. Jurgelas said they were patched up by police at Hartford barracks.

Jurgelas said Vidot apparently had the knife and inflicted wounds on Morris who countered with a broken bottle. The onlookers entered the fray and the battle raged for nearly half an hour before being broken up by police.

All the accused are scheduled to appear in South Windsor Town Court Monday night.

The woman said she was glad to see Franchia and appreciated his stopping. Lee, always frank and honest in his talk, said, "I'm not so sure you want to see me. I am here to investigate a dog bite. Your dog bit someone."

The woman went into a rage. She used choice language in promising to have Lee punished by the police.

Inflation Subject Of New Booklet

Five hundred copies of a booklet containing a "program for halting inflation" are being sent to its members by the Manchester Chamber of Commerce.

Additional copies are available to the general public and may be picked up at the Chamber building on E. Center St.

Milton Gottlieb, president of Displaycraft and chairman of the Chamber's publicity, publications and public relations committee, said the booklets are being distributed because there has been so much interest expressed lately in the inflation problem.

### ABC's Sports Arena

His favorite active sport is fishing—one of the few sports not scheduled for the ambitious 1959-60 programming. He lives in Weehawken, N. J., with his wife, Cecilia; daughter, Signe;

Sports have always played an important role in the program structure of the American Broadcasting Co. Although the network has been well represented in the past with football, basketball, bowling, golf, boxing, boating and other events, sports will play a bigger role than ever on ABC-TV for the coming season.

Next week, for example, we launch a new professional football series on Saturday nights that we hope will be the start of a year-round diversified sports series that will be seen at 10 p.m. each Saturday.

This series, starting Aug. 22, will carry seven National Football League games over a 7-week period. Five games are exhibitions and two are league contests. Teams taking part in this series are the New York Giants, Baltimore Colts, Chicago Bears, Cleveland Browns, Pittsburgh Steelers, Washington Redskins, Green Bay Packers, Chicago Cards and Detroit Lions. Like it? To handle the commentary on these games, we secured two top sportscasters, Chuck Thompson and Howard Cosell. We're very pleased at this, because it is not always easy to get the services of the men we want—either they may not be available or there may be sponsor conflicts. Chuck Thompson is staff announcer for our sponsor—if we changed sponsors we'd have to lose Chuck. We all feel that the future possibilities for this Saturday night sports programming are unlimited.

was taking the air for the College All-Star Football Game, a cloud-burst knocked out all the camera equipment but one camera. Had to limp along on that until we could get the others working again. Last year, on the telecast of the same game, the power went out and the auxiliary power system was only enough to allow the audio portion to go on the air. No picture! Everyone worked frantically to restore the power but it was 20 minutes before the trouble was fixed. I am always amazed at the stamina displayed by our engineers and staff, and a rapport exists between all of them out in the field and all of us back home. We may be biting our nails in concern when planes are grounded far from an announcer's destination, but we know that somehow "through sleet or snow" he will get there.

in October—before the current renewal expires—the series will air its 500th contest since its start, September 1950.

Some of our problems relative to fights included the fact that a fighter may get hurt in training and have to forego the boxing date, and we have to get another fighter to replace him—sometimes we have to get two fighters because the weights don't match. Our contract with the sponsors for "Wednesday Night Fights" calls for the program 10 p.m. to conclusion with a minimum of 30 minutes on the air. In the spring, we had three quick knockouts in the first three fights and fortunately the fourth fight of the night just managed to get us to 30 minutes on the air. Had that been a quick knockout they might have had to put me in the ring!

**Changes in Golf Commentary**

Perhaps the most talked of sports presentation ever attempted on TV is our "All-Star Golf," which returns for its third year in October on Saturdays, 5-6 p.m., NYT.

When the idea of this series was first kicked around, almost everyone said you just couldn't present the sport in an interesting manner on TV. Pete DeMet and Sid Golts, producer and director, respectively, proved that it could be done.

At the request of viewers, two changes have been made. The mail indicated people wanted a more professional commentary and some instructional tips. This year they will get both. First, Jimmy Demaret, a 3-time Masters winner and one of the game's all-time greats, will be the commentator. His knowledge of the other pros on and off the golf course will add a great deal of color to the commentary.

The other change will see the golfers taking part in each match giving an instructional tip each week. After the first nine holes, one golfer will demonstrate a shot in slow motion and at the end of 18-holes the other golfer will give a links tip.

As in the past, the greatest of today's pro golfers will take part in the series.

Last year's champion, Sam Snead, who won \$28,500 in 13 matches, will take on Gary Player of South Africa. The playing format remains the same with the pros meeting in 18-holes of medal play golf on a leading course. The winner gets \$2,000 and returns to meet a new opponent the following week. The loser gets \$1,000 and is

eliminated from further play. There are bonuses of \$500 for every eagle (two under par) and \$10,000 for a hole-in-one, but the latter no one has cashed in on up to now.

ABC-TV is also planning a number of special sports presentations. Among these are the Bing Crosby Golf Tournament, the College All-Star Football Game which we just aired and which we will televise again next August, top bowling tournaments, basketball, sports car racing, hockey, track and field, and a number of other sports events which are still in the negotiation stage.

With versatile, full-time network programming now a reality at ABC-TV, a great deal of effort is going into an expanded sports schedule, and the fruits of this work will be on your screens during the coming year.
