Rhymes With Chaos

Nothing about the situation in Laos is easy to come by. That goes for what is actually happening there now, what has happened there since the end of the Indo-Chinese war, what the role of Russia and China may be, and what the role of the United States or the United Nations might be. Everything is tangled and complicated. Almost every fact obtainable must be modified by an other fact.

In such a situation, the easy routine thing to do is simply to say that the Communists are in. We really need to know. That course is already being adopted by many observers, and it is a formula to which everybody must come. In the end, because the complications involved cannot be resolved in any other way, and because we all seem to feel that the one all important thing about Laos is that Communists are on the move there, and must be stopped.

Meanwhile, however, responsible leaders have to pay some attention to the complications, they cannot simply ignore them. They must try to reach an heroic decision; conceded that they might like to do certain things, they have to find legal basis for doing them.

President Eisenhower, for instance, at his last press conference, was questioned about the "Communist invasion of Laos" and had to point out, in reply, that the questioner had made the mistake of an "invasion" but that the fact of an invasion had not yet been reported to him by the State Department.

Red China's Economic Woes May Block Shooting War

By JOHN ROBERTS

TOKYO, Aug. 27 (AP)—Communist China has publicly admitted she is in deep economic trouble at home. Does this mean war is impossible?

Following a recent meeting of the Communist Central Committee earlier this month, Peking announced yesterday that production last year was far less than previously announced. As a result, earlier production goals set for this year were not met.

With its agricultural and industrial programs for 1959 in admitted jeopardy, logic would seem to indicate that Mao Tse-tung will avoid an expensive shooting war in Asia. Mao cannot afford to divert a single pair of hands to new military adventures.

This could mean a period of calm in the Far East. The 10th anniversary of the Communist revolution for a year has been marked by the nationalistic Chinese Communist leaders. Could this be the sign of a new Peking policy?

But Mao also believes fear and hatred supply more adrenaline to communist peasants and laborers than do peace and goodwill. While seeking to avoid a hot war off his coast, the Chinese leader might try to instill a sense of urgency in his hard-pressed people by continuing to wave the danger flag over little Laos.

—He might even encourage some limited shooting. Using his Communist Vietnamese allies, the "Red" would cut him little in men or money. And he could continue his propaganda picture of the United States as an imperialist enemy, threatening Chinese security with mechanized troops in Laos.

—Failure of Mao and some of his top civilian and military aides to appear at Monday's important premiere state conference session suggested Mao may be in a quandary in conferring with Premier Nikita Khrushchev prior to the Soviet leaders' departure for Washington.

The Chinese might, through Khrushchev, seek to ease tension with the United States to permit local concentration on the staggering job to be done at home.

The Eisenhower-Khrushchev meeting next month might make it apparent whether Peking now seriously wants a relaxation of tension or will continue to seek profit in the troubles of other countries.

Research Dietitian Puts Patients First

Most of the patients are on a rigid routine in which technicians carefully record every ounce of food and liquid consumed and analyze all body waste so researchers can determine how the body utilizes and is affected by the medication administered. Detailed daily records are kept, not only of the amount of food consumed, but each serving's composition, such as fats, carbohydrates, minerals, etc.

leaving the earth shocks added to the panic.

Officials said the number of injured may reach 130, or more.

Jalisco, a small town 20 miles from the Gulf Coast in southern Veracruz State, apparently was hardest hit. An official report said seven were killed there. But Mexico, the government official monopoly, said its Jalisco office reported 20 dead, 130 injured and between 20 and 30 per cent of the town's buildings damaged.

Acapulco reported two deaths and 60 injuries. An official report said there was another death at Chihuahua and an undetermined number at Soya.

Semaphore reported the quake at forces 7 on a scale whose maximum is 10.


Highways were cracked. Four wrecks at Coahuila were shaken into the Gulf of Mexico. Radio towers buckled. Railroad tracks were twisted over a wide area, halting traffic. Power telegraph and telephone lines were down.

Panic was reported in Loma Bonita, the heart of Mexico's richest pineapple area, in the state of Oaxaca. There was panic, too, some 350 miles away in Progreso, in the Yucatan Peninsula, and in Jalapa, Fortina de las Flores, Oahu, Arriaga and in scores of other towns.

Heavy rain was falling in Loma Bonita, and recently dead citizens were soaked as they fled into the streets and fell to their knees to pray.

The government acted promptly, sending aid by road, air and sea. The Defense Ministry threw in troops to aid victims and guard against looting.

Crews began repair of highways, railroad and bridges, and put up emergency radio towers to transmit messages.



Hot Tips on Cold Soups

Cold soups are making their way around the country slowly but surely. Competitively new to the American scene, they are gaining converts.

The first edition (1936) of Ferny Farmer's "Boston Cooking School Cook Book" contains many a cold-soup recipe. Well over 20 years later, the first edition of our greatest cook book, "The Joy of Cooking," also has a recipe for chilled soup. But it didn't take the editor Mrs. Irma S. Rorer, author of "The Joy," long to prepare this summertime treat. In the second edition (1938) there were more cold-soup recipes—but still chilled. The newest and most remarkably complete edition of "The Joy of Cooking," co-authored by Marion Rombauer Becker, has a whole section of delightful cold-soup recipes. As you would expect, the greatest of these soups—vichyssoise, gazpacho, avocado, spinach, tomato, and cucumber—are all there.

The West Coast and the eastern and southern states probably lead in serving cold soup. In some of the recent regional cookbooks you'll find excellent recipes for this delicacy. "Cooking with the Groundhogs," a delightful compilation by the Adrian Hospital Auxiliary, contains a recipe for a hearty cold-soup. "The Joy of Cooking," Pa. de-clarates a section to it. The older and classic regional, "Charleston Receipts," collected by the Junior League of Charleston, S.C., also has some unusually fine cold soup recipes.

But even modern cold-soup recipes change. Some of us are inclined to talk shortcuts on occasion, and the condensed frozen potato soup is a base for various cold soups. That's what we've done in the following Cucumber Soup, which may be prepared in record time. If you chill it to the coldest compartment of your refrigerator you can also serve it with speed.

Quick Cold Cucumber Soup
Ingredients: 1 can (10 1/2 oz.) condensed cream of potato soup, milk, 1/2 cup cucumber, 1/2 cup cream, 1/2 cup minced cucumber. Method: Turn potato soup (just as it comes from the can) into a quart saucepan. Fill the soup can with milk and add with the cucumber. Heat slowly, stirring occasionally, until very hot and cucumber is partly cooked at least 10 minutes. Put through a fine strainer and chill. Shortly before serving stir in the cream and 1/2 cup minced cucumber. Makes about 1 quart—1 1/2 servings.

Note: The texture of this soup is best if served as soon as it is chilled.

The next step is to "fill with chilled carbonated water and stir."

One point the experts take for granted, but we'll mention it. Make sure you have straw in the house. Ever try drinking a soda without these gadgets? It's no fun. Last Christmas members of our family were surprised to see "silver sipper-ponies" on our list of gifts that would be appreciated. This summer when they visit us and enjoy using them to sip their sodas and other cool drinks, they're glad they paid heed.

To make one of the top favorites, an All-Black Ice Cream Soda, most fountain experts agree that you need three tablespoons of chocolate syrup, bought or homemade for a tall glass. They also agree that the color in which you add the remaining ingredients is important. So next pour in the milk—we like at least a bird-cup per glass—and then fill two-thirds to three-quarters full with soda water. Now add a big scoop of chocolate ice cream. If sweet stuff runs over, that's no figure.

Laundry Bag Off to School

Every boarding school girl needs a laundry bag—the bigger the better, and sturdy enough to stand the gaff of weekly trips through the malle, when the laundry goes home to mother.

A husky duffel bag of water-repellent, milow-resistant material solves the problem of storage and transportation. You may choose either a solid color or a gaily striped awning canvas.

After much experiment, local sewing clubs have worked out the ideal school laundry duffel—simple to make at home. They suggest you make it with a drawing top and an identification-card pocket. The pocket on the side serves as an address holder. A piece of cardboard with daughter's school address on one side, parents' home address on the other, serves as a permanent mailing label. Fourth class postal charges for nine ounces of laundry will be under 20 cents if the school is less than 300 miles from home.

The duffel can be stitched on your electric sewing machine. However, it is recommended that a heavy (No. 18) needle and heavy (No. 40) thread be used. A straight stitch is satisfactory, but a zigzag stitch on an automatic-stitching machine will give greater seam strength. Canvas may be purchased from a local sewing shop, mail-order house or large department store.

To make the bag, cut 24 inches in circumference and 28 1/2 inches deep. You will need one and five-eighths yards of canvas, matching thread and 12 feet of cotton clothline cord. Here's how the bag is made:

1. Draw a circle 14 inches in diameter on the canvas, using pencil or chalk, and a piece of string. Cut the bottom of the bag in this form. The bottom of the bag cut a 2-inch length of canvas for the sides.
2. Work drawing openings about 20 inches apart and one inch from the selvage on one side of your 42-inch length of canvas.
3. Use the remaining fabric scraps for the pocket.
4. Cut two strips an inch and a half wide and five inches long. Sew the same width and six inches long. If you are using a striped canvas, center a stripe in each strip and under edge so that only the stripe shows. Sew the strips to the four strips to form a rectangular "stitch" in the middle of your 42-inch length of canvas, leaving




