### School Officials List Coventry Bus Routes

Bus schedules for about 1,500 pupils in Coventry have been prepared by the Board of Education and Coventry school officials.

A total of nine buses with 14 seats to transport children to local public schools, as well as the high and technical schools in Willimantic and Manchester.

A great deal of work on the part of the school officials has been put into making the schedules. Superintendent Charles O. Fisher said.

The schedules show that one bus may make as many as eight to nine different trips during one day. All the schedules are close and the cooperation of all parents and pupils is needed to make the trips on time.

Sup. Fisher said today the bus schedule will not be in individual pupils.

The number of bus stops has been reduced to save time. Buses cannot operate off the hard top roads or go out of their way to pick up pupils, nor can they stop at individual homes. As the need arises, necessary changes will be made in the schedules.

Pupils are expected to travel only on the buses to which they have been assigned. Only emergency requests for extra buses will be considered. The permission in writing of the parent and approval of the principal must be received.

Due to crowding on buses it is asked that only emergency requests be made to travel on buses to which pupils have not been assigned. Permission can only be given to go on another bus on the written request of the parent and then only if there is no time of starting and the routes are listed as follows:

and no fresh incidents have been reported. Doshi is on his way to New Delhi for talks with Nehru. Nehru said parliament has decided to explore the possibility of a settlement of the Menon-Thimayya rift, especially at a time when the general had assured him the army was in a fine fettle and its morale was good.

Mr. Menon's resignation was reported in the House on Sept. 1. Nehru's explanation did not satisfy many of the deputies. Socialists demanded a secret session to discuss the issue. Some members called on Nehru to let parliament see Thimayya's letter. But the House speaker rejected the motions and said the prime minister's statement was clear and sufficient.

Nehru had explained that generally officers are promoted to lieutenant general only after commanding an infantry division. He said Thimayya wanted to promote one officer immediately and design-

ate him to an infantry command later, but Krishna Menon vetoed the idea.

The food campaign, launched by the Communist-sponsored price increase and famine resistance committee, has been described by the government as a Red reaction to the dismissal of the Communist government in Kerala State.

The state government claims the price of food grains is no higher than in other states.

Chief Minister B. C. Roy, blaming left-wing elements for exploiting the food situation for political purposes, said in a statement that prices are now showing a downward trend with the arrival of a new crop on the market.

No deaths from famine have been reported so far. In the 1943 famine, millions perished in Bengal.

Communists and other left-wing parties are demanding that the state government change its food policy and dismiss Food Minister P. C. Sen. They allege that the government's recent withdrawal of a food price control order helped hoarders and put prices beyond the reach of the poor man.

They also are demanding that the government undertake responsibility for supply rice at a controlled price to the state's 20 million people.

Roy has replied that no government in the world could embark on such a plan.
