Air Force Relieves Iceland Command Following Protests. Washington, Sept. 18 (AP)—Brig. Gen. Gilbert Pritchard has been relieved of his command in Iceland in the wake of an airport incident that raised Icelandic feelings against American forces there. Pritchard was commander of the Air Base at Keflavik where two Icelandic officials were reported to have been taken by guards to the island during the dark and foggy night. The action was taken at the request of the Icelandic government. An Air Force spokesman said in answer to questions: "The incident was a serious one and we are sorry that it occurred. Mine Collapse Traps 45 Men In Smoky Pit. Kirkinloch, Scotland, Sept. 18 (AP)—Forty-six miners were trapped today in a fiery, smoke-filled pit nearly a quarter of a mile underground. Hope of saving them faded rapidly. One man staggered from the inferno. Reactors dragged out a dead miner. He had suffered from a heart attack. Scores of sobbing women—mostly wives, daughters and sisters of the trapped miners—were crowded near the mine opening. Time and again they saw firemen and rescue teams beaten back by the heat and the acid fumes. "It will be a miracle if they are alive," gasped one of the volunteers. "The fumes are terrible." The mine, one of Britain's nationalized collieries, is located within 10 miles of Glasgow. Trouble started when a large burst of steam from a boiler exploded into flame, spreading fire to the timbered props and pillars. As the flames ate through the timbering, the roof of the mine sagged and fell. Men were hurled into the air. Many were killed. The rescue operation is being hampered by the lack of oxygen and the heat. The trapped miners are still unaccounted for.

Labor Set To Give Aid To Strikers. San Francisco, Sept. 18 (AP)—AFL-CIO unions are expected to OK a fund today of some \$25 to \$30 million per month to aid striking steel workers. The federation's 153 unions were due to meet this full measure, plus a pledge of outright grants, to the 100,000 steel workers in their 66-day strike.
