Bonds Out for Bids On City Sewage Plant

Sewage treatment plant bonds of the City of Rockville-Vernon are on sale, with sealed bids due Monday at 2 p.m. at the Connecticut Bank and Trust Co., Room 804, at 700 Main St., Hartford.

The proceeds of the \$710,000 bond issue will be used to finance the construction of a sewage treatment plant in Rockville. Federal aid in the amount of \$237,000 has been promised.

The coupon bonds, to be dated Oct. 15, 1959, will be in denominations of \$1,000 each, maturing in a series of installments of \$40,000 each, commencing Oct. 15, 1961 and ending Oct. 15, 1969.

Bidders are to name one rate of interest in a multiple of one-tenth of one per cent. The bonds will be awarded to the highest responsible bidder on the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the city.

Aldermen are being requested to contact Mayor Herman G. Olson if they wish to attend the opening of bids in Hartford Monday. The group will leave Rockville before noon on that day.

The prospectus accompanying the request for bids, lists American Corp. as the largest taxpayer in the city, and LaPointe Industries as the second largest. The taxable valuation of American's property as of Oct. 1, 1958 is listed as \$213,500, and that of LaPointe at \$272,800.

However, the prospectus points out that the uncollected taxes listed include \$35,029, representing uncollected taxes of "one large manufacturer in reorganization"—LaPointe.

Corp. Counsel J. Donald Shannon said today he and Town Counsel Harry H. Logan will be working with LaPointe's attorney in an effort to reach a settlement on the tax owed by the firm.

The other eight largest taxpayers listed in the prospectus are: Best J. Lewis, U.S. Envelopes Co., Shephard Realty Co., Minnetonka Realty Co., Graydon Corp., J. Frickard, Margo Realty and Connecticut Bank and Trust Co.

"The boat was about 40 feet out in the water when I started the motor," Larson said. "The boat suddenly went down, and the boat flipped over, throwing all of us in the water.

"Although I couldn't swim, I was close enough to grab the boat and climb up on the overturned bottom. I had a hand on one of the

girls once but I lost hold and she slipped away.

The boat moved a mile or so around before the 5-horsepower motor stopped churning.

Larson reached shore by using one hand and one leg to row the overturned craft.

"Every few minutes I'd look around but I didn't see anyone. I looked again when I reached shore and still didn't see anyone. Then I knew they were drowning.

### Directors Ask Reason Estimates Below Bids
