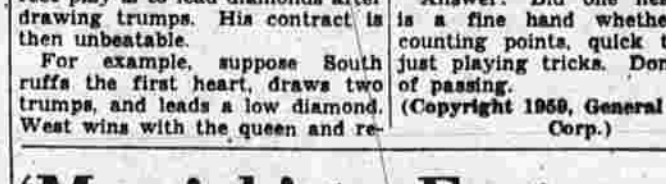

**Acheson Attorney In Seymour Suit**

Hartford, Sept. 29 (AP)—Former U.S. Secretary of State Dean Acheson has been added to the team of attorneys for the plaintiff in the complex Seymour Manufacturing Co. suit.  
Papers filed yesterday with the U.S. Second Circuit Court of Appeals asked the court to reconsider its order of Sept. 9 dismissing the \$7½ million stockholders' suit from the federal court in Hartford.  
Acheson's name headed the list of seven attorneys representing the plaintiff, George C. Matthias. The plaintiff asks that the appellate court consider the case once more.

**Warden Supported By Prison Board**

Hartford, Sept. 29 (AP)—The State Prison Board says Warden Mark Richmond has its unanimous support in his management of the prison, the board announced today.  
A dispute between Richmond and Guard Union Prison Business Agent Frank J. Gallagher over a list of complaints filed by the union has raged for several weeks. The "hot" battle reached a climax when Gov. Abraham Ribicoff declared he had no confidence in Gallagher, but had full faith in Richmond's administration of the prison.

**Paul Marte Cited For Health Work**

Atty. Paul Marte, chairman of the Manchester Mental Health campaign committee, has received a citation from the Connecticut Association for Mental Health for outstanding work during the past year in behalf of mental health.  
Marte was given the citation for the greatest percentage increase by a mental health association achieved during the 1959 campaign. The Manchester Mental Health campaign committee raised \$4,100 in the 1959 campaign as compared with a total of \$227. This was a 650 per cent increase in returns.  
For the first time, the Manchester campaign was centered around a district-wide fund-raising solicitation with some 400 bellringers recruited in cooperation with the Greater Hartford campaign office.  
The level of giving in Manchester is directly related to the leadership role in the community of the Mental Health Association which has been active in community education and the development of mental health services such as the Child Guidance Clinic and school social work programs.
