Board Soon to Get Charter Unit Report

Work of Charter review, the Charter Revision Commission last night decided to plan a report to the Board of Directors without recommendation. The report will be made in the next few days.

The commission felt it lacked time to study thoroughly the proposal forwarded by Republican Town Chairman John Shaw, Democratic Town Chairman Steve Cavagnaro, and the Republican Town Committee.

The commission also passed along without recommendation the proposal that the Board of Directors hold a budgetary discussion on the latter's needs before the general manager prepares his tentative budget every year.

In all, the commission has acted on some 15 proposed charter changes since its appointment last December, and is expected to complete its report by the end of the month.

Atty. Jay Robinson, commission chairman, said the changes will be reported to the Board of Directors within a week.

Building Permits Drop in August

Building permits issued during the month of September by Lucius W. Robinson Jr., dropped in the estimate of the Building Permits Commission. The commission estimates that the number of permits issued during the month of September was 1,000, compared with 1,200 in August.

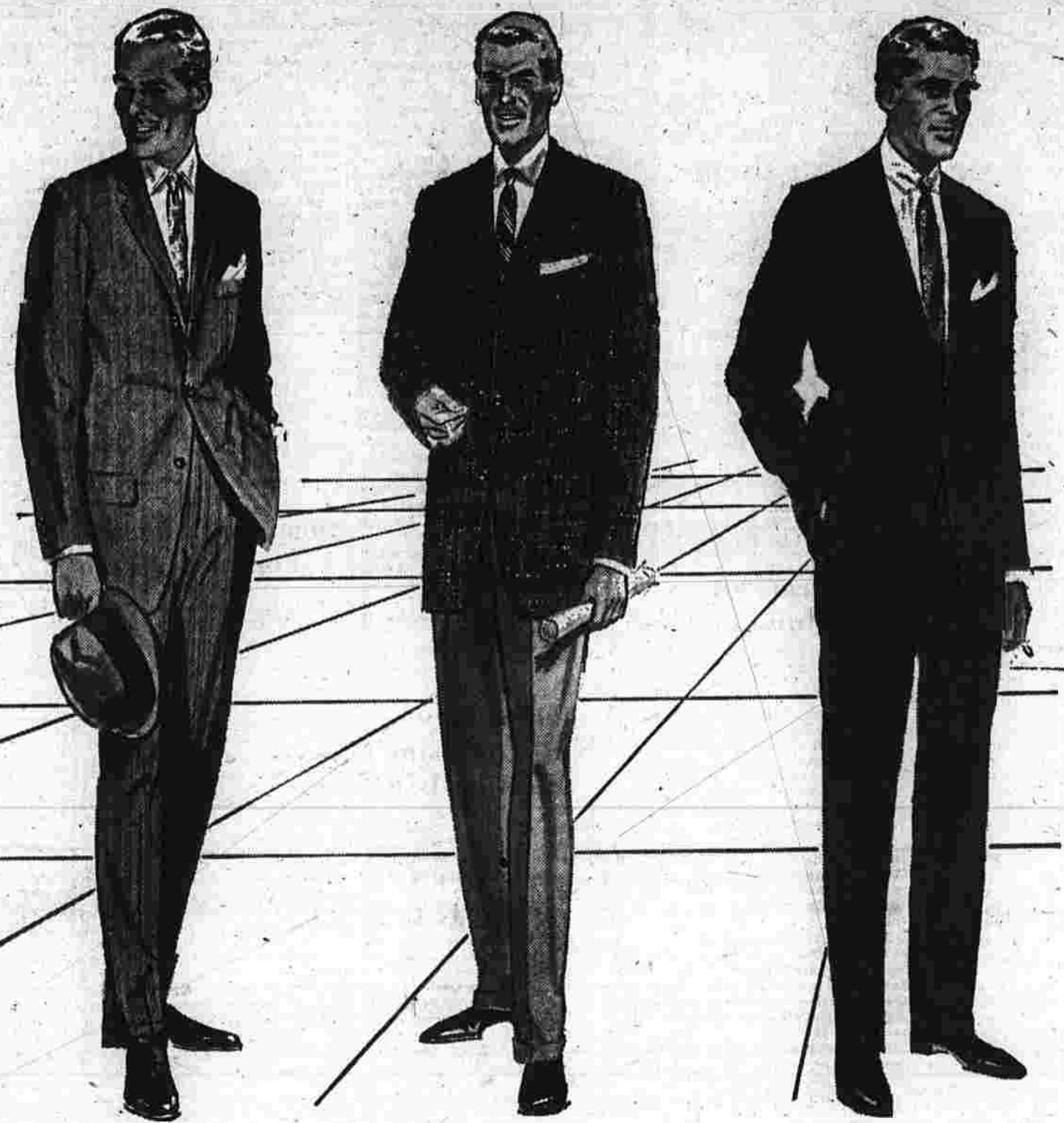

Minority Party Label Challenges GOP Ranks

The threat that the Republican party will become the minority party in Connecticut should be a challenge to Republican women workers, Mrs. Babette Ranshoff told members of the Manchester GOP Women's Club at a luncheon meeting at the Manchester Country Club yesterday.

The State's new national committeewoman from Stamford cited the minority party trend reported in latest voter registration totals from the Secretary of State's office.

Republicans have picked up 2,500 new voters in Connecticut in comparison to 11,000 new voters registered in the Democratic party, she reported. Independent voters are now beyond the 50 per cent mark, she added.

Republicans still have a registration majority in Manchester, Mrs. Ranshoff told the GOP women. Of 21,061 registered voters in the town 48 per cent were registered Republican, 31 per cent Democratic and 18 per cent independent, as of January, 1959, she reported.

Many traditionally Republican towns are becoming Democratic, she warned. "We can't sit around back and say we are going to win anyway," Mrs. Ranshoff declared.

The national committeewoman outlined details of a recruit for 1960 program introduced by Republican National Chairman Leads Alcorn to enlist new workers.

This program to bring new members to Republican clubs aims at 40,000 instead of 20,000 members in Connecticut, she said, and 150 Republican clubs instead of the present 92. In Manchester, which has five voting districts, she explained, the club will be asked to appoint membership and campaign chairmen in each district with quotas assigned to each. The quotas will be based on the number of votes Republican Congressmen received in each district in the last election. The block system will be used for canvassing new members, workers and voters.

Campaign chairmen in each district will serve as liaison between the town committee and the club, she added.

Must Know Party "Republican women must know a lot more about the Republican party," she advised. She recommended coffee discussion groups to reach independent registrants and to inform others about "what happened in the General Assembly and Congress."

Admiring fellow Republican women that "we can't resign as citizens," Mrs. Ranshoff emphasized the importance of individual effort in political work. She cited the hairline margins by which many State and national officeholders won or lost elections in recent years.

"We hear a lot about the influence of labor in the Democratic party," said Mrs. Ranshoff, admitting that "AFL-CIO members have become the doorbell ringers, telephone workers and money raisers for the opposition party. This too, she said, is a challenge to Republican women. "Women can be to the Republican Party what labor's Committee on Political Education is to the Democratic party," she asserted.

The luncheon marked the 21st birthday of the Manchester club. Past presidents were presented with pins from the national committee. "I hope Khrushchev is not nominating our candidate for president," Mrs. Babette Ranshoff, GOP national committeewoman, when asked what effect Khrushchev's estimate of Vice-President Richard Nixon as leading Cold War exponent might have on Nixon's chances for nomination or election as president.

When asked for her preference between Nixon and Gov. Nelson Rockefeller as presidential candidates, the GOP leader said "Both are wonderful candidates." Mrs. Ranshoff explained she is "sounding out" the attitude of Republicans whom she represents as national committeewoman, but it is too early to determine any preference.

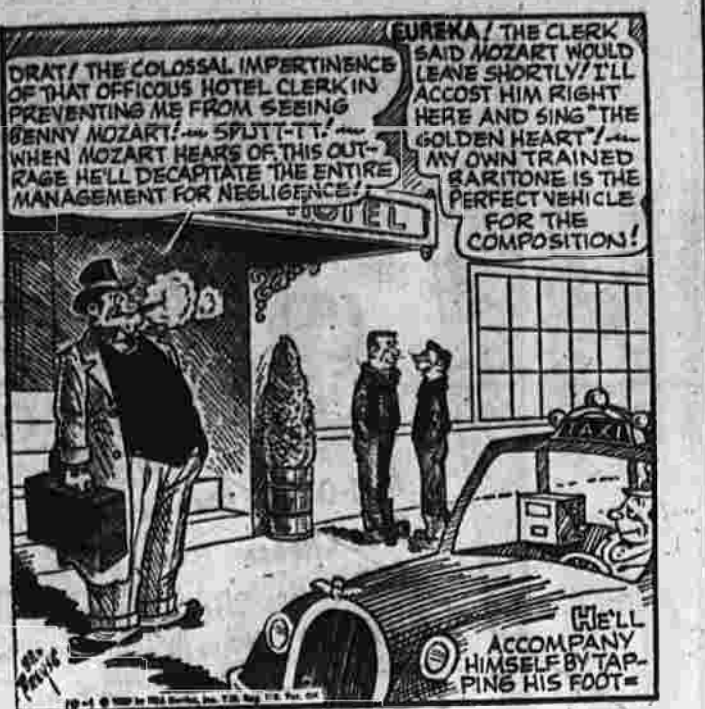

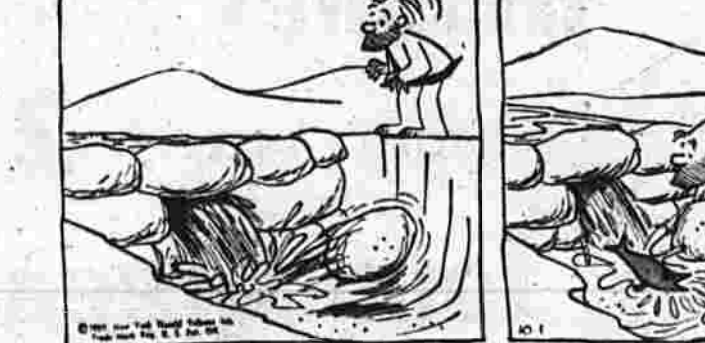
