Rockville-Vernon State's Tax Commissioner To Enter LaPointe Dispute

State Tax Commissioner John E. Sullivan said today he has advised Vernon tax collector Mrs. Florence Lovrin against accepting a check from LaPointe Industries in full payment of back taxes. Sullivan said he would be in contact with the collector in the morning. Sullivan said he is not keeping the agreement in mind. The commissioner said he will contact Town Councilman Harry H. Lutz and may go to Rockville to discuss the matter.

He said he had expected to be asked by local officials to go to Rockville but was not asked. Sullivan's advice to Mrs. Lovrin followed receipt of a letter from the town which was sent to LaPointe, the town and city council, the Board of Finance, and the Hartford National Bank and Trust Co. In the letter Mrs. Lovrin outlined her objection to signing a release for the Hartford National Bank which holds a mortgage on LaPointe's property, which is the subject of an outstanding order for the release of the property.

Protest Write-Off
Mrs. Lovrin wrote, "the account after adjustment shows a net amount of \$70,314.84, interest of \$10,000.00, less fees of \$1,875.00, for a total due the town of Vernon of \$80,314.84."

"I feel this should be brought to your attention inasmuch as I hesitate and am unable to sign such a release, which means a write-off of \$82,077 in actual taxes, and \$10,000.00 in interest due, that I, as tax collector, do not have the authority to write-off."

Commissioner Sullivan said this morning, "If all the townspeople want to do something relative to the economic safety of the community, I would be the last person to step in." But, he continued, "it is reasonable," and Mrs. Lovrin has every right to expect LaPointe to pay the amount due on the adjusted assessment, plus interest.

After coming to Rome, and bringing his weight down from about 160 to 184 pounds, Lanza said he had recovered from an "unhappy episode."

"There had been years in which he worked hard played hard and sang every song as if it would be his last. Of his voice he often said, 'It is a gift of God, I cannot take credit for it; it merely passes through me.'"

When he failed to report for 'Hills of Rome,' the studio brought a \$5 million damage suit. This later was settled and his voice was used in the movie."

Lanza said he could not work for more than a year and had to give up a "fabulous deal" led to a radio show. One of the incidents most damaging to his career came when his voice had to be dubbed in a television show; old recordings of his were used instead of the live voice. He declared later his doctor had forbidden him to sing at the time.

Wants Bill Settled

"I shall be most happy to see this bill settled, and it is being full knowledge and understanding that both the Board of Finance and the City Council have agreed on this settlement, that I am protesting the total amount of this check, \$97,314.84, (\$89,710.22 the share for the town of Vernon) does not cover the tax bill on the adjusted assessment figures, said figures being furnished by LaPointe Industries as the amount they are willing to pay," Mrs. Lovrin wrote.

Mrs. Lovrin said she is also concerned that she is not being supplied with a correction from the Assessor's Office to legally remove these figures from the tax books.

LaPointe's taxes due to the town and city have been accumulating since 1955 when the firm was near bankruptcy. Through legislative action the town and city gave LaPointe an extension of two years in which to pay their 1954 and 1955 taxes.

In November 1958, Jan H. Stillbach, president of the firm, asked the town and city to waive interest on those two years, but the municipalities refused. Stillbach also claimed discrepancies in the assessment from 1955 to 1958. Action toward settlement was revived this year after Mrs. Lovrin sent a tax demand notice to LaPointe, warning of possible legal action if payment was not made.

Gaston Removes Sign
Ralph T. Gaston, Rt. 83 restorer, has advised Building Inspector Arthur F. Huntington that he will not appeal the inspector's decision regarding signs on Gaston's place of business.

Gaston won a dismissal of his case in Rockville City Court recently where he was charged with erecting signs without a permit. Through Atty. Robert Baum, Gaston claimed that he had been denied the right of appeal of the building inspector's decision because Vernon had never appointed an appeals board.

An appeals board has since been appointed by the Selectmen. However, Gaston has decided not to appeal to that board and has removed the signs in question. Gaston's name and business had been lettered on shutters on the house he uses for business purposes. The lettering has been painted over.

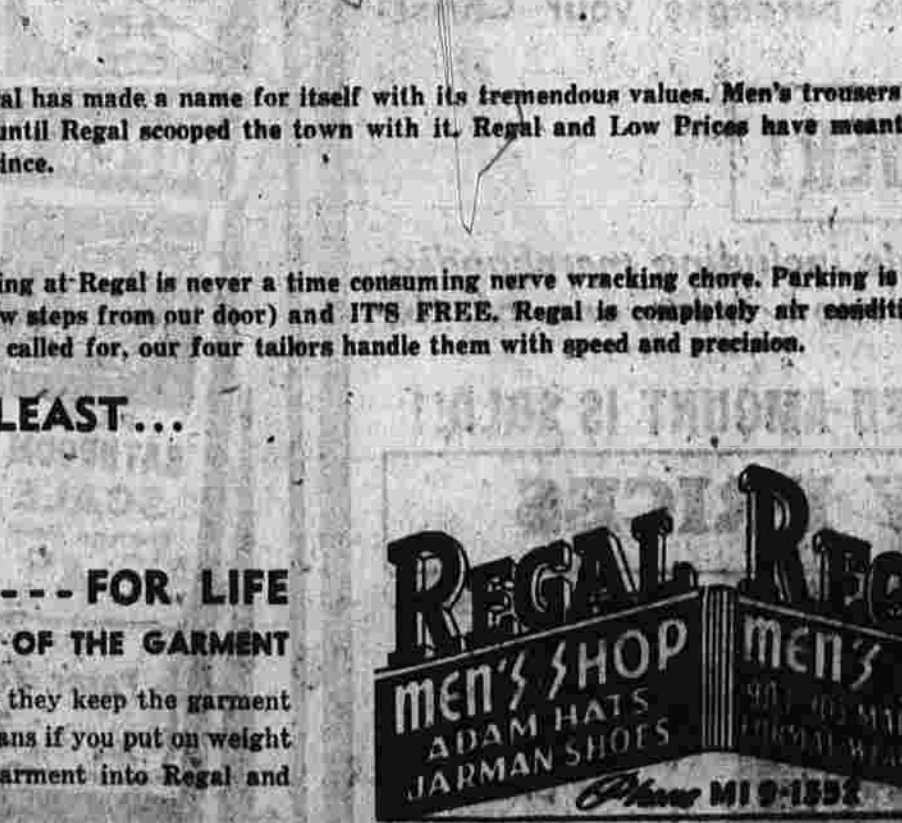
