





Washington, Oct. 9 (AP)—President Eisenhower conferred for an hour on the steel strike with four cabinet officers today, but the White House refused to say whether a Taft-Hartley injunction was imminent. Press secretary James C. Hagerty told newsmen that the president had not yet decided on an informal deadline before he left for his California vacation by saying he wanted to see some progress before he returned. He came back yesterday. The strike was still deadlocked. Management and labor were not talking to each other. There was no immediate White House action on his return. Secretary of Labor Mitchell met with union officials. His only comment was that the union leaders should try to get on with the strike situation. Mitchell wouldn't say whether the strike would be called off.

# Dodgers Champs in Coliseum, Cooniskey Park, Second Time in 10 Tries for Organization

Chicago, Oct. 9 (AP)—The Los Angeles Dodgers are champions of the Coliseum, Cooniskey Park and the world after brushing off the Chicago White Sox two-out-of-three any place they played.

It was the make pit at Los Angeles that had the White Sox talking to themselves. But after all the talk, they looked to be a tough comeback when they played away with a 1-0 victory in the Coliseum Tuesday, forcing a sixth game at Cooniskey Park.

Yet that's where the Dodgers—and pitching ace Larry Sherry—put the White Sox away for the winter.

It was at Cooniskey Park, a ball park that the Dodgers got rid of the best in the way of pitching the Sox had to offer, changing Sherry Early Wynn and sending Dick Donovan off in close pursuit while winning the world series.

It was only their second world championship in 10 tries for the Dodgers, their first since shifting to Los Angeles from Brooklyn two years ago.

And both championship teams have been managed by Walter Alton, the silent, smiling man who has led the Dodgers to three pennants in his six years.

**Proof Not**

This could be the richest of all series when the players finish splitting up the record \$292,263.04 player pool. A full winner's share should be worth at least \$10,000. The Dodgers probably \$12,000. The Sox, should be figuring to gain from \$7,000 to \$7,500 each, which would be a record for a losing share.

Whether the Dodgers will top the record \$11,147.90 pocketed by each of the World Giants in 1954 depends on the number of players they voted among themselves. The number of winners and losing shares won't be released until next week by Commissioner Ford Frick.

# Huskies Host UMass Eleven Saturday at 2

New Haven, Oct. 9 (AP)—Yale Coach Jordan Oliver says his boys can match Columbia when it comes to wild football formations. The Huskies have used a formation similar to the Lions' widely publicized "Mudra Huddle" three times this year, he said yesterday. The results have been "perfect"—a touchdown every time.

Columbia's technique calls for the Lions to hold their offensive huddles just one yard behind the line of scrimmage but 10 yards to one side of the ball. After they've picked a play, the quarterback and three or four other players line up over the ball while the rest of the team goes into a separate formation several yards away.

**Shift at Last Moment**

The Lions—but usually don't—run a play from this zany huddle. Usually they shift at the last moment into a more conventional lineup, hoping that the moving around before the ball snapped will throw the defenders off.

Oliver said Yale, while not fooled with the strange huddle, but has been able to keep the Huskies from the widespread formation that follows it. This venture resulted in a 10-0 victory for Yale over the Huskies and another in the Brown game.

Yale may try again against Columbia, he said, but only if Columbia Coach Bud Donnell will promise that one of his boys doesn't refer to their huddle as "the mudra."
