Can Fred Astaire Top Himself?

Hollywood — (NEA) — "Another Evening With Fred Astaire." The TV show comes to NBC on Nov. 4.

Another home run with so many Emmys (nine last time) that Fred Astaire again will be asked that maybe he should return one or two?

Fred Astaire is in the spotlight — and on the spot.

The slim, sleek-haired little fellow of the rhythmic magic sat in the living room quiet of his far-above-the-city Summit Drive hill-top home. He tried to play it cool while he talked to me about plotting out, rehearsing and filming (on tape) his second TV "Evening."

Four of his dance numbers — again with Barrie Chase as his partner — were pre-filmed before the rest of the show was performed live and taped before a studio audience of 300 people late in September.

No Rehearsals

He was trying to play it cool as he chatted about the show but you could detect the nervousness of a man on the spot who had tried to top himself.

"I tried not to think," he said, "about the last show and I didn't even mention it in this one. I'm not repeating anything and I didn't take the advice of anyone about anything. I only do what I like — I approve of everything that goes into the show — and if I sink or swim it's all on my shoulders."

"I always try to come up with something better than the last time. But you can't always do it, you know," he smiled. "I'm sure some people will say, 'I still liked his first show better.'"

So the question of whether he can top himself, whether Fred likes it or not, will become more important than the actual show itself on Nov. 4. It's the price he has to pay for those nine Emmys.

The beat — "all kinds of beats" — is the foundation on which Astaire built the song selections and the footsteps for "Another Evening With Fred Astaire" — and why other entertainers have jumped on "An Evening With . . ." brings a "No likes" frown to his face.

"Not very original, are they?" he passed it off.

Song Comes Mood

The words of "The After Beat," a song he wrote with Johnny Mercer, cues the show's mood. "The After Beat?"

"That's the next beat after the down beat," he grinned.

One of the biggest dance numbers is plotted around "Night Town."

"It really moves," Astaire enthused.

There's more dancing this time for little, 23-year-old Barrie Chase,

the girl who won acclaim last year as Fred's first TV dancing partner. Ironically, her career has been stymied, going nowhere, by a 30th Century-Fox movie contract. She was to have appeared in "Can Can," with Frank Sinatra and Shirley MacLaine, but after weeks of rehearsals for the film she was removed from the cast and her dance numbers were given to Shirley.

A "Sophisticated Lady" number will be Barrie's big bid for new home screen cheers.

While Astaire explores all kinds of beats with that ageless, effortless poise and ease, he's completely ignoring the Beatnik mood of so many recent TV dance numbers. He doesn't waste words telling you why.

"Beatniks," he winced, "has no beat. I saw one Beatnik number on TV the other night and they couldn't even walk in time to the music."

No One Cheats

As before, Astaire brought his "Evening" to the cameras with plenty of time to rehearse "and no frantic moments and no frenzy." There were seven weeks of rehearsal, with Astaire actually devoting three months to the project.

There was no script and no offstage cue cards — "I wouldn't have a cue card in the same building with me."

During the long days of rehearsing, the man and the feet, as always, were tireless. Only now backstage addition was his 17-year-old daughter, Ava, who worked on his production staff.

When he told Ava what her salary would be, she said: "Oh, no, Daddy, that's too much money."

"So," Astaire grinned, "I said five and I got her a little cheaper."

TOM POSTON ON BROADWAY

Tom Poston, he of CBS' "To Tell The Truth" and NBC's "Split Personality," scored a personal triumph in "The Golden Pleece," an October entry on the Broadway scene.
