Scheduled for construction soon are five pilot plants that will make large-scale tests of several promising conversion methods, ranging from super-heating to freezing.

Three of the plants will be constructed on the Pacific, Atlantic and Gulf coasts. The other two will be built inland to test the use of brackish water.

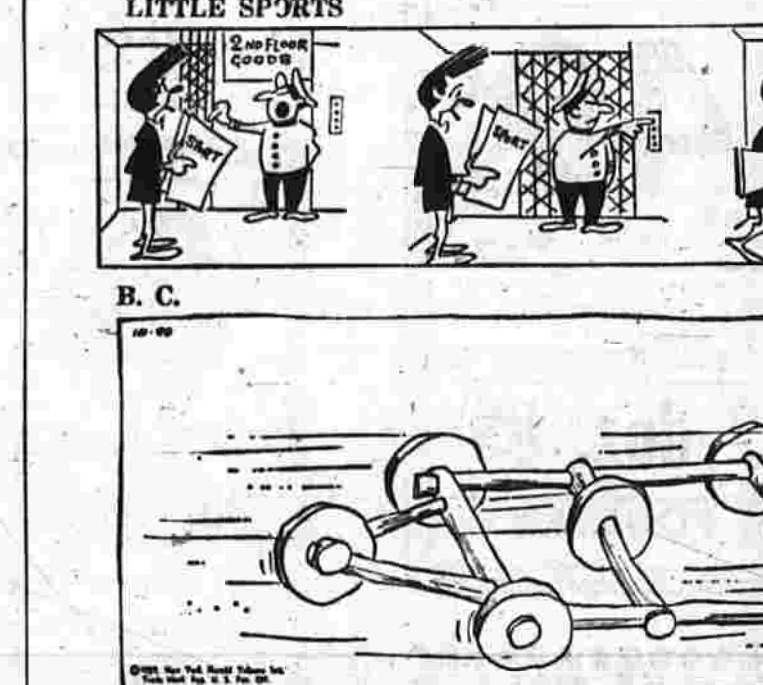

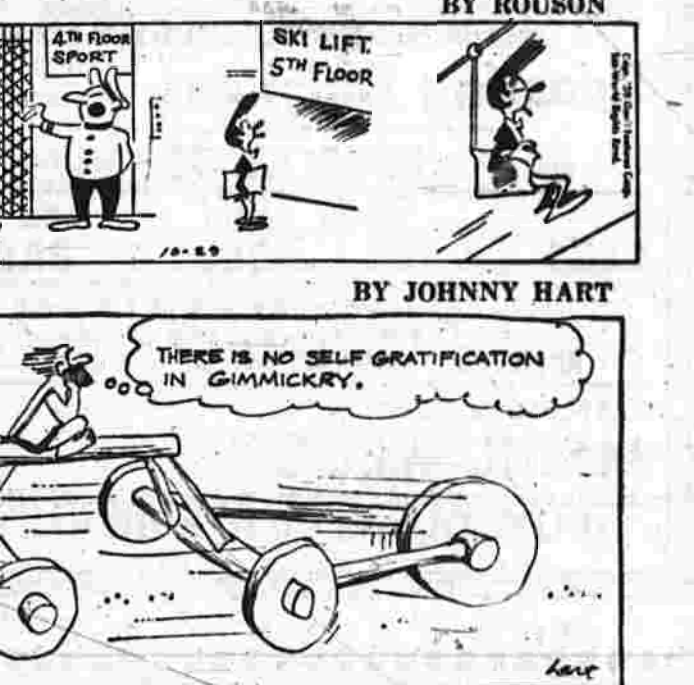

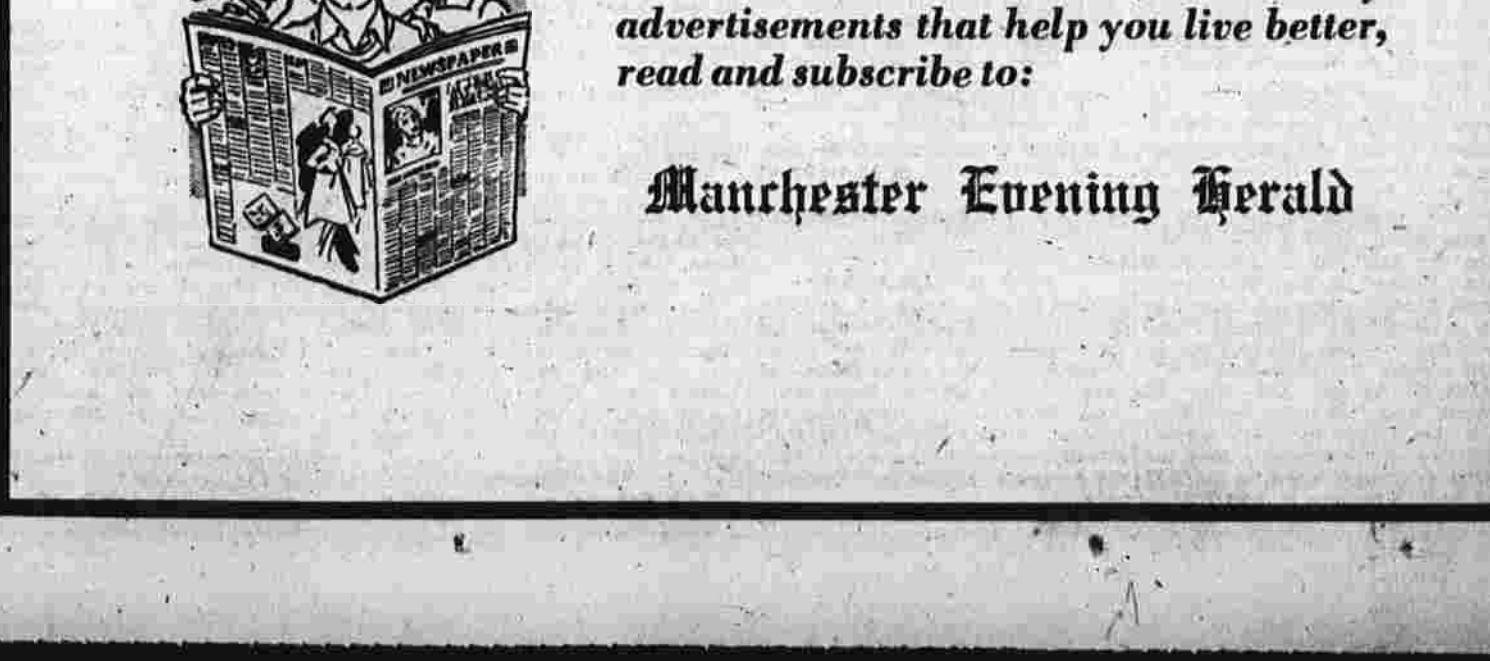
