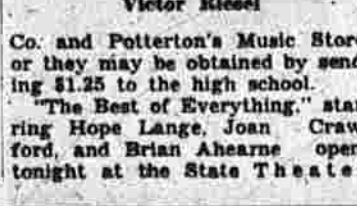

EXTRA POINT CAUSES TROUBLE

U.S. Master Team Champions

Which would you rather hold—a king or a queen? Most of the time I know would agree that it is better to hold a queen, and I've argued with them, but in this hand proves it.

West opened the drive of spades, and declarer counted his tricks carefully. He expected to win three spades and needed two tricks in each of the other suits.

After a pause that might be taken for thought, declarer won the first trick in dummy with the ace of spades and returned a diamond to finesse the jack. West won with the queen of diamonds and decided to abandon the entries.

South won with the ace of hearts and led the king of diamonds. East took the king of diamonds and led the queen of hearts to force out dummy's king.

This knocked out dummy's last entry. South could make only one diamond trick. Down one.

Make a Change

Just to see what a difference there is between a king and a queen, make a change in the South hand. Take away the king of diamonds and put the queen of diamonds in its place.

When West leads the ace of spades you must trump. The response of one in a suit gives more information and promises to greater strength.

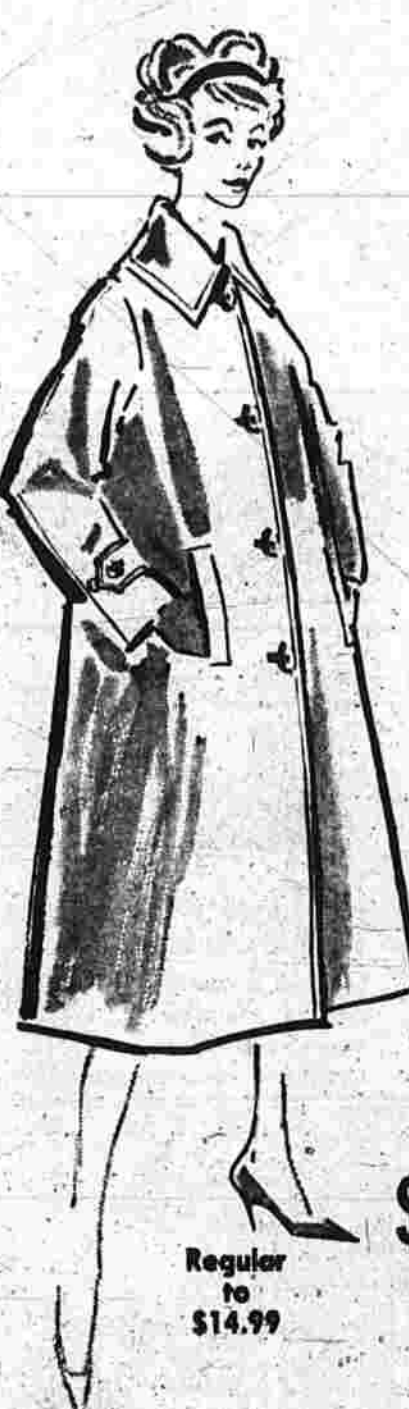

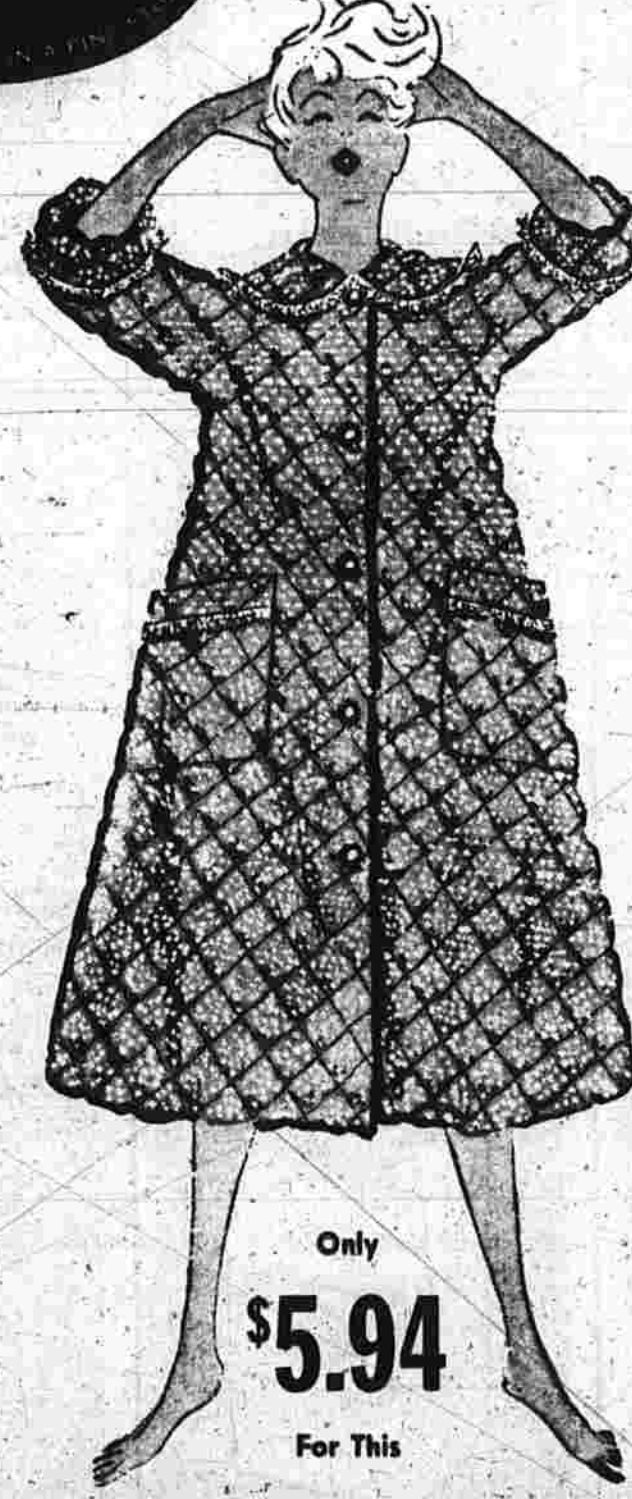

### New MMH Pharmacy Livable and Efficient

The tradition of caring for the sick and the old has been carried on in the new pharmacy at Manchester Memorial Hospital.

Pushed matter cabinets and sparkling glass apothecary jars filled with colored water make the room look like a pantry in a Better Homes and Gardens advertisement.

Located in the basement of the new north wing, the room has beige floors and walls which set off the rich warmth of the wood and the glossy black counter-tops.

Combined with the honey beauty is a maximum of utility. The rest of 1959 research are planning the labels and caps of plain brown bottles on the open shelves lend a spot of color, but inside the bottles are anti-couplings, tranquilizers, antibiotics, vitamins, dietary supplements and poison antidotes.

As soon as a prescription is filled, it is placed on a dumb waiter which leads directly to the central nursing stations on the three floors above.

To keep abreast of developments in drug research, the staff has a file in the pharmaceutical office. In the file are new releases and pamphlets on all of the drugs in the MMH pharmacy, as well as the ones which are in the experimental stage. Doctors frequently refer to the files to determine the correct drug of various brands of standard drugs.

**Committee Picks Drugs**

The hospital has a Pharmacy Formulary Committee of seven doctors who decide which types of drugs and which brands of these drugs will be stocked. The committee meets about once a month to discuss new drugs and review the inventory. The decisions of the committee have saved many dollars for patients who might otherwise have had to take costly brand name preparations which contain the same compounds as less costly and less well known brands.

Among the narcotics are old standbys morphine, codeine and demerol, and new ones like meperidine and Demerol. This store room is kept locked at all times, and there is someone in the main room at all times when the outer door to the pharmacy is unlocked. These precautions conform to the strictest standards of the federal government.

He thinks the U.S. and Soviet Russia are heading for a collision. York still is a bull of a man with a mountain draw and a yawn.

His even grew a goatee, but his wife, Grace, would not let him play her who smoked cigarettes or drank whiskey.
