Turkey Crop Up 3 Million, Prices Decrease Few Cents

A record turkey crop is in the markets for Thanksgiving Day. Prices average a little lower than last year. The turkeys, which are in good supply, but some are quite expensive.

The 1959 turkey crop is estimated at 82 million birds, most of them to be consumed at Thanksgiving and Christmas. This is up three millions from last year, but the increase is in the small, family-size bird.

One of the biggest food chains quotes turkeys weighing under 14 pounds at two cents lower than last year and bigger birds at the same price as a year ago.

With virtually all attention centered on turkeys, prices of favorite cuts of beef and lamb remained unchanged from last week. Loin pork chops went up four cents a pound in the New York area.

Court Backs Controls on Trailer Park

MANCHESTER, Nov. 24 (AP)—The Connecticut Supreme Court of Errors has again upheld a small town's rights to lay down strict rules for the regulation of trailer parks.

In a decision announced yesterday, the court refused to upset a Superior Court judgment declaring an East Haddam ordinance on trailer parks valid and constitutional.

The ordinance had been challenged by Frank Karen and other developers of a trailer park near East Haddam.

As in a recent case in which it upheld the right of the town of Hartland to impose stiff restrictions on trailer parks, the high court said the East Haddam ordinance was within the scope of a 1957 statute that permits towns that have no zoning commissions to enact ordinances for the regulation of trailer parks.

One of the provisions of the local ordinance most objected to by the developer was a limit of 10 trailers for any trailer use of a lot in the park.

Chief Justice Raymond A. Bodin, who wrote the court's opinion, said the legislature in passing the statute in 1957, "expressed an intent that towns without zoning authorities should have the power to deal with trailer parks in a manner not only in matters concerned strictly with public health and safety, but in matters concerned with economic and aesthetic considerations as well."

The court has previously recognized, he said, "that year-round occupancy of a trailer park by trailers as a non-conforming use under zoning regulations may have a serious detrimental effect upon surrounding property."

ENGLISH EXPERT
REMARKS OLD RULES

I have to make a trip across the ocean one of these days to Annan, one of England's best bridge players. We bridge writers have a tough enough time teaching people to make the accepted plays without any interference from Adam Meredith.

My best originates with a hand played a couple of months ago in England. The contract was three no-trumps at both tables, and the same opening lead was made in each case.

Let's see what happened at the first table. West led the king of clubs, and South won with the king. Declarer returned the jack of hearts, losing to East's queen.

At the other table Meredith led the East cards. When he won the second trick with the queen of hearts he failed to return the queen of diamonds. Instead, he returned his lowest diamond, the 4 of 2.

In this case, however, Meredith's unusual lead of the low diamond worked better. South covered with the nine of diamonds, and West won with the ace. West then led the king of hearts, and South had nothing better to do than to return a diamond.

ben and U.S. Steel, he declared competitors in violation of anti-trust statutes. The complaint said they conspired to restrict foreign imports and impede small fabricators, and used on non-competitive and collusive bids to control the market in the rough mill-rolling steel used in concrete known as "rebar."

Steel companies sometimes make these rebars themselves out of smooth bars, but also sell smooth bars to fabricators for processing into rebar, or even directly to contractors for processing on the job.

The suit charges that the fabricators induced the steel mills to refuse to sell rebar directly to processing firms.

Spokesmen for the defendants, where reachable for comment, said they would have none until they had studied the complaint thoroughly.

F. S. Cough, associate manager in San Francisco, said that it had returned no indictment and had been asked to make Lyle E. Jones, department of justice attorney here, said the suit grew out of a 15-month investigation.
