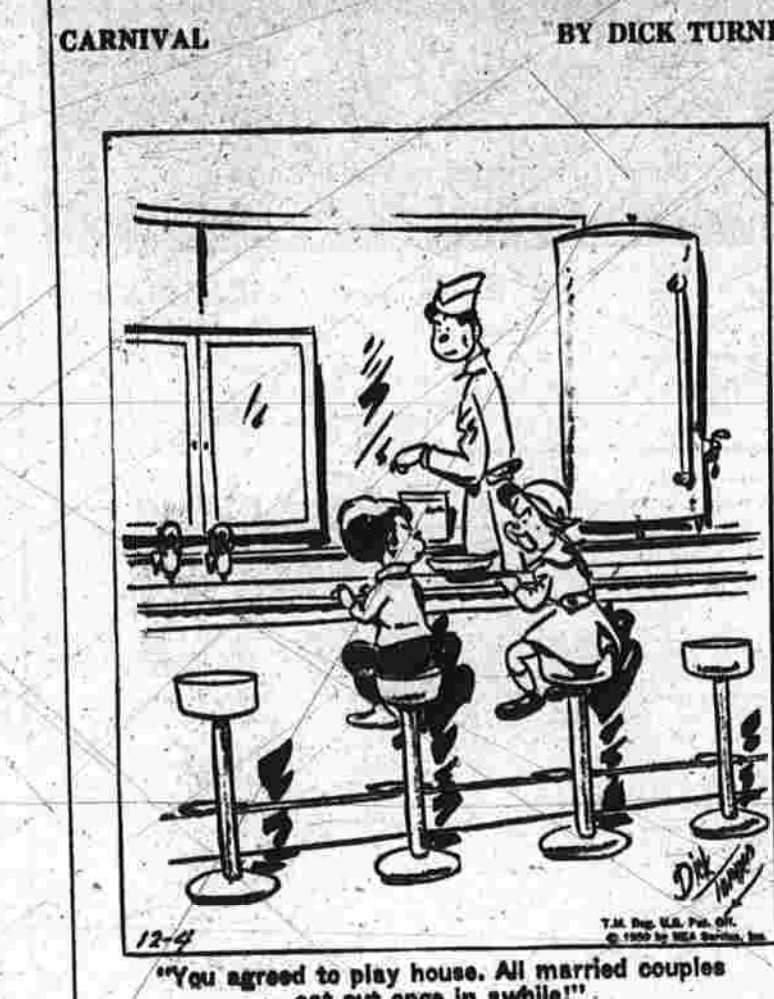

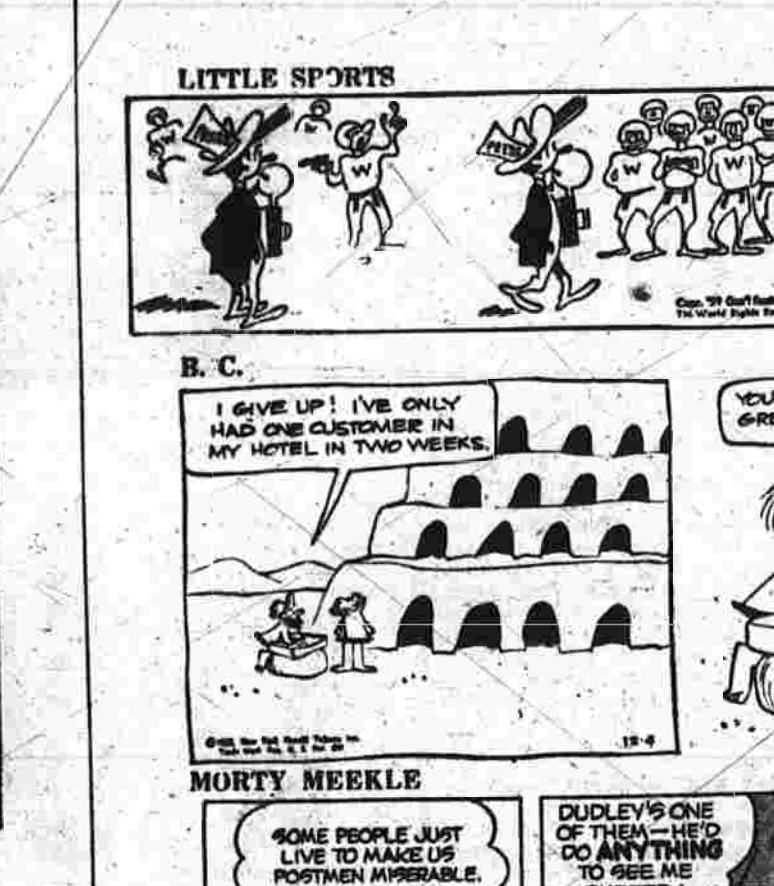

Experts to Fight Avalanche With New 'Bomb' Technique

Squaw Valley, Calif. If a snow avalanche mauls your mountain, bomb it. That's the latest technique, devised by two of the country's leading experts on the subject, Monte Atwater and Richard Stillman of the U.S. Forest Service.

The Olympic Winter Games Organizing Committee has retained these veterans for the past several years to study avalanche control work for the international spectacle scheduled Feb. 18-28, 1960, and Feb. 2, 1961, during the Winter Olympics at Squaw Valley, Calif.

Recall that he had been used about safety to curb the snow monsters which soon down mountains with Hercules power. Now they have a brother-in-arms, the "snow-bomb."

Discovered during the trials that the KT22 mountain lift at Squaw Valley passes over a steep path area which would be dangerous to blast with rifles, because of the flying shrapnel, said Atwater.

"So, we concocted our bomb which is a bomb containing several sticks of extremely high explosive called Tetolol, tied together. The charge is far more powerful than TNT."

No shrapnel danger. "When a danger spot is noted, we give the 'bomb' a short ride to the target area in a ski-lift. Approaching the point, he lights the bomb and sends it into the snow as it passes over. The resultant blast shakes down the pack and makes the area stable. There is no shrapnel danger to the lift or surrounding structures. Through years of experience, Atwater and Stillman have learned when and where avalanches are most likely to form. The types of snow which will produce them, and how winds and temperature contribute to their growth.

But, more important, they've discovered how to destroy avalanches before they can do damage. Heavy reliance on weather forecasting instruments is almost absolutely necessary in forecasting the birth of an avalanche. If the temperature is below 15 degrees Fahrenheit, and the snow is dry crystalline, non-sticky, and falling at the rate of more than an inch an hour, look out.

Non-setting, snow contains less water and holds air. It is therefore porous and unstable. If footprints make a thumping sound on the snow, it signifies tension and air space beneath, another ominous sign.

Hourly measurements of snow in the area have been used to determine water content. Temperature readings must be frequent.

But most important is the wind. It can build up the most dangerous and unstable type of snow avalanche—the wind-blown avalanche. A wind of more than 15 m.p.h.
