

"The Way I Heard It"

During the past couple of weeks we have talked about progress, and the performer's role in interpreting them. Now let's discuss the audience, which means you. Most of you don't get fifty cents to the dollar when you go to a concert, at least so far as the music is concerned.

There are some of course who derive value received, from being present, and being seen in the audience. With them I am not concerned. They have their rewards. There are some of course who really love music and musicians; they get full value with no assistance from me. There are some who attend not of their own volition who expect to be bored, intend to be bored, and are not disappointed.

Most people, however, go to be entertained, and frequently find only one or two numbers on the program that they consider entertaining. These are the people with whom I am concerned. They invariably condemn a program of unfamiliar music, no matter how well performed.

The trouble is, that deriving enjoyment from every number takes effort on the part of the listener. This is true any form of entertainment. If you want to see a baseball game without knowing the rules, without recognizing a "hit and run" or a "double-play" situation, you wouldn't enjoy the entertainment provided.

Even if you know something about the game and only see it, instead of watching it, you will be bored. The fan watches the disposition of infield and outfield, the lead, the runner takes, the score, the batting order, and many other things; he doesn't just see the men opposing another man at bat.

Similarly, at a concert, you must continually listen to the music, and not just hear it. Most concert-goers will not make this

effort to realize that the music is not well-performed and will be recorded. Happily, this is not the case. Although the orchestra is not the greatest in the world, Mr. Walker's abilities as conductor causes them to sound like one of the great.

I have been hearing music for half a century and listening to it for about forty years, and I can recall when Bruno Walter was not conducting. Since he is now in his fifty year, and has been conducting for 55 of them, this is not surprising.

Mr. Walker has had 55 years of experience, but one year of conducting. He has had 54 years of listening to the soprano and the tenor. This is like going to a baseball game and watching only the pitcher and the catcher. You cannot pick the best one; there is no best, all are superb.
