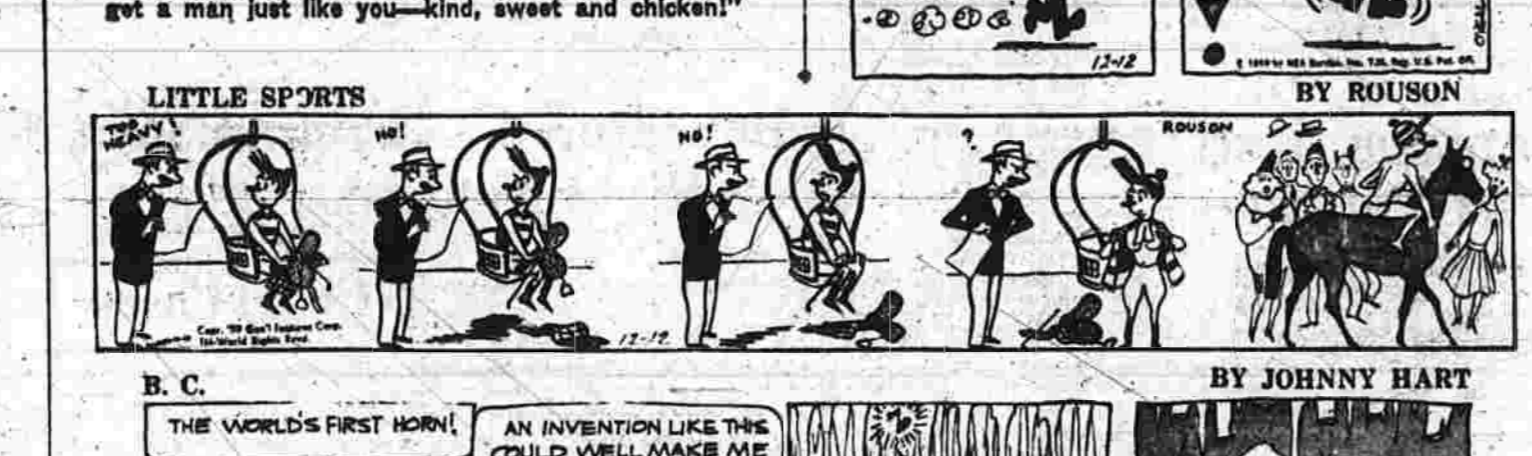

Pearson Will Direct 'Messiah' Tomorrow

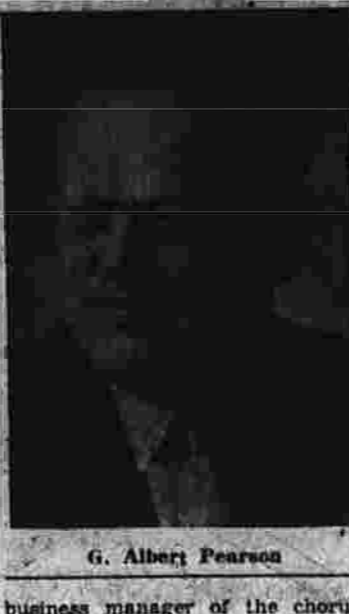

ABC, while not quite prepared to relinquish prime time for a think show, has made a deal with Yale University for a series of documentaries called "World of the Mind." These will be on one Saturday a month from 4 to 5 p.m. (EST).
