LOOK FOR HELP WHEN FINNESSES LOSE. By Alfred Sheinwold. U.S. Masters Team Champion. "If you believe yourself and eat up all your spinach, all your asparagus will work. I must have left some spinach on this somewhere or other, because my finances sometimes lose. This is no cause for worry; there are ways of getting along even when the cards are badly mixed."

West opened the three of clubs and South finished dummy's hand. This worked for East with the ace. The rest of the finesses were off-ade.

East returned a heart, and South played low as a finesse. West won with the queen of hearts and led a club to dummy's king. Declarer drew two rounds of trumps and then went after every finesse in sight.

His first step was to lead a diamond to the king and return it to the hand. Declarer drew the jack. West returns a heart or a diamond, he gives declarer a free diamond. Now South had to fall back on the heart finesse, and he was down one when this lost.

Game Was Unobtainable. It was a bad day for Sheinwold, but the game contract was actually unobtainable. There were too many finesses for one player to take. South should have allowed something else to take one for a win.

Declarer was on the right track when he ducked the first count of hearts and later drew two rounds of trumps. But then he should have left the hearts and diamond. The correct play is to lead the jack of clubs from the South. West must play the queen.

**UConn Professor
Plans Asia Tour**

A University of Connecticut agricultural economist is going to the Far East with a research team appointed by the federal government to study means to maintain and expand the demand for U.S. agricultural products.

John W. Mendenhall, assistant professor of agricultural economics in the College of Agriculture, will lead the team, which includes eight other economists of a 5-week tour of the Orient beginning Jan. 15.

Object of the 7-nation tour is a better understanding by farmers and professional agriculturists of workers of the problems of modern export marketing and the types of commodities wanted by foreign consumers.

Mendenhall and his colleagues will visit Pakistan, India, Thailand, Indonesia, Australia, the Philippines and Japan. They will attend seminars with farm trade groups in Karachi, Bombay, New Delhi, Calcutta, Bangkok, Jakarta, Manila and Tokyo.

Mendenhall teaches agricultural policy at the University. He is also investigating taxation and other economic problems created by the movement of urban residents into rural areas.

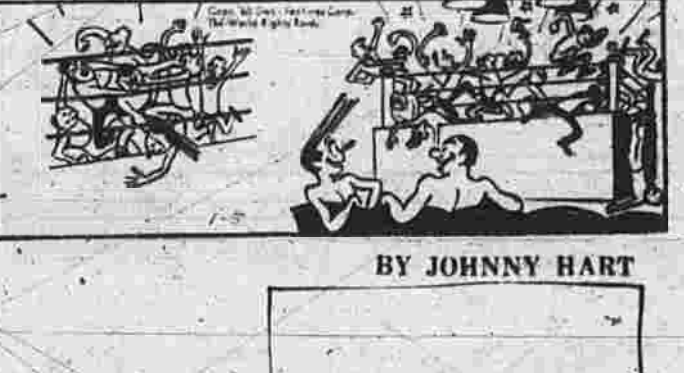

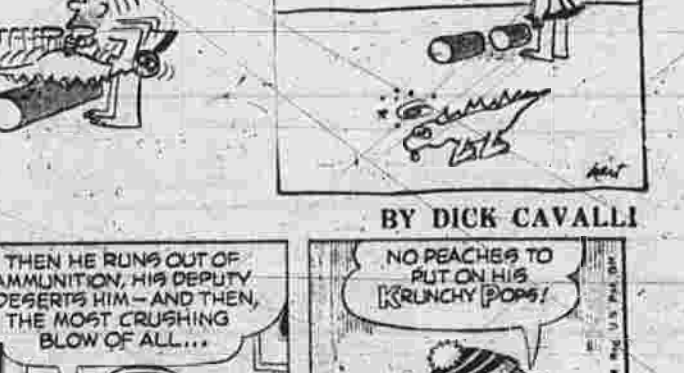
