GOOD FINESSE
NEEDS 2 FEES

"Please tell us how to handle a very delicate matter," requests a perplexed fan. "What should we do if one of the players in our regular game has peeked? Should we make a fuss or say nothing? The question arose out of this hand:

My partner, West, led the queen of hearts. Declarer won in dummy with the ace and thought a long time before making his next play. Then he led a trump from the dummy and finessed the jack from his hand.

"When my partner declared, and it became clear the declarer had finessed for the queen with 10 trumps, I was really shocked. Obviously he must have seen the queen in my hand, even though I always hold my cards quite close to the vest.

"Nobody said a word, but I think everybody else was just as embarrassed as I am in this situation. It would be so in a case of this kind?"

Mum's the Word
Silence is golden. It's always controversial that a player has seen a card in your hand, but it isn't necessarily so. In this case, however, it was a matter of life or death for the trump suit even if he is playing a hand blindfolded.

Suppose the finesse loses. The defender leads a heart and wins the club. South wins, draws the last trump, and knocks out the ace of hearts. South leads the king of diamonds. This assures the trick.

In short, if the spade finesse loses, the five of spades becomes an unbreakable high-card string. "Now see what happens if South fails to take the finesse. He bears a big risk in each case. True, it happens only when the trumpets are blown, but it is a risk which this might risk."

In acquiring the Stevens holdings, Manchester Properties escaped the town's fourth biggest tax hike.

The property involved is in the complex in the Hartford Rd.-Pine St. area.

"Please tell us how to handle a very delicate matter," requests a perplexed fan. "What should we do if one of the players in our regular game has peeked? Should we make a fuss or say nothing? The question arose out of this hand:

My partner, West, led the queen of hearts. Declarer won in dummy with the ace and thought a long time before making his next play. Then he led a trump from the dummy and finessed the jack from his hand.

"When my partner declared, and it became clear the declarer had finessed for the queen with 10 trumps, I was really shocked. Obviously he must have seen the queen in my hand, even though I always hold my cards quite close to the vest.

"Nobody said a word, but I think everybody else was just as embarrassed as I am in this situation. It would be so in a case of this kind?"

Mum's the Word
Silence is golden. It's always controversial that a player has seen a card in your hand, but it isn't necessarily so. In this case, however, it was a matter of life or death for the trump suit even if he is playing a hand blindfolded.

Suppose the finesse loses. The defender leads a heart and wins the club. South wins, draws the last trump, and knocks out the ace of hearts. South leads the king of diamonds. This assures the trick.

In short, if the spade finesse loses, the five of spades becomes an unbreakable high-card string. "Now see what happens if South fails to take the finesse. He bears a big risk in each case. True, it happens only when the trumpets are blown, but it is a risk which this might risk."

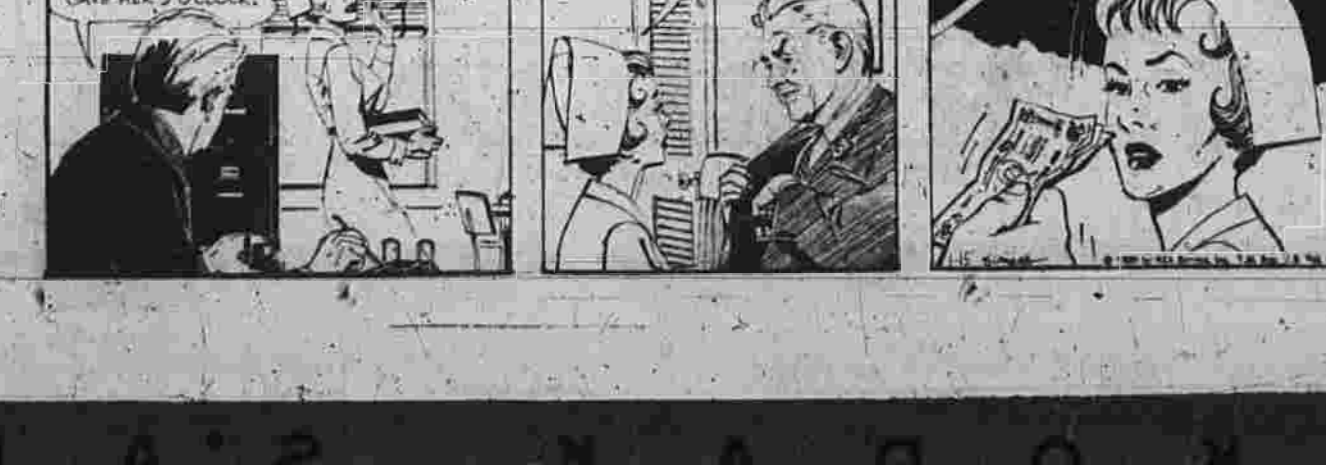

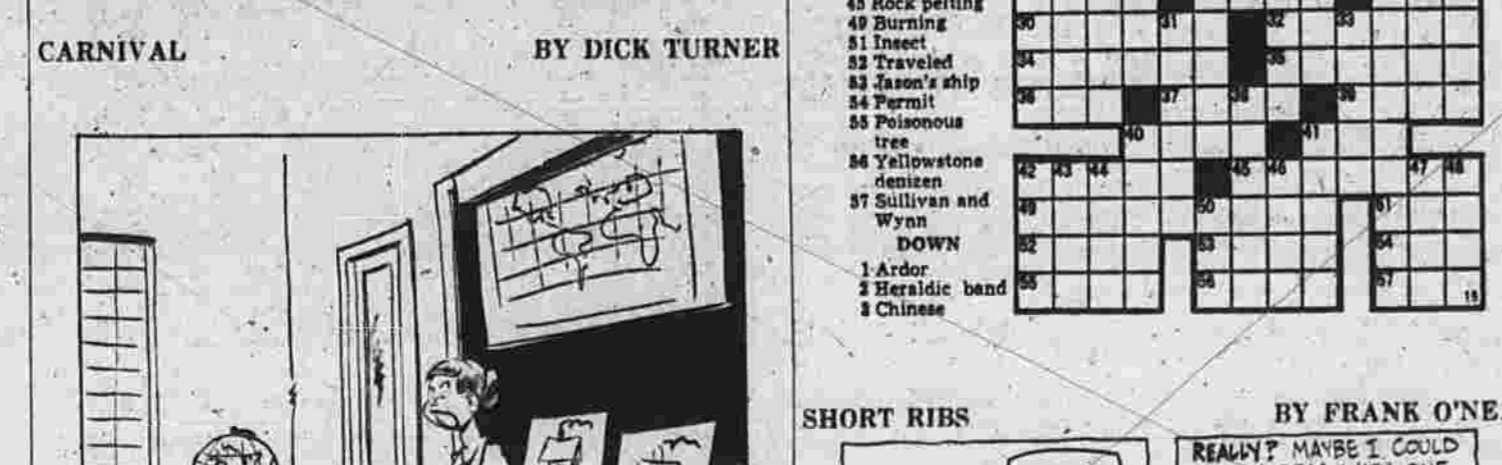
