DEEP FITNESS ASSURES SEAM

The "domination" of your club partner is to guard against a bad break in his points. You must not play the hand properly too.

The beginning is easy. Take the first trick with the ace of hearts. Lead a trump to the ace and then a high trump to dummy's queen. Save the four of trumps to lead to dummy's ace, if necessary, later on.

You lead a low club from dummy and East plays the seven. You lead the ace of clubs, which you can bid if you start with one club and you will be able to bid one more club.

This is the time to make a safety play. You are writing to give up your ace of hearts for one club. You would not want to be in a position where you have to lead a low club from dummy.

The ace of diamonds is well with an opening bid. If you start with one club and you will be able to bid one more club.

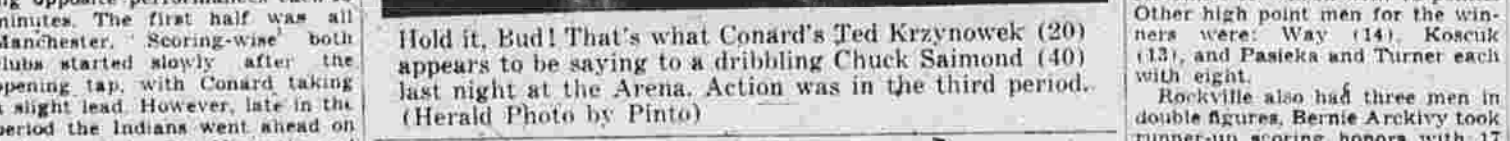

Three Who Sued State For 1948 Crash Lose

Judge Howard W. Alcorn Wednesday directed a Hartford County Superior Court jury to return a verdict against three Manchester men who had brought suit totaling \$95,000 against the State.

The three men said they were seriously injured in a 2-car crash on Finley St. in Manchester June 11, 1948.

Two of the plaintiffs, August Carabino and Herbert Tomlinson, were riding in a National Guard jeep; the third plaintiff, John Wagner, was riding in a car which was involved in collision with the jeep.

The jeep driver, National Guardsman Calvin Edwards, died one day later from injuries sustained in the crash.

Judge Alcorn directed the jury's verdict because, he said, there was no proof that the State owned the jeep. It appeared, he said, the jeep was owned by the United States Army and was consigned for use with the Connecticut National Guard.

Judge Alcorn also ruled that evidence showed the State was probably not the jeep driver's employer nor did the State insure the jeep.

The three men were hospitalized after the crash which occurred shortly before midnight. Testimony indicated Carabino and Tomlinson were out for a ride with Edwards who was at the time of the accident, returning to the Manchester Armory.

The jeep was traveling south on Finley St. behind a car driven by Robert Jones, also of Manchester. Wagner was Jones' passenger.

As the jeep driver sought to pass the Jones car on a curve, the jeep went out of control, up an embankment on the left of the road and down in front of the car. Both vehicles burned over several times, according to reports of the accident.

Tomlinson, who lost his right leg as a result of the crash, sued for \$75,000. Carabino and Wagner each filed a suit for \$10,000.

The law firm of Lesser, Rottner, Karp and Grobert represented the plaintiffs, and Schofield, Fay and Courtney, a Hartford firm, represented the State.

Major Jackson Goes to Buffalo

Major Eric Jackson has been transferred by the Salvation Army to Buffalo, N. Y.

He has been young people's secretary for the Southern New England division of the Salvation Army since 1954, with headquarters in Hartford. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Jackson, live at 28 Cooper St.

Major Jackson will take up his duties in Buffalo Thursday. He will be divisional young people's secretary for the Western New York division.

Last Monday, at a meeting of divisional officers held at the Manchester Citadel, Major Jackson said his goodbyes. His farewell service will be conducted tomorrow at the 11 a.m. holiness service at the Hartford Corps.

Only last month Major Jackson was appointed to a chaplaincy of the Connecticut State Police by Commissioner Leo Mulcahy. At 43, he was the youngest chaplain in State Police history.
