Here 'n There

When you think about it, January is a pretty lousy month. It usually starts off with a hangover and ends with a cold.

A Thought for Today Sponsored by the Manchester Council of Churches

It is the business of every Christian to be Christlike. The early disciples found this difficult to do in their own strength, but when the Holy Spirit came upon them on the day of Pentecost it became easy to do.

Before that baptism of spiritual power the disciples were interested in who would occupy the chief place in Christ's kingdom on earth. It was quick to cut off the ear of an enemy, while another was ready to call fire down from heaven to destroy unbelievers. One who had made the declaration of loyalty to Christ denied him three times; while another sold him out for a paltry sum of money.

It wasn't until the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the 120 persons in the upper room that they found it possible to be more like Christ. No longer did they seek to own His name, but they proclaimed Him to the world.

One good reason why the glory of Rome didn't last can plainly be seen in this historical fact. Before the Christian era, a gateway honoring Janus was built in the forum. While in good citizenship were out fighting the gate was always kept open as they looted and beat a hasty retreat. During peace time the gate was kept closed. This custom was carried over and Romans always left their doors open while they were away and locked them when they were at home. It would be an understatement to say that today this would be impractical.

The Romans can't take all the blame for January. The Celts also had a hand in perpetuating this month, too. They had a different name for Janus. They called him Carnuannus, which meant god of the underworld. Carnuannus and a German chap called Heimdall were considered to be the fellows who started everything. I could have used them the other way when I didn't get my car going.

Other months of diligent search, I found having January is nothing new. In 1827, an English team of archeologists led by Dr. Percival Schwegels-Smythe, the noted social mixer, made a startling discovery while pottering around a cave in Lower Saxony, amid some old skeletons and broken pottery, probably left around after a wild party. Dr. Schwegels-Smythe uncovered a stone tablet, thought to date back to 431 A.D.

Translating the old German words, the famed archeologist found it was inscribed by one Hermann Ludwig Schmitz, whom Dr. Schwegels-Smythe thinks was the poet laureate of his time. Loosely translated, the poem, "Der Gerstebau Janovers," goes something like this: "January is a lousy time. In which to live or try to rhyme. 'Tid much rather talk of June A month that rhymes with tune or moon."

It's had enough to have December and February and November. Three bad months, oh very, very.

So who says we need January? Among the skeletal remains in the cave, Dr. Schwegels-Smythe

Two Fishermen Perish in Rescue

Westport, Wash., Jan. 29 (AP)—Tradition was tempered with tragedy for a fishing boat and two fishermen crewmen on the storm-tossed Pacific Ocean off the Southwest coast last night.

The fishermen stayed in dangerous, turbulent waters to aid four Coast guardsmen in a disabled patrol boat. The fishing boat sank. Two of its crewmen vanished into the churning sea.

The drama began when the fishing vessel Barbara Lee—called for help to get through huge swells at the narrow entrance to Grays Harbor. All day winds up to 60 miles an hour had raked the coast.

The Coast Guard sent the 62-foot patrol boat Invincible to guide the fishing boat across the bar. It was a familiar procedure; the Grays Harbor bar is treacherous for small craft at all times.

Suddenly, a monstrous wave struck the Invincible bottom-up. The boat was slightly tilted, but its engines were dead. One of the fishermen aboard took a bad cut.

The 30-foot Barbara Lee stood by the rain and wind. It threw a line aboard the Invincible. The line broke. It tried to attach another.

Then a monstrous wave of water engulfed the smokesack and antenna were swept away; then it sank. The Invincible got underway for Cortova, Alaska, aboard the cutter Myrtle. Robert Bodan of Westport and crewman Ted Sigarski of Grayland, Wash., were nowhere to be seen.

Two other Coast Guard boats prowled the stormy waters in the hope that the men might be found. Helicopters from the Grays Harbor Coast Guard sent an airplane, but foul weather forced it back. The search office ordered the boats patrolled in case the men were washed ashore.
