John Cassavetes

On the Sidewalks of New York

Filming on location, wherever it may be, invariably presents problems which are never encountered in the comfortable surroundings of a studio. Since most of the scenes of "Staccato," NBC-TV, are filmed on the streets, subways, restaurants and jazz clubs of New York, these production problems are multiplied.

Always a perfectionist, John Cassavetes, who stars in "Staccato" and is part owner of the show, takes a close hand in the direction. His penchant for perfection and realism is one reason for the episodes having a true New York flavor. Most shows rope off passers-by and assure that they do not get into camera range. Not so in

"Staccato." They keep John Q. Public right in the scenes.

"Anyone happening to pass by while we're shooting will undoubtedly be surprised to see himself on the TV screen one of the following Thursday nights! Personally, I prefer location work because I think the realism gives the program a good dramatic impact."

These efforts toward realism, though they result in authentic scenery and increase the dramatic impact, also present some very difficult production problems.

When filming in an area which has private stores, the crew is careful not to film company names. In this particular instance, the only store which didn't boast a huge name sign was a small delicatessen. Cameras and sound equipment were moved in front of it, and as the crew prepared to

shoot the scene, someone noticed a new addition to the store window. A large salami had been wrapped in paper and on it was printed the owner's name.

"You can't blame people for being curious," says John, "Especially when they see a bunch of cameras and sound trucks." However, one solid citizen ruined a scene simply because he did not see the equipment.

On location in the Times Square area, an actor, dressed as a policeman, chased a "hoodlum" past the camera. As he did, the doggoeder on the edge of the crowd raced around and "caught" the surprised actor, yelling, "I've got him!" The red-faced observer didn't stay for the retake of the scene.

Running a close second to "peo-

ple problems" are stray animals. They seldom meddle, preferring to watch proceedings from a distance, but one kitten was too curious to be an observer. A scene called for Cassavetes to emerge from a tenement doorway, pause and light a cigarette—a simple enough procedure.

"We didn't disturb a stray kitten on the stoop," says John, "Because it added to the atmosphere. It was supposed to be a tense scene, but each time the cameras rolled, the confounded cat got up and purred against my legs, and it broke me up completely."

After three tries at replacing her on the stoop, they finally sent out for fish to lure her out of the doorway. The scene was shot minus the "atmospheric" cat.

What's the worst problem they face?

"The one we can't do anything about," admits Cassavetes, "The weather."

Born in New York, John is the son of a prosperous importer and immigration expert. In addition, his father is one of the leaders of New York's Greek-American colony. He and his brother went aboard with the family for two years when he was eight years old. On his return, he spoke Greek, Italian and French fluently.

"But," says John, "My brother and I wanted to be completely American. We're of Greek extraction so we didn't speak foreign languages again for years. But I find I can still carry on a conversation in Greek, Italian or French if I have to."

John attended Mohawk College and Colgate University before enrolling at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts, where he met Gene Rowland who was soon to become his wife. Deciding that acting was his field, he set up a rugged study schedule including dramatics, direction, scenic design and production. Since summer stock is the best way to "break in," John worked for a while with Providence, R. I., stock company doing everything from painting scenery to delivering a well-rehearsed line like, "I hear the car outside."

On returning to New York after the season, he lived with eight other young actors who pooled their meager resources. His determination to refuse a "No, can't use you" paid off when he persistently returned several times to an audition. The result was his first acting role for Gregory Ratoff

in the film, "Taxi." Ratoff later hired him as assistant stage manager for the Broadway play, "The Fifth Season."

Soon after this, he was selected to play a bull-fighter on "Omibus," and his powerful portrayal brought him an instant offer from Hollywood, but John decided the role wasn't geared for him. He gradually began getting regular roles on TV which eventually totaled more than 100 appearances.

When the TV drama "The Night Holds Terror" was made into a motion picture, John repeated his original role, as he did later with "Crime in the Streets."

From the minute he stepped into the shoes of Johnny Staccato, Cassavetes became a busy commuter between the East and West Coast. He and wife Gene recently became proud-parents of Nicholas
