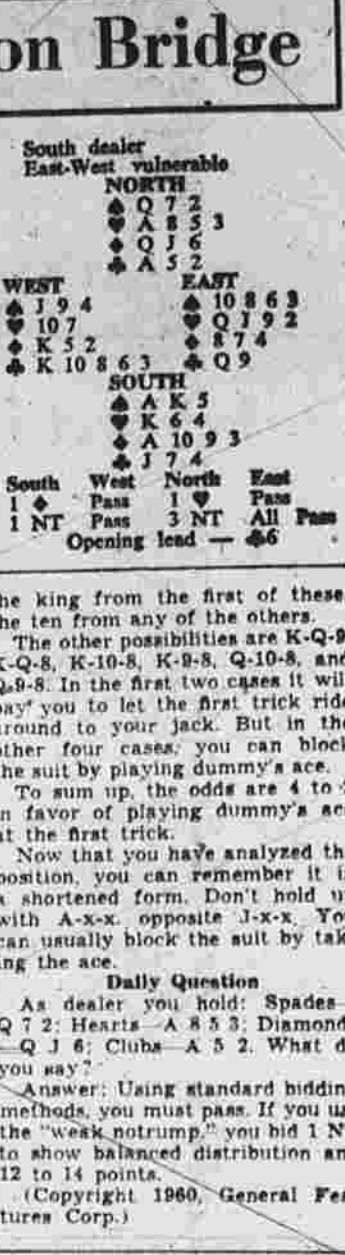
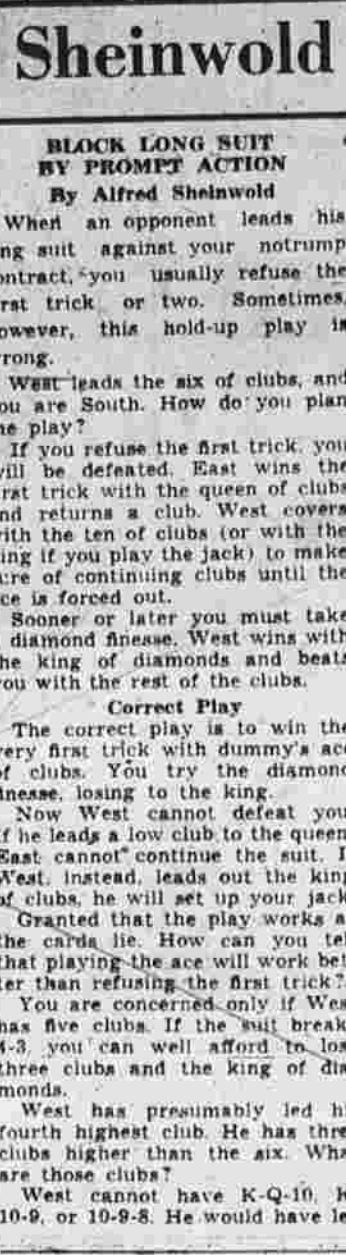

State Hopeful Voters Will Approve Sewer

The State Public Works Department is "hoping very optimistically" that Manchester voters will approve the West Side sewer project in a referendum in May.

The controversial project would serve the States' proposed Cheney Technical School and the proposed East Catholic High School at Hilliard St. and W. Middle Tpk.

Deputy Works Commissioner Charles Sweeney today said the department was "hoping very optimistically" that it will be approved.

The department today was to go to the State Bond Commission for approval of a bond issue to build the sewer.

The last State Legislature approved an issue of \$1,500,000 and \$2,000,000 was previously approved, but authorization has taken a back seat to other State projects pending in the legislature.

With authorization today, Sweeney said, the department had completed the school in late 1961.

To Await Vote Sweeney said construction will probably be delayed a few weeks after the school is opened.

He recalled that the department planned the sewer in the understanding that sewer service would be provided by the town.

Some 40 to 60 per cent of the voters surveyed want to stay on the job, but some are not sure.

Many West Siders look out against assessments levied by Town Directors in November.

They claim the assessments would surpass any benefits from the project.

Site preparation has already begun on the East Catholic High School, whose plans also were made on the assumption that sewer service would be provided.

It is approved in May, the sewer project is expected to be financed by long-term notes to be redeemed in part by the West Siders' assessments.

Assessment Split As a whole, some 325 West Siders would pay 70 per cent of the sewer project, sewer users as a whole would pay 20 per cent.

Mayor Eugene T. Kelly hopes the cases can be decided before May to eliminate all these "ifs" before the money actually begins to come from the State.

Referendum can be held even if the cases are still pending, officials say.

Sweeney today chose not to discuss where the State might if voters reject the project.

However, it seems that sewerage will have to be provided. The State has already made a \$10,000,000 investment in land acquisition and other costs to put the school in Manchester, Sweeney said.

He said the State could get by cheaper with town service than by serving itself. In assessments for the force main and pump station, the town would pay \$5,637.58.

Mound Hints Norway Once Had Sun Cult

Stavanger, Norway—Was there once a cult of sun worshippers in Norway? Some archaeologists think there may have been. They are showing more interest in a huge burial mound whose size and location apparently are directly related to the winter and summer solstices. If sun and shade measurements were taken by archaeologist J. Arneberg, the mound at Groppen will present the first evidence of a sun cult in Scandinavia. At winter solstice, Dec. 22, Groppen is in deep shadow, but for 10 minutes the sun shines through a gorge and the light falls only on the burial mound. Curator Per Feit says the width of the light shaft may have determined the width of the mound. At summer solstice the light lingers longer on the mound than on any other point in the district.
