School Costs Set at \$353 Per Student

The total per-pupil cost for education in Coventry during the school year 1959-60 was \$353.40 according to the Public Expenditure Commission.

This per-pupil figure was based on 1,440.934 for education of 1,455 pupils, plus \$30,186 for transportation and \$308 for other expenses, or a total of \$353.68.

Principal payments on school bonds are not included in this total. On this grand total, state grants amounted to \$103,321 for education and administration, \$23,128 for transportation, and \$2,741 for aid to handicapped children.

Breaking these figures down on a per-pupil basis, state aid to Coventry amounted to \$12.15, while the cost per-pupil on the town was \$315.53.

Coventry is listed as 10th of the state's 169 towns in total cost per pupil. Canton is figured to be the town at the mid-point per pupil, with an expense of \$374.25.

The Campaign Of 1960

The following is a description by Charles O'Neill, a Connecticut author who frequently researches the American political scene, of the total political campaign of a certain candidate for the presidency in 1960.

On Feb. 27, 1960, Abraham Lincoln of Kentucky, Indiana and Illinois—not previously known as a candidate for president—was elected to the day's agonizing effort to win slavery and ended with the challenge. Let us have faith that right might and, and in that faith let us to the end, dare to do our duty as we understand it.

In the following eleven days the forty-year old attorney issued substantially the same call in eleven New England states and President Kennedy, from Feb. 28 to March 1, Dover and Exeter, N.
