## Martin Makes Plea For Sewer Projects

A strong plea for a public vote on \$355,000 worth of storm sewers and a library addition, sewers came last night from General Manager Richard Martin.

Martin told Town Directors that the town has 'gotten into more and more trouble' by neglecting its storm sewer program in past years, as well as its highway program, while money was going toward new schools.

But school expansion seems under control now, Martin said, in

the renovations program for older elementary schools and Barnard Junior High for some \$550,000, and the West Side sanitary sewer projthe West Side sanitary sewer project for some \$150,000, according to estimates. Financing for the latter, officials hope, would be redeemed for the most part by assessments being appealed in court by West Side property owners. Some charter revision questions would also be on the machines.

In presenting his \$451,685 storm sewer program, Martin said some of the projects could be handled on a nay-as-you-go basis but urged prepared and put to bid before the would require outside engineering services, he said. Explains Indebtedness
At Cummings request, Martin explained the town's current level of indebtedness. "We're nowhere near our borrowing capacity," he said, adding that only "calamity criers" say so.

The town could borrow up to \$3,339,000 more for school needs; up to \$4,311,000 more for asnitary sewer needs; and up to \$8,252,000 more for other needs, he said.

As for schools—"Except (in the event of) some unusual growth, we're in good shape for some time to come." Rooms could be added to the Keeney St. School at low cost, Martin said. Martin said.

A bond maturity schedule he distributed showed the town will pay \$604,000 out of the general fumerat year for school bonds, including these of the North End junio high school. The yearly debt will dwindle to \$75,000 in the year 1975 75 and end in 1978-80, the schedules.


